URGING CALTRANS TO WORK COOPERATIVELY WITH THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO IN DEVELOPING THE OCTAVIA BOULEVARD APPROVED BY VOTERS IN NOVEMBER 1998.

WHEREAS, The section of the Central Freeway between the Fell/Oak ramps and the Franklin/Gough ramps was severely damaged by the Loma Prieta earthquake in 1989; and,

WHEREAS, Following the earthquake, the freeway was found to be seismically unsafe and in 1992 the Gough and Franklin ramps were torn down and in 1996 the top level of the freeway, from Mission to Oak, was demolished; and,

WHEREAS, In October 1995 the Central Freeway Citizens Advisory Task Force appointed by the Board of Supervisors, after studying alternatives for the Central Freeway, issued a Report of Recommendations and recommended a South of Market terminus for the Central Freeway (Alternative 8) which was endorsed by a Board of Supervisor's in Resolution #869-95; and,

WHEREAS, In November 1996 the Central Freeway Citizens Advisory Task

Force, in cooperation with Caltrans and City agencies, refined the endorsed alternative
to include the Boulevard concept (Alternative 8b), which was found by Caltrans to meet
the comparable capacity test required for freeway replacement and thus was identified
as eligible for State funding; and,

WHEREAS, In the April 1997 San Francisco Central Freeway Replacement Project Environmental Assessment Report, Caltrans found that there was no significant negative environmental impact identified for Alternative 8b; and,

WHEREAS, In the election of November 3, 1998, San Francisco voters had their first opportunity to vote to approve or disapprove of the Boulevard option in the form of Proposition E; and,

WHEREAS, Proposition E authorized Caltrans to replace the damaged portion of the Central Freeway with an elevated structure to Market Street and a ground-level boulevard from Market Street along Octavia Street; and,

WHEREAS, In the election of November 3, 1998, San Francisco voters soundly approved Proposition E by more than 12,500 votes; and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has experienced successful cooperative efforts with Caltrans in the development of the Embarcadero Roadway, which replaced the damaged Embarcadero Freeway, and with the Doyle Drive project; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges Caltrans and the City and County of San Francisco to work cooperatively and expeditiously in the development of the Octavia Boulevard; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges representatives of Caltrans and of the City and County of San Francisco to meet to discuss appropriate roles and responsibilities in the following key areas: the design and engineering of the Boulevard; completion of necessary environmental review; refining of budgetary and timeline issues; effecting necessary land transfers; development of an interim traffic plan; and construction of the Octavia Boulevard.
