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AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKING AND TRAFFIC TO RETROACTIVELY APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND **EXPEND UP TO \$2,655,000 IN FEDERAL SURFACE TRANSPORTATION** MANAGEMENT PROGRAM/ CONGESTION MANAGEMENT AND AIR QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (STP/CMAQ) GRANTS WITH REQUIRED LOCAL MATCHING FUNDS OF \$345,000 AND A WAIVER OF INDIRECT COSTS TO IMPLEMENT THE SECOND PHASE OF THE SAN FRANCISCO INTEGRATED TRANSPORTATION MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (ITMS).

WHEREAS, The San Francisco County Transportation Authority has recommended the programming of \$2,655,000 in Federal Surface Transportation Program/Congestion Management and Air Quality Improvement Program (STP/CMAQ) funds, for the San Francisco Integrated Transportation Management System (ITMS) project, as part of the upcoming 1999 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), to be adopted by the Metropolitan Transportation Commission and approved by the Federal Highway Administration; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Integrated Transportation Management System (ITMS) is a real-time transportation management system that will utilize state-of-the-art technology to enhance traffic safety, improve transit operations, reduce congestion and travel time, improve responsiveness to special events and incidents, keep travelers informed of traffic conditions, and enhance communications coordination among DPT, Caltrans, MUNI, and other transit and transportation agencies, thereby improving the quality of life for all San Franciscans; and

WHEREAS, The Federal grant funds will be used to implement the second phase of this ITMS project, currently being implemented, and will continue to focus on streets affected by the Pacific Bell Park, the I-80 on- and off-ramp retrofit project.

Moscone Convention Center, expansion in the South of Market area, and additional corridors in the North of Market area; and

WHEREAS, The second phase of the ITMS will include the Transportation Management Center and data exchange network expansion at the DPT's Traffic Engineering Office located at 25 Van Ness Avenue, a satellite computer workstation at the City's 911 Emergency Center, additional detectors and closed circuit television cameras for traffic volume and congestion monitoring, additional variable message signs for information dissemination, and additional upgrade of traffic signal controllers for automated signal timing; and

WHEREAS, The Federal funding will cover 88.5 percent of eligible costs, as defined by the Federal Highway Administration and administered by the California Department of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, Indirect costs are ineligible, according to Federal Highway

Administration rules and regulation; and

WHEREAS, The non-Federal share will be paid for with the City's general funds, road funds, local sales tax program funds administrated by the San Francisco County Transportation Authority, and other locally available funds totaling \$345,000; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED,** That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Executive Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic to retroactively apply for, accept, and expend \$2,655,000 of Federal Surface Transportation Program/Congestion Management and Air Quality Improvement Program funds with required local

matching funds of \$345,000 and with a waive of indirect costs for implementation of the second phase of the San Francisco Integrated Transportation Management System (ITMS). RECOMMENDED: **APPROVED:** Executive Director
