WHEREAS, San Francisco is committed to the concept of customer service within government; and,

WHEREAS, The concept of customer service is especially applicable in instances where government relies on its citizens for public service, such as jury duty; and,

WHEREAS, Although as many as twenty-four California counties have established a "one day or one trial" system of jury duty, San Francisco requires persons called for jury duty to remain "on call" for up to two weeks before knowing whether they will be picked for a trial; and,

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 68550 requires that the Judicial Council adopt a rule of court requiring every trial court to adopt, by January 2000, a requirement limiting jury service to either one trial, or one day on call, per individual; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco could choose to avoid implementing this rule by arguing that it is impractical to apply; and,

San Francisco recognises the WHEREAS,/Increased convenience to the great number of citizens who are routinely to be inconvenienced by jury duty outweighs the convenience to the courts of having these citizens on call for up to two weeks; and,

WHEREAS, The Judicial Council has begun drafting Rule 861 of the California Rules of Court, which would require statewide implementation of the "one day or one trial" program; and,

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WHEREAS, Jurors routinely encounter continuous busy signals and being placed on hold for lengthy periods of time when phoning the court for information related to their jury service; and,

WHEREAS, The phone system could be handily supplemented by providing internet access to those jurors; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The City and County of San Francisco does hereby urge/the judges of the San Francisco Superior Court to adopt the "one day or one trial" jury system as quickly as possible; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco does hereby urge the Judicial Council to adopt a rule of court to implement the state legislation requiring "one day or one and to consider developing pre-hardship provisions for jurors trial" with all due haste/ and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco does hereby urge the San Francisco Superior Court to place on the internet information necessary for persons called for jury service; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco does hereby urge the state legislature to budget as needed to facilitate setting up this system; and be it
