# STATEMENT OF REASONS IN SUPPORT OF APPEAL SAN FRANCISCO PLANNING COMMISSION MOTION NO. 18930 CASE NO. 2013.0259CV (3771/3781 CESAR CHAVEZ STREET)

- 1. The 3700 block of Cesar Chavez Street is already unusually dangerous.
- a. According to reports obtained from the SFMTA, this block of Cesar Chavez Street has NINETEEN times as many collisions with moving vehicles, cyclists, and pedestrians as the blocks where the Commission has recently approved child care facilities, and SIXTEEN times as many injury accidents.
- b. By the end of the year, the City plans to stripe bicycle lanes in both directions of the boulevard portion of Cesar Chavez Street, beginning one block east of the proposed preschool, as part of San Francisco Bike Route 50. The 3700 block of Cesar Chavez Street, which will not have bike lanes, is nonetheless also part of Bike Route 50. The combination of commuting cyclists riding down this block, while 42 parents attempt to merge out of and back into traffic as they drop off and pick up their children, will inevitably lead to collisions. The Commission failed to take any steps to address this obvious danger.
- c. The Commission has approved four child care facilities in the past year. For each of the other three applications, the Commission ordered that the facility provide crossing guards as a safety measure and as a condition of the permit. (SF Planning Commission Motion No. 18825 (1270 Sanchez Street), approved March 14, 2013; Motion No. 18773 (281 Harvard Street), approved December 13, 2012; Motion No. 18674 (175 Junipero Serra Boulevard), approved July 26, 2012. Without stating any justification, the Commission failed to require crossing guards as a safety measure or as a condition for this very dangerous block, even though the Commission acknowledged that this block is "a heavily trafficked arterial street that is the main thoroughfare for access to Highway 101 from Noe Valley."
- 2. The operators of the proposed preschool have a track record of violating and disregarding the law.
- a. The Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) of the State Department of Social Services is the state agency charged with enforcing regulations relating to safety at preschools and family day care facilities. CCLD has cited Gan Noe Preschool for a dozen "Type A" violations—the most serious type of violations—just in the past year. These violations include the failure to have working smoke detectors, the repeated operation of the facility with more children than was permitted by the license, the failure to comply with the condition that the home be free of defects or conditions that might endanger a child, the obstruction of the sole exit with storage items, and the failure to conduct fire or disaster drills.

b. CCLD also cited Gan Noe for two "zero tolerance violations": continuing to operate a family day care facility long after the licensee had vacated the premises. In both instances, Gan Noe misrepresented to CCLD personnel that the licensee was still living at the premises before finally admitting that the licensee had abandoned the premises.

#### 3. The Commission failed to exercise its discretion.

- a. At the December 13, 2012, hearing on the application for a child care facility at 281 Harvard Street, the Commission explained why child care facilities must sometimes be located in quiet residential neighborhoods by saying that "We don't want them [child care facilities] on a busy street where they [the children] can get hit." *This block* is a busy street where children can get hit: There were 19 injury accidents with 20 total injuries on *just this block* between 2005 and 2011. If the Commission had followed its own rule, the permit to expand the day care—especially a day care without crossing guards—would have been denied.
- b. At the July 18, 2013, hearing on this application, the Commission said, "We always approve these things [child care facilities]." But it is not sound policy, nor is it a family-friendly policy, to approve child care facilities without regard to the number of children and without regard to the circumstances of a particular location. This location is not safe, and these operators cannot be relied on to make it safe.

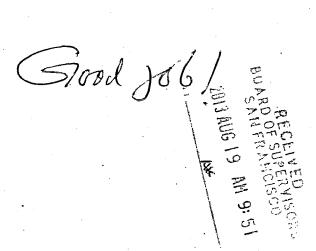

ADOPTING FINDINGS RELATING TO THE APPROVAL OF CONDITIONAL USE AUTHORIZATION PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 209.3(F), 209.3(J), 317, AND 303 OF THE PLANNING CODE TO INCREASE ENROLLMENT AT AN EXISTING PRE-SCHOOL (D.B.A. GAN NOE PRESCHOOL) OPERATING AT 3771 AND 3781 CESAR CHAVEZ STREET AND ESTABLISH A RELIGIOUS FACILITY. ENROLLMENT AT THE PRE-SCHOOL WOULD INCREASE FROM 22 CHILDREN TO 42 CHILDREN AND THE PROJECT WOULD RESULT IN THE REMOVAL OF THE DWELLING UNIT AT 3781 CESAR CHAVEZ STREET. THE SUBJECT PROPERTY IS LOCATED IN A RH-2 (RESIDENTIAL, HOUSE, TWO-FAMILY) DISTRICT AND A 40-X HEIGHT AND BULK DISTRICT.

### **PREAMBLE**

On March 8, 2013, Jeremy Paul of Quickdraw Permit Consulting, on behalf of Leah Potash (hereinafter "Project Sponsor") filed an application with the Planning Department (hereinafter "Department") for Conditional Use Authorization under Planning Code Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 to allow an increase in enrollment at a preschool (d.b.a. Gan Noe Preschool) and allow for an accessory religious facility within the preschool, located within a RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District.

