ESTABLISHING AN INTERDEPARTMENTAL INTERNET ECONOMIC IMPACT TASK FORCE
TO REVIEW THE ECONOMIC IMPACT RELATED TO THE TAXATION OF ELECTRONIC
COMMERCE AND OTHER INTERNET ACTIVITIES AND SETTING FORTH THE
MEMBERSHIP AND DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE.

WHEREAS, It is important that the City and County of San Francisco monitor and preserve its fiscal health; and,

WHEREAS, The uncertainties associated with State and local taxes on electronic commerce and the inconsistencies among them could stifle the development of Internet commerce; and,

WHEREAS, With the growth of the Internet, many transactions of goods and services are now occurring through electronic commerce; and,

WHEREAS, According to a study by the University of Texas, sales of products on the Web generated more than \$101 billion last year; and,

WHEREAS, Some individuals argue that electronic commerce and other Internet activities should not be taxed to encourage broader use of the Internet while others believe that sales and use tax revenues should be maintained whether or not transactions occur on the Web; and,

WHEREAS, In October 1998, the United States Congress passed the Internet Tax Freedom Act which imposed a three year moratorium on new state or local taxes on Internet access and multiple or discriminatory taxes on electronic commerce (those that are not

collectible on non-electronic transactions) and established an Advisory Commission on Electronic Commerce to study the taxation of electronic commerce; and,

WHEREAS, The Federal Advisory Commission on Electronic Commerce established pursuant to the Internet Tax Freedom Act is made up of 19 members from across the United States; and,

WHEREAS, In August 1998, the California State Legislature passed a California Internet Tax Freedom Act that imposes a three-year moratorium on new or discriminatory taxes on Internet access and online computer services; and,

WHEREAS, These new federal and state laws and other proposals being considered by federal and state officials could have a significant impact on the fiscal health of San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, Pivotal issues being considered in the Internet taxation debate include what activities and transactions will be taxed, under what circumstances state and local governments have jurisdiction to tax transactions effected on the Internet, to what extent state and local governments can properly require Internet service providers to maintain and report information or withhold and remit taxes, and how it will be determined where the transactions occur; and

WHEREAS, It is important that the City and County of San Francisco study the issue of Internet taxation and attempt to understand the potential impact of existing and pending changes in the character of commercial transactions and in the tax law; and,

WHEREAS, It is important that the City and County of San Francisco provide input to federal and state officials who will be shaping the future of Internet taxation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby establishes a task force, called the Internet Economic Impact Task Force, to review issues related to the taxation of electronic commerce and the impact on the growth and development of electronic commerce; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Internet Economic Impact Task Force shall be made up of eight members including one member appointed by the Mayor, one representative of the Board of Supervisors appointed by the Board of Supervisors, one representative from the Department of Telecommunications and Information Services (DTIS) appointed by DTIS, one representative from the Mayor's Office of Business Economic Development appointed by the Mayor's Office of Business Economic Development, one member from the City Attorney's office appointed by the City Attorney, one member from the Budget Analyst's office appointed by the Budget Analyst, one member from the Controller's office appointed by the Controller, and one member from the Tax Collector/Treasurer's office appointed by the Tax

FURTHER RESOLVED, That, to the extent data is available, the Internet Economic Impact Task Force shall study the impacts on San Francisco's revenues and its economic development of proposed and

actual policy changes regarding the taxation of Internet commerce and other Internet activities; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Internet Economic Impact Task Force shall monitor proposed federal and state policies that will impact the taxation of Internet commerce and other Internet activities, shall make recommendations to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors, and shall communicate San Francisco's preferences to relevant decision makers; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That, once established, the Internet Economic Impact Task Force shall appoint a Chair and establish the frequency and timing of Task Force meetings; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That DTIS shall provide staff support for the Internet Economic Impact Task Force as needed; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Internet Economic Impact Task Force shall report to the Finance and Labor Committee of the Board of Supervisors at least every six months; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Internet Economic Impact Task Force shall be established upon enactment of this resolution and shall expire in October, 2001 unless a majority of the members of the Board of Supervisors vote to terminate it sooner or extend it further.
