[Urging AB 1001]

URGING PASSAGE OF AB 1001, AN AMENDMENT TO THE FAIR EMPLOYMENT AND HOUSING ACT TO INCLUDE SEXUAL ORIENTATION.

WHEREAS, People in California may face discrimination in the areas of housing, employment, and public accommodation on the basis of their sexual orientation; and,

WHEREAS, The California Fair Employment Housing Act makes it unlawful to engage in specific discriminatory employment practices on the basis of race, religion, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, sex, or age; and,

WHEREAS, The California Fair Employment Housing Act makes it unlawful to engage in specific discriminatory practices in housing accommodations on the basis of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status, familial status, sex, or disability; and,

WHEREAS, Current California law embodied in the Labor Code does not adequately address issues of employment discrimination against persons on the basis of their sexual orientation; and,

WHEREAS, Current California law does not address the issue of housing discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation; and,

WHEREAS, Assemblymembers Villaraigosa, Kuehl, and Keeley, and San Francisco Assemblymembers Migden and Shelley have introduced Assembly Bill 1001 to amend the California Fair Employment and Housing Act to include sexual orientation as a category for which persons may not be discriminated against; and,

WHEREAS, Similar legislation has been presented to former Governor Wilson on many occasions and he chose to veto that legislation; and,

WHEREAS, Governor Davis has indicated he believes in fairness for all Californians in the areas of employment and housing; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco's non-discrimination laws cover sexual orientation; and,

WHEREAS, The citizens of the City and County of San Francisco have benefited greatly from their progressive stance against discrimination in the areas of housing and employment; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors supports the principle of nondiscrimination as expressed in AB 1001; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the California legislature and Governor Davis to make AB 1001 the law in California.