On July 18, 2013, the San Francisco Planning Commission (hereinafter "Commission") conducted a duly noticed public hearing at a regularly scheduled meeting on Conditional Use Application No. 2013.0259C.

The Department determined the Project to be exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") as a Class 1 categorical exemption.

The Commission has heard and considered the testimony presented to it at the public hearing and has further considered written materials and oral testimony presented on behalf of the applicant, Department staff, and other interested parties.

MOVED, that the Commission hereby authorizes the Conditional Use requested in Application No. 2013.0259C, subject to the conditions contained in "EXHIBIT A" of this motion, based on the following findings:

### **FINDINGS**

Having reviewed the materials identified in the preamble above, and having heard all testimony and arguments, this Commission finds, concludes, and determines as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are accurate and constitute findings of this Commission.
- 2. Site Description and Present Use. The Project Sites, 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chvez Street are adjacent properties (Assessor's Block 6577, Lots 030 and 045) located on the south side of Cesar Chavez Street, between Dolores and Guerrero Streets at the eastern boundary of the Noe Valley neighborhood. 3771 Cesar Chavez Street is developed with a one and a half story over basement single-family dwelling that was constructed circa 1898. The building is set back towards the rear of the lot with large enclosed landscaped yard at the front and two off-street, surface parking spaces at the front of the lot. The lot is flag shaped with a small yard located to the west of the building. Total building area is approximately 4,064 gross square-feet. A portion of the building is currently used as a preschool/home daycare that is licensed for 14 children. The owners of the preschool also live at the property. 3781 Cesar Chavez Street is the adjacent property to the west of 3771 Cesar Chavez Street. The property is developed with a one-story over garage, single-family dwelling that was constructed in 1942. The property is also used as a preschool/home daycare that is licensed for 8 children. The rear yard is the primary children's play area.
- 3. Surrounding Properties and Neighborhood. The Project sites are located on the south side of the two-lane portion of Cesar Chavez Street which serves as the primary arterial for access to the 101 Freeway from Noe Valley. The immediate neighborhood is primarily residential, however, there are two churches and a large surface parking lot located on the north side of the street. There is a three-way signal light at both the east and west ends of the block. The adjacent properties to the west of the project sites are key lots that are much shorter than the average lot within this neighborhood. As a result of the smaller lots these properties also have smaller rear yards.

- 4. Project Description. The project sponsor is seeking Conditional Use authorization pursuant to Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 to increase enrollment at an existing pre-school (d.b.a. Gan Noe Preschool) operating at 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street and establish a religious facility. Enrollment at the pre-school would increase from a combined enrollment of 22 children to 42 children and the project would result in the removal of the dwelling unit and the existing parking at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street. The proposal does not include any significant alteration or modification to the exteriors of the existing buildings with the exception of minor changes to signage and fencing. The space would also function as a religious facility when the preschool is not in session. The project also requires a parking variance as two parking spaces are required for the use and the existing parking space at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street would be removed. The subject property is located in RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District.
- 5. Project Background. Gan Noe Preschool has been operating at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street since 2005 as a home daycare/preschool for 14 or fewer children. In 2010, Gan Noe Preschool purchased 3781 Cesar Chavez Street and began operating a home daycare/preschool for 14 or fewer children at this location as well. The two properties were licensed for a total of 28 children. In 2011, an enforcement case was opened on 3781 Cesar Chavez Street for the alleged operation of a childcare facility with more than 40 children operating without proper approvals. The Project Sponsor was notified of the enforcement case but it was never investigated by the Department and remains active.

The Project Sponsor also operated a preschool within a single-family dwelling at 107 Justin Drive in Bernal Heights at the same time she was operating a preschool at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street. Conditional use authorization was sought for this location to expand its enrollment to 19 children but the application was cancelled in 2009 and the preschool was closed in 2010.

- 6. Public Comment. The Department received correspondence in opposition to the project from 20 neighbors including adjacent neighbors Richard and Ashley Rochman and Bill Sommer. These neighbors are concerned about parking and traffic, pedestrian safety, noise, driveway blockage related to the project.
  - The Project Sponsor submitted a petition signed by 34 people who have no objections to the project and staff received 32 pieces of public correspondence in support of the project including a letter of support from the Upper Noe Neighbors neighborhood group.
- 7. Planning Code Compliance: The Commission finds that the Project is consistent with the relevant provisions of the Planning Code in the following manner:
  - A. Institutions Child-Care Facility. Planning Code Section 209.3(f) requires Conditional Use authorization for child-care facilities providing less than 24 hour care for 15 or more children by licensed personnel and meeting the open space and other requirements of the State of California within the RH-2 Zoning District.

The Project Sponsor seeks Conditional Use authorization to establish a child-care facility providing less than 24-hour care for 15 or more and up to a maximum of 42 children within the RH-2 Zoning District.

B. Institutions – Religious Facility. Planning Code Section 209.3(j) requires Conditional Use authorization for a church or religious facility which has a tax-exempt status as a religious institution granted by the United States Government, and which institution is used primarily for collective worship or ritual or observance of common religious beliefs within the RH-2 Zoning District.

