## RESOLUTION NO. 683-03

[2003 Domestic Violence Awareness Month.]

## Resolution ratifying that the Board of Supervisors declares the month of October 2003 as "Domestic Violence Awareness Month" in the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, In 1981, the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence, in an effort to connect battered women's advocates across the nation, organized a week of a series of activities conducted at the local, State and federal levels so as to mourn those who had died because of domestic violence, to celebrate those who had survived and to connect those who continually work to end violence; and,

WHEREAS, As a result of these efforts, in October 1987, the first Domestic Violence Awareness Month was observed, followed by the first Domestic Violence Awareness Month Commemorative Legislation, which was passed by the U.S. Congress; and,

WHEREAS, Each year domestic violence organizations and their allies sponsor activities to raise awareness about domestic violence and abuse at the national level; and

WHEREAS, It is known that over one-third of women in the United States are killed by their current or former partners; and,

8 WHEREAS, Approximately one million women annually report being stalked, and many 9 children suffer or witness abuse in their homes, which can sadly create legacies of violence in 0 families across the United States; and,

WHEREAS, Each year, over eight million children witness violence between their
parents and later these children are at a 40% greater risk than those from non-violent homes
to develop emotional and behavior problems; and,

24 WHEREAS, Research indicates that partner violence is highly correlated with parental 25 violence upon children. Those children who have been subjected to parental abuse, or who

have been witness to assaults between their parents, may experience the following symptoms: Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, low self-esteem, anxiety, depression, attention and cognitive deficits, school problems, poor peer relations and delinquent behavior as adolescents; and,

WHEREAS, Accordingly, organizations in the greater Bay Area are sponsoring events to educate the public by bringing together community groups interested in reducing domestic violence, including Contra Costa County's Violence Prevention Forum, a luncheon and video presentation sponsored by the Child Abuse Prevention Council of Marin, a Men Against Domestic Violence Walk-A-Thon in Oakland being sponsored by A Safe Place, a twenty-year anniversary celebration of the Riley Center in San Francisco and a reception at the Rally Visitation Services for the welcoming of its new Executive Director and the implementation of its newly funded Safe Havens Project ; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby ratify the month of October 2003 as "Domestic Violence Awareness Month" in the City and County of San Francisco.
