[Transportation Code - Disabled Parking Placard or License Plate Restrictions]

Ordinance amending the Transportation Code, Division I, to prohibit, on any street, alley, or portion of a street or alley, or in any municipal or private parking facility, the parking of a vehicle displaying a disabled parking placard or special license plate, in order to obtain special parking privileges, that has been reported as lost, stolen, surrendered, canceled, revoked, or expired, or issued to a person who has been reported as deceased for a period exceeding sixty days; is not being used to transport, and is not in the reasonable proximity of, the person to whom the license plate or placard was issued or a person who is authorized to be transported in the vehicle displaying that placard or license plate; or is counterfeit, forged, altered, or mutilated.

Section 1. Article 7 of the San Francisco Transportation Code is hereby amended by adding Section 7.2.44, to read as follows:

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

SEC. 7.2. INFRACTIONS.

In addition to public offenses created by the Vehicle Code, the actions listed in this Section 7.2 are prohibited, and each and every violation of a prohibition listed below shall be an infraction, except as otherwise provided in: (a) this Code; or (b) the Vehicle Code; or (c) as necessary to comply with the direction of a Police Officer or Parking Control Officer; or (d) with respect to a Municipal Parking Facility, upon the direction of an authorized parking attendant; or (e) with respect to any other Public Property, except with the permission of, and subject to

such conditions and regulations as are imposed by the agency that owns the property that are available for public inspection at the agency's offices.

SEC. 7.2.44 DISABLED PARKING PLACARD AND SPECIAL LICENSE PLATE RESTRICTIONS.

To Park on any street, alley or portion of a street or alley a vehicle that displays a disabled parking placard or special license plate, in order to obtain special parking privileges, that:

- (a) Has been reported as lost, stolen, surrendered, canceled, revoked, or expired, or issued to a person who has been reported as deceased for a period exceeding sixty (60) days;
- (b) Is not being used to transport, and is not in the reasonable proximity of, the person to whom the license plate or placard was issued or a person who is authorized to be transported in the vehicle displaying that placard or license plate;
 - (c) Is counterfeit, forged, altered, or mutilated.

Section 2. Article 7 of the San Francisco Transportation Code is hereby amended by adding Section 7.2.66, to read as follows:

SEC. 7.2. INFRACTIONS.

In addition to public offenses created by the Vehicle Code, the actions listed in this Section 7.2 are prohibited, and each and every violation of a prohibition listed below shall be an infraction, except as otherwise provided in: (a) this Code; or (b) the Vehicle Code; or (c) as necessary to comply with the direction of a Police Officer or Parking Control Officer; or (d) with respect to a Municipal Parking Facility, upon the direction of an authorized parking attendant; or (e) with respect to any other Public Property, except with the permission of, and subject to such conditions and regulations as are imposed by the agency that owns the property that are available for public inspection at the agency's offices.

SEC. 7.2.66 DISABLED PARKING PLACARD AND SPECIAL LICENSE PLATE RESTRICTIONS.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

To Park in any Municipal Parking Facility, or privately owned parking facility, a vehicle that displays a disabled parking placard or special license plate, in order to obtain special parking privileges, that:

- (a) Has been reported as lost, stolen, surrendered, canceled, revoked, or expired, or issued to a person who has been reported as deceased for a period exceeding sixty (60) days;
- (b) Is not being used to transport, and is not in the reasonable proximity of, the person to whom the license plate or placard was issued or a person who is authorized to be transported in the vehicle displaying that placard or license plate:
 - (c) Is counterfeit, forged, altered, or mutilated.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the date of passage.

Section 4. This section is uncodified. In enacting this Ordinance, the Board intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent part of the Transportation Code that are explicitly shown in this legislation as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the legislation.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Transportation Code - Disabled Parking Placard or License Plate Restrictions]

Ordinance amending the Transportation Code, Division I, to prohibit, on any street, alley, or portion of a street or alley, or in any municipal or private parking facility, the parking of a vehicle displaying a disabled parking placard or special license plate, in order to obtain special parking privileges, that has been reported as lost, stolen, surrendered, canceled, revoked, or expired, or issued to a person who has been reported as deceased for a period exceeding sixty days; is not being used to transport, and is not in the reasonable proximity of, the person to whom the license plate or placard was issued or a person who is authorized to be transported in the vehicle displaying that placard or license plate; or is counterfeit, forged, altered, or mutilated.