The Project Sponsor seeks Conditional Use authorization to establish a religious facility. The facility would operate a number of weekly programs with 12 or fewer attendees at any given time. Weekly events include: Saturday morning services, Wednesday night Torah, Bar and Bat Mitzvah lessons and tutoring, and weekly Hebrew classes. Large gatherings would include Rosh Hashana (Fall), Yom Kippur (Fall), Purim Party (Spring), and Passover dinner (Spring).

C. Off-Street Parking. Planning Code Section 151 requires one off-street parking space for each 25 children to be accommodated at any one time, where the number of such children exceeds 24.

The proposed child-care facility for a maximum of 42 children would be required to provide a minimum of two off-street parking spaces for the use, pursuant to Planning Code Sections 151 and 153. The Project would not include any required off-street parking space, which would be subject to an off-street parking variance. The Project Sponsor has submitted a Variance Application No. 2013.0259CV. The Zoning Administrator will hold a public hearing on Variance Application while the Planning Commission will consider Conditional Use Application.

D. Loss of Dwellings through Conversion. Conversion of Residential Units shall be prohibited, unless the Planning Commission approves the conversion at a public hearing.

The Planning Commission shall consider these criteria in the review of applications for Conversation of Residential Units;

 (i) Whether conversion of the unit(s) would eliminate only owner occupied housing, and if so, for how long the unit(s) proposed to be removed were owner occupied;

The dwelling to be converted at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street is not owner occupied. The owners of 3781 purchased the property in 2010 and live next door at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street.

(ii) Whether conversation of the unit(s) would provide desirable new non-residential use(s) appropriate for the neighborhood and adjoining district(s);

The conversion of the dwelling unit at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street would support an existing preschool use. Desirable preschools are important in retaining young families in San

Francisco and those that exist often have long waiting lists for open spaces which is often discouraging. The proposed preschool would serve families that want a preschool that favors Jewish values. There are few preschools in San Francisco that offer similar services and those that do offer it are located outside the neighborhoods that Gan Noe Preschool is trying to service. Therefore, the conversion would provide a desirable new non-residential use.

(iii) Whether conversation of the unit(s) will bring the building closer into conformance with the prevailing character of its immediate area and in the same zoning district;

The immediate neighborhood is within a RH District. Though there are two religious facilities located on the north side of Cesar Chavez Street however, the immediate neighborhood is primarily residential. Therefore, the conversion will not bring the property into closer conformance with the prevailing character.

(iv) Whether conversion of the unit(s) will be detrimental to the City's housing stock;

The conversion of the dwelling unit would be detrimental to the City's housing stock because it would result in the loss of a habitable dwelling unit.

(v) Whether conversion of the unit(s) is necessary to eliminate design, functional, or habitability deficiencies that cannot otherwise be corrected.

The existing dwelling unit is approximately 990 square-feet and contains one-bedroom and one bath. Other than being relatively small, the dwelling has no known design, functional, or habitable deficiencies.

Preschool/child care services are difficult to find in the City and those that operate often have long waiting lists. The ability of the City to provide these services will help its ability to attract and retain families in the City. Housing is also a scarce resource in the City. On balance, the need to help preschool/childcare services flourish in the City outweigh the benefit of retaining the existing dwelling unit.

- 8. Planning Code Section 303 establishes criteria for the Planning Commission to consider when reviewing applications for Conditional Use approval. On balance, the project does comply with said criteria in that:
  - A. The proposed new uses and building, at the size and intensity contemplated and at the proposed location, will provide a development that is necessary or desirable, and compatible with, the neighborhood or the community.

The Project would retain the existing buildings on the site and their present configuration. The proposed use is necessary and desirable for the neighborhood because the presence of preschools in San Francisco helps to retain families in the city. At present, preschools are few and far between with desirable preschools experiencing long wait lists for open spaces which discourages some families from attempting to raise their children within the city. Gan Noe is a unique preschool because it offers

preschool services with Jewish values. Every year the school must reject dozens of requests for placement from families due to lack of capacity. Similar preschools are located north of Market Street or on Brotherhood Way, leaving the heart of the city without such services. The proposed expansion would allow Gan Noe to better serve the neighborhoods of Noe Valley, Bernal Heights, Glen Park, and the Mission

Activities related to the proposed religious facility would take place after preschool hours within the same space and according the Sponsor would involve no more than 12 people at a time.

- B. The proposed project will not be detrimental to the health, safety, convenience or general welfare of persons residing or working in the vicinity. There are no features of the project be detrimental to the health, safety or convenience of those residing or working in the area, in that:
  - Nature of proposed site, including its size and shape, and the proposed size, shape and arrangement of structures;

The Project would not alter the existing site configuration of the buildings on the site. The children's play area would be located within the rear yard where it is currently located. Neighbors to the west of the subject property who share the same mid-block have expressed concerns about potential noise impacts from the additional children. In response, the Project Sponsor has stated that outdoor playtime will be staggered such that all children would never be in the play area at the same time. By law, the younger children cannot be within the play area at the same time as the older children.

 The accessibility and traffic patterns for persons and vehicles, the type and volume of such traffic, and the adequacy of proposed off-street parking and loading;

The Subject Property is in an established residential neighborhood that is well served by public transit, including 24th Street and the J-Church Muni Metro Line and J-Streetcar within two blocks of the Subject Property. Additionally, the proposed preschool facility is intended to meet the needs of the residents in the immediate neighborhood and should not generate significant amounts of vehicular trips citywide.

