CREATING A POTRERO POWER PLANT CITIZENS ADVISORY TASK FORCE TO

PROVIDE INPUT TO THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO REGARDING THE SALE, OPERATION, AND MAINTENANCE OF THE POTRERO POWER PLANT AND TO COMPLETE ITS WORK BY DECEMBER 31, 2000.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco reached an agreement with PG&E that the Hunters Point Power Plant will be closed, and the Potrero Power Plant will be closed, and the Potrero Power Plant will be sold; and

WHEREAS, The sale of the Potrero Power Plant may result in construction projects on the Potrero site, may entail operating the facility at higher output levels, thus creating more harmful emissions and generating additional adverse impacts on the neighborhood such as higher noise levels; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco residents have expressed concern that the closure of the Bayview Power Plant and sale of the Potrero Power Plant is likely to result in the Potrero Power Plant operating at a higher capacity, and thereby emitting higher levels of pollution and noise than earlier; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco establishes a Potrero Power Plant Citizens Advisory Task Force consisting of thirteen (13) members who will represent the following officials and groups: the Mayor of San Francisco or his designee, a member of the Board of Supervisors, the head of the Department of Health or his designee, the head of the San Francisco

Labor Council or his designee, a representative of the Southeast
Alliance for Environmental Justice, a representative of the
Southeast Alliance for Environmental Justice, a representative of
the Public Utilities Commission, and 7 residents of the Potrero Hill
and Lower Potrero Hill neighborhood; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Potrero Power Plant Citizens

Advisory Task Force shall provide the City with input on 1) issues

which adversely affect the surrounding neighborhood such as noise,

construction, and harmful emissions, 2) power plant workers' safety

issues, and 3) any other issues deemed appropriate by the Task

Force; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests the City Administrator's Office to provide staff support for the Task Force; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the appointment of members to the Task Force on Potrero Hill Power Plant shall automatically expire on December 31, 2000.
