[Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals Day - September 4, 2013]

Resolution commending the Dream SF Deferred Action Grant Program and declaring September 4, 2013, as Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) Day in the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, On June 15, 2012, President Obama through the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), announced the implementation of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, which began on August 15, 2012; and

WHEREAS, The Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program offers "deferred action" to immigrants who were brought to the United States as children and who meet other specific requirements as indicated on the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS); and

WHEREAS, According to the Immigration Policy Center, roughly 936,930 immigrants between the ages of 15 and 30 might immediately meet the requirements of the deferred action initiative, with California leading with 412,560 potentially qualified youth and adults, followed by Texas (226,700), Florida (85,750), New York (70,170), and Illinois (67,460)4; and

WHEREAS, An estimated 4,400-6,050 potentially eligible individuals for deferred action reside in the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, In the fall of 2012, the San Francisco Office of Civic Engagement & Immigrant Affairs (OCEIA) with support from the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families, launched the Dream SF: Deferred Action Grants Program to provide resources to community-based organizations providing legal services; culturally and linguistically competent application assistance, outreach and education; and other services to potentially eligible DACA applicants; and

1	WHEREAS, Dream SF Community Based Organizations including Catholic Charities
2	CYO, Legal Services for Children, and the San Francisco Immigrant Legal and Education
3	Network (Asian Law Caucus, Asian Pacific Islander Legal Outreach, Central American
4	Resource Center, Dolores Street Community Services and La Raza Centro Legal) have
5	collectively assisted over 300 San Francisco residents in completing and submitting their
6	DACA applications; and
7	WHEREAS, Many additional residents have yet to apply or will become eligible for
8	DACA in the near future; and
9	WHEREAS, This spring the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, the San Francisco
10	Immigrant Rights Commission, and the San Francisco Youth Commission, each passed a
11	resolution promoting DACA and urging the San Francisco Unified School District to coordinate
12	efforts with City departments and the Dream SF Program to support greater student and youth
13	participation; and
14	WHEREAS, OCEIA and the San Francisco Youth Commission have been collaborating
15	for over six months to promote DACA, including working with the San Francisco Unified
16°	School District and other higher education institutions to support Dream SF and connect
17	eligible residents with the grant-funded legal services and application assistance services;
18	now therefore be it
19	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
20	commends the Dream SF: Deferred Action Grants Program for assisting eligible residents
21	during the first year of the DACA program; and be it