The Planning Code requires two off-street parking spaces for the proposed facility; however, the sponsor is seeking a variance from this requirement and would remove the existing garage parking space at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street. The project site is located on a street that is the primary arterial to and from Highway 101. Furthermore, there are signaled intersections at the east and west ends of the block. These factors often lead to traffic congestion within the subject block during commute hours. Neighbors have expressed concern that the proposed increase in enrollment would exacerbate the traffic situation within the block and that current parents park on sidewalks and block adjacent driveways during drop off. In response, the Project Sponsor has The Project Sponsor has agreed to apply for a white passenger loading zone, accommodating two parking spaces, on Sanchez Street in front of the facility's entrance and has agreed to institute a

staggered pick up and drop off that is supervised by staff to reduce traffic congestion during commute hours.

No additional off-street parking is required for the proposed religious facility. Programs related to the facility would include weekly Saturday morning services, weekly Wednesday night Torah study, Bar and Bat Mitzvah lessons and tutoring, and weekly Hebrew classes. Larger religious gatherings include Rosh Hashana (Sept.), Yom Kippur (Sept.), Purim Party (March), and Passover Dinner (April). Many attendees do not drive on the Sabbath or Jewish holidays in accordance with strict Jewish Law which reduces vehicular traffic.

iii. The safeguards afforded to prevent noxious or offensive emissions such as noise, glare, dust and odor;

The project would not emit noxious or offensive emissions such noise, glare, dust or odor.

iv. Treatment given, as appropriate, to such aspects as landscaping, screening, open spaces, parking and loading areas, service areas, lighting and signs;

No additional landscaping is proposed for the site. The Department shall review all lighting and signs proposed for the property in accordance with the Conditions of Approval contained in Exhibit A.

C. That the use as proposed will comply with the applicable provisions of the Planning Code and will not adversely affect the General Plan.

The Project complies with all relevant requirements and standards of the Planning Code and is consistent with objectives and policies of the General Plan as detailed below.

9. General Plan Compliance. The Project is, on balance, consistent with the following Objectives and Policies of the General Plan:

### COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY ELEMENT

### **OBJECTIVE 1:**

MANAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH AND CHANGE TO ENSURE ENHANCEMENT OF THE TOTAL CITY LIVING AND WORKING ENVIRONMENT.

### Policy 1.1:

Encourage development which provides substantial net benefits and minimizes undesirable consequences. Discourage development that has substantial undesirable consequences that cannot be mitigated.

The Project would enhance the living and working environment in the City by providing a unique needed preschool service for residents and workers within the Noe Valley, Bernal Height, Glen Park, and Mission

neighborhoods. The Project would also need to comply with State licensing requirements for childcare/preschool facilities further minimizing possible undesirable consequences from such a use.

### **OBJECTIVE 2:**

MAINTAIN AND ENHANCE A SOUND AND DIVERSE ECONOMIC BASE AND FISCAL STRUCTURE FOR THE CITY.

### Policy 2.1:

Seek to retain existing commercial and industrial activity and to attract new such activity to the City.

### Policy 3:

Maintain a favorable social cultural climate in the city in order to enhance its attractiveness as a firm location.

The Project will enhance an existing preschool facility that has served the surrounding community since 2005 by extending it services to a greater number of people.

### **OBJECTIVE 3:**

PROVIDE EXPANDED EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR CITY RESIDENTS, PARTICULARLY THE UNEMPLOYED AND ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED.

### Policy 3.1:

Promote the attraction, retention and expansion of commercial and industrial firms which provide employment improvement opportunities for unskilled and semi-skilled workers.

The Project will provide employment opportunities for nine semi-skilled San Francisco residents.

### GOVERNMENT, HEALTH AND EDUCATION SERVICES

### Objectives and Policies

**OBJECTIVE 7:** 

ENHANCE SAN FRANCISCO'S POSITION AS A NATIONAL AND REGINAL CENTER FOR GOVERNMENT, HEALTH, AND EDUCATIONAL SERVICES.

### Policy 7.2:

Encourage the extension of needed health and educational services, but manage expansion to avoid or minimize disruption of adjacent residential areas.

The proposed child-care facility will offer educational services to pre-school children of San Francisco residents. No exterior alteration will be proposed to the existing buildings. The proposed child-care facility's activities will take place either indoors or within the rear yard. The proposed conditions of approval would help reduce affects on parking and traffic within the neighborhood and ease noise levels during hours of operation.

