ESTABLISHING A CENTRAL FREEWAY PROJECT OFFICE TO OVERSEE THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE OCTAVIA BOULEVARD ALTERNATIVE FOR REPLACING

THE CENTRAL FREEWAY, SETTING FORTH THE ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF

VARIOUS CITY DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES FOR PROJECT COORDINATION.

ADMINISTRATION OF PROJECT FUNDS, AND IMPLEMENTATION OF THE CENTRAL

FREEWAY REPLACEMENT ACT OF 1998, AND ESTABLISHING TIMELINES FOR

PROJECT MILESTONES.

WHEREAS, On November 3, 1998, San Francisco voters demonstrated their support for the Octavia Boulevard alternative for replacement of the Central Freeway (hereinafter "Project") by passing Proposition E; and

WHEREAS, Proposition E called for the City and County of San Francisco to authorize CalTrans to replace the Central Freeway with an elevated structure to Market Street and a ground-level boulevard from Market Street along Octavia Street; and

WHEREAS, In the wake of the Loma Prieta earthquake in 1989, the City established a Waterfront Transportation Projects Office to coordinate the conceptual design, engineering, environmental review and construction of a surface replacement for the Embarcadero Freeway; and

WHEREAS, The Waterfront Transportation Projects Office coordinated the work of a number of City agencies on the Embarcadero Roadway project, including the Department of Public Works, the Department of Parking and Traffic, the Municipal Railway, the Planning Department and the Redevelopment Agency, among others; and

WHEREAS. It has become apparent that successful implementation of the Central Freeway replacement project will require an approach to project management that is similar to the one used for the Embarcadero Roadway; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco County Transportation Authority has entered into a Master Agreement with CalTrans enabling the Authority to receive and administer state and federal funds for the various transportation projects in San Francisco, and in that capacity it is currently acting as the lead agency for development of the environmental documents and preliminary engineering design for the Doyle Drive Replacement Project, as well as for development of the Countywide Transportation Plan; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors recently passed amendments to the City's Administrative Code to ensure greater participation by minority and women-owned businesses in City contracts for goods, services, and construction contracts; and

WHEREAS, Local control over contracting for construction of the Central Freeway
Project would afford greater participation by minority and women-owned businesses than if
contracts were bid by CalTrans under State of California bid procedures; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors finds that it is essential, in order to ensure appropriate input by the citizenry and participation by City Departments, that responsibility and authority for implementation of the Central Freeway Project be vested in local departments and agencies with the ability to expeditiously deliver the project; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Public Works to establish a Central Freeway Project Office in conjunction with the San Francisco County Transportation Authority, the Department of Parking and Traffic, the Planning Department, the Mayor's Office of Housing, the Redevelopment Agency and other appropriate City departments; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Central Freeway Project Office will implement the Octavia Boulevard Alternative for the Central Freeway Project as described herein; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works and the San Francisco Transportation Authority will negotiate an agreement with CalTrans to transfer all necessary funds and delegate to the Central Freeway Project Office all necessary powers to facilitate the expeditious implementation of the Central Freeway Project; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco
Transportation Authority to act as fiscal agent for the Project, including programming of all
federal and state funds required for Project delivery; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco
Transportation Authority to establish and act as liaison to a Central Freeway Project Citizens
Advisory Committee (hereinafter "CAC") to ensure full input from affected City neighborhoods
on issues related to traffic flow, congestion management, pedestrian safety, Municipal Railway
operations, urban design and neighborhood preservation; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works will provide monthly reports to the CAC and the San Francisco Transportation Authority regarding Project implementation; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works, acting as lead agency for the Project and in consultation with the San Francisco Transportation Authority and other appropriate City departments, will develop a proposed Project budget, work plan, conceptual design and preliminary engineering documents, an urban design component, and final design documents; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco
Transportation Authority, acting as Congestion Management Agency and in consultation with
the Department of Public Works, the Department of Parking and Traffic and the Planning
Department, to assume responsibility for securing environmental clearance for the Project and
developing an interim traffic management plan; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works will submit its proposed Project work plan for review and comment to the CAC and the San Francisco Transportation Authority no later than March 15, 1999; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works will submit its proposed Project budget for approval to the San Francisco Transportation Authority no later than April 1, 1999 or within 30 days of receipt of an approved agreement with CalTrans, whichever is later; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works will submit its conceptual design and preliminary engineering documents to the CAC for review and comment no later than June 1, 1999; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works will submit its final design documents for approval by the San Francisco Transportation Authority as expeditiously as possible.
