Resolution urging passage of AB 196.

WHEREAS, The City of San Francisco has a long history of leadership in the advancement of civil rights, with a strong record in fighting discrimination in the areas of housing and employment; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Human Rights Commission ("Commission") conducted a public hearing in May 1994 investigating discrimination against the transgender community; and

WHEREAS, A Commission finding from the public hearing is that many people, including transgender people and those who do not fit gender stereotypes are subject to severe discrimination in employment and housing; and

WHEREAS, A Commission finding from the public hearing is that the economic hardship imposed on some transgender people due to discrimination in employment and housing force many to live in poverty and/or be homeless; and

WHEREAS, San Francisco voters added gender identity as a protected class in 1993 to the City's Civil Service Code and the City and County of San Francisco added gender identity as a protected class in employment, public accommodations, and housing in December 1994 in its Administrative Code (Chapter 12) and Municipal Code (Article 33); and

WHEREAS, Further information compiled by the Transgender Civil Rights Implementation

Task Force for the City and County of San Francisco demonstrates that many complaints of

employment and housing discrimination come from cities and counties all over California that

do not protect gender identity in their anti-discrimination laws; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Department of Public Health in 1999 conducted a study which concluded that the unemployment rate for transgender San Franciscans was 70% while 47% of the same individuals had unstable housing; and

WHEREAS, The Transgender Law Center and National Center for Lesbian Rights reported in a recent survey that employment and housing discrimination is a widespread, serious problem for the transgender community; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors recognize the impact employment discrimination has on city services when individuals suffer employment discrimination and the burden placed on city government when tenants are evicted based upon discrimination; and

WHEREAS, The City of San Francisco supports the principle that no one deserves to lose their job or home because of gender characteristics which have nothing to do with an individual's qualifications as an employee or tenant; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the California State Legislature and Governor Davis to enact into law AB 196 (Leno) which will make progress towards ending discrimination in employment and housing for

transgender people by amending the Fair Employment and Housing Act to include "gender" as a protected category, and be it