- 10. Planning Code Section 101.1(b) establishes eight priority-planning policies and requires review of permits for consistency with said policies. On balance, the project does comply with said policies in that:
  - A. That existing neighborhood-serving retail uses be preserved and enhanced and future opportunities for resident employment in and ownership of such businesses be enhanced.
    - The proposal would strengthen an existing neighborhood-serving use that has served the neighborhood since 2005 and provide employment for up to nine people.
  - B. That existing housing and neighborhood character be conserved and protected in order to preserve the cultural and economic diversity of our neighborhoods.
    - The proposed use will retain the existing buildings on the site and the interior alterations to 3781 Cesar Chavez Street are such that they could be easily reversed and the property converted back to residential use.
  - C. That the City's supply of affordable housing be preserved and enhanced,
    - The Project would not affect the City's existing supply of affordable housing.
  - D. That commuter traffic not impede MUNI transit service or overburden our streets or neighborhood parking.
    - The proposed use is well served by public transit but it is located a few blocks away. The proposed preschool is not expected to be a destination use that attracts families from outside the immediate neighborhoods. The Sponsor has agreed to seek a passenger loading space in front of the property and implement a pick up and drop off program for families that choose to drive. The loading zone and the program have been included as conditions of approval for the Project.
  - E. That a diverse economic base be maintained by protecting our industrial and service sectors from displacement due to commercial office development, and that future opportunities for resident employment and ownership in these sectors be enhanced.
    - The Project will not displace any service or industry establishment. The project will not affect industrial or service sector uses or related employment opportunities. Ownership of industrial or service sector businesses will not be affected by this project.
  - F. That the City achieves the greatest possible preparedness to protect against injury and loss of life in an earthquake.
    - The Project will not affect the Subject Property's ability to withstand an earthquake.
  - G. That landmarks and historic buildings be preserved.

The Project would not alter the exterior appearance of the buildings in question.

H. That our parks and open space and their access to sunlight and vistas be protected from development.

The project will have no negative affect on existing parks and open spaces.

- 11. The Project is consistent with and would promote the general and specific purposes of the Code provided under Section 101.1(b) in that, as designed, the Project would contribute to the character and stability of the neighborhood and would constitute a beneficial development.
- 12. The Commission hereby finds that approval of the Conditional Use authorization would promote the health, safety and welfare of the City.

### DECISION

That based upon the Record, the submissions by the Applicant, the staff of the Department and other interested parties, the oral testimony presented to this Commission at the public hearings, and all other written materials submitted by all parties, the Commission hereby APPROVES Conditional Use Application No. 2013.0259©V pursuant to Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 of the Planning Code subject to the following conditions attached hereto as "EXHIBIT A" in general conformance with plans on file and stamped "EXHIBIT B", which is incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth.

APPEAL AND EFFECTIVE DATE OF MOTION: Any aggrieved person may appeal this Conditional Use Authorization to the Board of Supervisors within thirty (30) days after the date of this Motion No. 18930. The effective date of this Motion shall be the date of this Motion if not appealed (After the 30-day period has expired) OR the date of the decision of the Board of Supervisors if appealed to the Board of Supervisors. ### **AUTHORIZATION**

This authorization is for a conditional use to increase enrollment at preschool (d.b.a. Gan Noe Preschool) from 22 to 42 children and establish a religious facility (d.b.a Chabad of Noe Valley) for the properties at 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street, Block 6577, Lots 030 and 045, pursuant to Planning Code Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 within a RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District; in general conformance with plans stamped "EXHIBIT B" included in the docket for Case No. 2013.0259CV and subject to conditions of approval reviewed and approved by the Commission on July 18, 2013 under Motion No. 18930. This authorization and the conditions contained herein run with the property and not with a particular Project Sponsor, business, or operator.

### RECORDATION OF CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Prior to the issuance of the building permit or commencement of use for the Project the Zoning Administrator shall approve and order the recordation of a Notice in the Official Records of the Recorder of the City and County of San Francisco for the subject property. This Notice shall state that the project is subject to the conditions of approval contained herein and reviewed and approved by the Planning Commission on July 18, 2013 under Motion No. 18930.

### PRINTING OF CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL ON PLANS

The conditions of approval under the Exhibit A' of this Planning Commission Motion No. 18930 shall be reproduced on the Index Sheet of construction plans submitted with the Site or Building permit application for the Project. The Index Sheet of the construction plans shall reference to the Conditional Use authorization and any subsequent amendments or modifications.

### **SEVERABILITY**

The Project shall comply with all applicable City codes and requirements. If any clause, sentence, section or any part of these conditions of approval is for any reason held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect or impair other remaining clauses, sentences, or sections of these conditions. This decision conveys no right to construct, or to receive a building permit. "Project Sponsor" shall include any subsequent responsible party.

Building Inspection to construct the project and/or commence the approved use must be issued as this Conditional Use authorization is only an approval of the proposed project and conveys no independent right to construct the project or to commence the approved use. The Planning Commission may, in a public hearing, consider the revocation of the approvals granted if a site or building permit has not been obtained within three (3) years of the date of the Motion approving the Project. Once a site or building permit has been issued, construction must commence within the timeframe required by the Department of Building Inspection and be continued diligently to completion. - g. Replace the fiberglass basketball backboard with heavier constructed materials such as dense polycarbonate.
- Give neighbors a 14-day advance notice of pending holiday celebrations.

Should the contact information change, the Zoning Administrator shall be made aware of such change. The community liaison shall report to the Zoning Administrator what issues, if any, are of concern to the community and what issues have not been resolved by the Project Sponsor.