Existing Law

California Vehicle Code section 22511.57 authorizes the City and County of San Francisco to prohibit or restrict the parking or standing of a vehicle on any street or highway, or in a parking stall or space in a publicly or privately owned or operated off-street parking facility within its jurisdiction by ordinance or resolution. In 1996, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors approved Resolution 195-96 to implement Vehicle Code section 22511.57 to establish a violation for misuse of a disabled placard when the placard has been reported lost, stolen or issued to a deceased person.

Amendments to Current Law

This ordinance prohibits the display of disabled parking placards or license plates under certain circumstances as authorized by Vehicle Code section 22511.57.

Background Information

In order to provide members of the public adequate notice of the prohibited conduct, the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency ("SFMTA") would like to codify these disabled parking placard and license plate restrictions as an ordinance instead of as a resolution.

Dear Members of the Board of Supervisors:

Background

Currently, California Vehicle Code Section 22511.57 permits a local authority to "prohibit or restrict the parking or standing of a vehicle on streets or highways or in a parking stall or space in a privately or publicly owned or operated off-street parking facility" if "the vehicle displays, in order to obtain special parking privileges, a distinguishing placard or special license plate" that:

- "has been reported as lost, stolen, surrendered, canceled, revoked, or expired, or was issued to a person who has been reported as deceased for a period exceeding 60 days;" or
- "is displayed on a vehicle that is not being used to transport, and is not in the reasonable proximity of, the person to whom the license plate or placard was issued or a person who is authorized to be transported in the vehicle displaying that placard or license plate;" or
- "is counterfeit, forged, altered, or mutilated."

In 1996, the Board of Supervisors approved Resolution 195-96 to implement a previous version of Vehicle Code section 22511.57 in San Francisco to establish a violation for misuse of a disabled placard when the placard has been reported lost, stolen or issued to a deceased person.

Proposal

Attached for your consideration is an Ordinance amending the San Francisco Transportation Code, Division I by adding Section 7.2.44 and 7.2.66. The proposed amendment to the Transportation Code would codify the disabled parking restrictions currently contained in the Vehicle Code into the City's Transportation Code, and do so as an ordinance, rather than a resolution.

Alternatives Considered

The alternative to this action would be to maintain the references to disabled parking placard and license plate restrictions in the Vehicle Code. The alternative is unsatisfactory because Division I, once amended, will contain the relevant restrictions, and the reference to the Vehicle Code will no longer be necessary.

SFMTA Board of Directors' Approval

The proposed ordinance is a codification in the City's Transportation Code of existing State law, and will give the public adequate notice of disabled parking restrictions. The SFMTA Board will be considering a resolution at its July 16, 2013 meeting that recommends approval of this Ordinance, and makes corresponding amendments to Division II of the Transportation Code. Before the SFMTA Board can impose parking fines for violations, the BOS must approve the parking restrictions proposed for Division I of the Transportation Code.

Recommendations

To provide for consistency between the California Vehicle Code and the SF Transportation Code, the SFMTA requests that the Board of Supervisors amend the San Francisco Transportation Code, Division I by adding Section 7.2.44 and 7.2.66 to prohibit, on any street, alley, or portion of a street or alley, or in any municipal or private parking facility, the parking of a vehicle displaying a disabled parking placard or special license plate, in order to obtain special parking privileges, that has been reported as lost, stolen, surrendered, canceled, revoked, or expired, or issued to a person who has been reported as deceased for a period exceeding 60 days; is not being used to transport, and is not in the reasonable proximity of, the person to whom the license plate or placard was issued or a person who is authorized to be transported in the vehicle displaying that placard or license plate; or is counterfeit, forged, altered, or mutilated.