- 10. Traffic Plan. #### INTRODUCTION

This memorandum and the attached documents are a response to the letter of appeal to the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") regarding the Planning Commission's ("Commission") approval of the application for Conditional Use Authorization under Planning Code Sections 303 (Conditional Use Authorization), 209.3(f) (Institutions – Child-Care Facility), 209.3(j) (Institutions – Religious Facility), and 317 (Dwelling Unit Conversion) to expand an existing pre-school (d.b.a. Gan Noe Preschool) operating at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street into the adjacent property at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street, increasing enrollment at the pre-school from 22 children to 42 children. The space would also function as a religious facility when the preschool is not in session and would result in the conversion of the dwelling unit at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street. The subject property is located in RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District.

This response addresses the appeal ("Appeal Letter") to the Board filed on August 19, 2013 by Richard Rochman, owner of 1359 Dolores Street. The Appeal Letter referenced the proposed project in Planning Case No. 2013.0259C.

The decision before the Board is whether to uphold or overturn the Planning Commission's approval of Conditional Use Authorization to allow the expansion of the existing Gan Noe Preschool facility and the establishment of a religious facility.

### SITE DESCRIPTION & PRESENT USE

The Project Sites, 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street are adjacent properties (Assessor's Block 6577, Lots 030 and 045) located on the south side of Cesar Chavez Street, between Dolores and Guerrero Streets at the eastern boundary of the Noe Valley neighborhood.

- The existing building at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street is a one and a half story over basement, single-family dwelling with an accessory daycare/preschool use for 14 children. The building was constructed circa 1898. This building is set back from the sidewalk and featuring a large, enclosed landscaped yard and two off-street, surface parking spaces at the front of the lot. The lot is flag shaped with a small yard located to the west of the building. The total building area is approximately 4,064 gross square-feet. The owners of the daycare/preschool live in this building.
- The existing building at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street is the adjacent property to the west of 3771 Cesar Chavez Street. The property is developed with a one-story over garage, single-family dwelling that was constructed in 1942. The property also contains an accessory preschool/home daycare for eight children. The preschool at this location is owned and operated by the same party (d.b.a. Gan Noe Preschool) as the preschool/home day care at 3771 Cesar Chavez but is licensed to a different individual who no longer lives at that address. This dwelling would be inverted into the proposed preschool as part of the project. The rear yard is the primary children's play area.

### SURROUNDING PROPERTIES AND NEIGHBORHOOD

The Project sites are located on the south side of the two-lane portion of Cesar Chavez Street which serves as the primary arterial for access to the 101 Freeway from Noe Valley. The immediate neighborhood is primarily residential with two churches and a large surface parking lot located on the north side of the street. There is a three-way signal light at both the east and west ends of the block. The adjacent properties to the west of the project sites are much shorter than the average lot within this neighborhood. As a result of the smaller lots these immediately adjacent properties also have smaller rear yards.

### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project sponsor is seeking Conditional Use authorization pursuant to Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 to increase enrollment at an existing pre-school operating at 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street and establish a religious facility. Enrollment at the pre-school would increase from a combined enrollment of 22 children to 42 children and the project would result in the removal of the dwelling unit and the existing parking at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street. The proposal does not include any significant alteration or modification to the exteriors of the existing buildings with the exception of minor changes to signage and fencing. The space would also function as a religious facility (known as Chabad of Noe Valley) when the preschool is not in session. The project also requires a parking variance as two parking spaces are required for the use and the existing parking space at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street would be removed. The subject property is located in RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District.

### **BACKGROUND**

Gan Noe Preschool has been operating at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street since 2005 as a home daycare/preschool for 14 or fewer children. In 2010, Gan Noe Preschool purchased 3781 Cesar Chavez Street and began operating a home daycare/preschool for 8 or fewer children at this location as well but under a different licensee. The two properties were licensed for a total of 22 children. In 2011, an enforcement case was opened on 3781 Cesar Chavez Street for the alleged operation of a childcare facility with more than 40 children operating without proper approvals.

Planning Code Section 209.3 establishes two distinct types of child-care facilities. Section 209.3(e) pertains to facilities for 14 or fewer children and 209.3 (f) pertains to facilities with 15 or more children. Both use types are required by the Planning Code to meet the requirements of the State of California. The State requires that for the smaller facilities (209.3(e)) the owner must live on-site. The State does not require on-site owners for the larger facility.

The Project Sponsor was notified of the enforcement case but it was never investigated by the Department and remains active. According to the Project Sponsor there are only 22 children currently enrolled at the preschool on both locations. The project sponsor submitted the subject Conditional Use Authorization application on March 8, 2013 to secure appropriate entitlements for the larger size child-care use. The Department determined the Project to be exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") as a Class 1 categorical exemption.

### **CONDITIONAL USE AUTHORIZATION HEARING**

At the July 18, 2013 public hearing, the Commission granted a Conditional Use Authorization pursuant to Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303, authorizing the expansion of the Gan Noe Preschool from 22 to 42 children and establishing a religious facility (d.b.a. Chabad of Noe Valley). The project was approved with conditions by a vote of +6, -0 (Comm. Hillis absent). Below are the conditions that relate to the appellant's safety concerns:

- 1. Limiting the number of students to 42;
- 2. Requiring the Project Sponsor, neighbors and staff to work on establishing the fence height(s) between 3771-3781 Cesar Chavez and neighboring properties;
- 3. Limiting the Day Care hours of operation to 7 am to 6 pm;
- 4. Adopting the Acoustical Measures submitted to the Commission, sans items 5, 6 and 7 as listed below, and establishing a 14 day advance notice for holiday celebrations, item 11;
- 5. A report from staff to the Commission in one year; and The Project Sponsor shall provide the Department with a morning drop-off and afternoon pickup plan that will include a white passenger loading zone on Cesar Chavez Street in front of the entrance to the proposed preschool. Additionally, the Sponsor shall monitor the white zone for passenger loading and unloading during morning pick-up and afternoon drop-off hours.

### **ACOUSTICAL MEASURES**

The Project Sponsor commissioned a noise study for the Gan Noe Preschool. Below are all of the recommendations from the study with notations added for items altered or not required by the Commission.

- 1. Replace the existing fence around the play area with a 6-foot tall, sound-isolating fence.
- 2. Acoustically treat the play yard side of the fence with sound absorptive material (2-inch thick P.E.P.P.).

- 3. Landscape alternative play spaces within the garden at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street.
- 4. Continue the rubber matting to cover the entire play area.
- 5. Properly store and service children's play toys with moving parts. (Not required by the Planning Commission.)
- 6. Seal the "wedge" opening at 3787 Cesar Chavez with limp mass barrier (barium sulfate vinyl). (Not required by the Planning Commission.)
- 7. Break the solid connection between the project and 3787 Cesar Chavez at the narrow end of the wedge. (Not required by the Planning Commission.)
- 8. Conduct quarterly teacher trainings on "good neighbor" policies.
- 9. Post signage for instructing adults on "good neighbor" policies.
- 10. Replace the fiberglass basketball backboard with heavier constructed materials such as dense polycarbonate.
- 11. Give advance notice to neighbors of pending holiday celebrations. (Specifically, a 14-day notice was required by the Commission.

### CONDITIONAL USE AUTHORIZATION REQUIREMENTS

Planning Code Section 303 establishes the following criteria for the Planning Commission to consider when reviewing applications for Conditional Use approval.

- A. The proposed new uses and building, at the size and intensity contemplated and at the proposed location, will provide a development that is necessary or desirable, and compatible with, the neighborhood or the community.
- B. The proposed project will not be detrimental to the health, safety, convenience or general welfare of persons residing or working in the vicinity. There are no features of the project that would be detrimental to the health, safety or convenience of those residing or working in the area, in that:
  - i. Nature of proposed site, including its size and shape, and the proposed size, shape and arrangement of structures;
  - The accessibility and traffic patterns for persons and vehicles, the type and volume of such traffic, and the adequacy of proposed off-street parking and loading;
  - iii. The safeguards afforded to prevent noxious or offensive emissions such as noise, glare, dust and odor;
  - iv. Treatment given, as appropriate, to such aspects as landscaping, screening, open spaces, parking and loading areas, service areas, lighting and signs;
- C. That the use as proposed will comply with the applicable provisions of the Planning Code and will not adversely affect the General Plan.

### APPELLANT ISSUES AND PLANNING DEPARTMENT RESPONSES

The concerns raised in the Appeal Letter are cited in a summary below and are followed by the Department's response:

Issue 1: Concerns regarding traffic hazards related to this block. The Appellant contends that the 3700 block of Cesar Chavez Street is already unusually dangerous.

Response 1: The Commission addressed concerns related to traffic hazards and required that the Project Sponsor 1) develop an access plan; 2) utilize parking monitors; and 3) report back to the Commission after one year. Each of these requirements is described below. It is important to note that Section 209.3(e) of the Planning Code permits "as of right" a child-care facility providing less than 24-hour care for 14 or fewer children provided that licensed personnel operate the facility and that the property meets the open-space and other requirements of the State of California and other authorities. Gan Noe Preschool has been operating a preschool at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street, pursuant to the definition above, since 2005 without incident. Although the 3700 block of Cesar Chavez Street experiences more accidents involving moving vehicles than most residential blocks, none of the accidents have been attributed to the Gan Noe Preschool.

Cesar Chavez Street is the primary access street to Highway 101 from Noe Valley. There is a three-way signal light at both the east and west ends of the block. Recognizing that enrollment would increase from 22 to 42 children, the safety of the families that would attend Gan Noe Preschool was of primary concern when the Commission required three specific conditions.

- First, the Commission required the Project Sponsor to provide the Department with a pick-up
  and drop-off plan for safe access. The appellants have express an desire for a crossing guard for
  the intersection. The "pick-up and drop-off" plan could include a crossing guard as part of the
  plan.
- Second, the Commission required that a passenger loading zone with parking monitors be an integral part of the "pick-up and drop-off" plan. Since 2012, the Commission has approved six childcare/preschool facilities with a similar requirement, which is designed to ensure that children safely arrive at the facility and to reduce traffic. Previously the parking monitors were referred to as "crossing guards" although they served the same purpose, which was to monitor the required passenger loading area. None of the projects that were recently approved required a crossing guard at a particular intersection.
- Third, the Commission required that Department staff analyze the success of these safety
  measures and report back to the Commission after the Preschool has been operational for oneyear. The "report back" would give both the Commission and the public an opportunity to assess
  all aspects of how the facility is operating including public safety.

The statement that parents will pull into the drive and will back onto Cesar Chavez is not accurate. The Project Sponsor has agreed to provide a passenger loading zone in front of the subject properties to accommodate safe connections for parents and children. This passenger loading zone combined with the existing driveway curb cuts would accommodate three vehicles to unload at the same time, thus reducing the need for Gan Noe families to cross the street to access the facility.

The Commission found that the proposed use, when implemented with the Commission's required conditions, is necessary and desirable for the neighborhood because the presence of preschools in San Francisco helps to retain families in the city. At present, preschools are few and far between with

desirable preschools experiencing long wait lists for enrollment, which may discourage families from raising children within the city. Gan Noe is a unique preschool because it offers preschool services with Jewish values. Currently, the school reports rejecting dozens of children and that it has a waiting list due to lack of capacity. Similar preschools are located north of Market Street or on Brotherhood Way, leaving the heart of the city without such culturally-specific services. The proposed expansion would allow Gan Noe to better serve the neighborhoods of Noe Valley, Bernal Heights, Glen Park, and the Mission.

Issue 2: Concerns regarding alleged violations of law at this location. The Appellant contends that the operators of the proposed preschool have a track record of violating and disregarding the state law.

Response 2: The Planning Commission is not the proper venue for enforcement of CCLD laws and the child-care facility is in possession of a valid state license and would fully comply with the City's requirements with approval of this conditional use. The alleged violations are the purview of the Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) of the State Department of Social Services. These allegations were raised at the July 18, 2013 Conditional Use hearing. At the Commission hearing, Planning staff reported on previous conversations with CCLD staff in San Bruno, the agency responsible for licensing the subject facility. CCLD staff advised that most of the violations alleged by the appellant were normal infractions that could easily be remedied. Therefore, the CCLD had not revoked the license but was instead working with the operator to achieve compliance. It was only the continued operation of the small child-care facility after the licensee had vacated the premises that caused concern with CCLD staff. The Conditional Use authorization would allow the licensee to rectify this problem by changing the facility type to the larger facility, which does not require the licensee to live on-site. Securing the planning entitlements for the larger child-care facility would also resolve any outstanding Planning Code issues.

The Commission found that the majority of the alleged violations raised by Appellant were not within the jurisdiction of the Commission or the City, but rather were under the purview of the CCLD. The primary issue for the Commission raised by the allegations was the authorization to move from the smaller, home child-care facility to the larger child-care use type. As discussed above, the Commission found that the abandonment of the accessory home daycare/preschool facility and establishment of a preschool facility as a primary use was necessary and desirable and met all of the requirements for a conditional use authorization.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Both 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street are licensed as home daycares which requires that the licensee live on the premises. To meet this requirement, the owner of Gan Noe lived at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street and had a different licensee living at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street. When the licensee of 3781 Cesar Chavez Street left the facility unexpectedly, the Project Sponsor reported difficulty in trying to find a replacement licensee. As reported by the project sponsor, the fates of many Gan Noe families were left in the balance as the Project Sponsor evaded CCLD to avoid closure of the 3781 Cesar Chavez Street facility. It was around that time that the Project Sponsor submitted the subject project to the Planning Department for review.

Issue 3: Concerns that the Commission failed to exercise its discretion.

Response 3: The Commission addressed the issues raised related to safety and approved the application for a conditional use as necessary and desirable to address the critical shortage<sup>2</sup> of childcare facilities in San Francisco. The appellant contends that the Commission failed to exercise its discretion on this project because it failed to apply the same standards to similar projects.

The Commission has approved several childcare facilities over the past few years. Each facility was located in a different residential neighborhood possessing different physical constraints. The subject property is very different from the other locations: it is a more heavily trafficked street, the adjacent properties are key lots that are much more shorter than the average lot depth in the neighborhood, the project involves an existing facility that operates on two adjacent properties, and it involves a facility that is seeking to transition from a home facility to a day care/preschool facility. To address the unique location of the proposed facility the Commission exercised its discretion and imposed unique conditions upon the project to address the project's unique externalities, including traffic safety and noise abatement. With the application of these conditions, the Commission appropriately approved a project that will help address the critical shortage of childcare facilities in San Francisco and help make the City a more attractive option for families.

### CONCLUSION

For the reasons stated above, the Planning Department recommends that the Board uphold the Planning Commission's decision in approving the Conditional Use authorization for the expansion of Gan Noe Preschool and the establishment of the Chabad of Noe Valley religious facility at 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street and deny the appeal.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> The San Francisco Department of Children, Youth and Their Families reported in the May 2011 Community Needs Assessment Report Overview that, "Since 2005, the need for subsidized child care in San Francisco has more than doubled. In 2005, a total of 1,340 children were on the waiting list for subsidized care, compared to 3,558 in 2011. Service providers, in particular, expressed concern about the effect of state budget cuts on the future availability of subsidized care.

Many parents and service providers also commented on an acute need for child care services for infants and toddlers. As one parent stated, "Child care [is the greatest challenge faced by children and families], especially for children zero to three."

### PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project sponsor is seeking Conditional Use authorization pursuant to Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 to increase enrollment at an existing pre-school (d.b.a. Gan Noe Preschool) operating at 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street and establish a religious facility. Enrollment at the pre-school would increase from a combined enrollment of 22 children to 42 children and the project would result in the removal of the dwelling unit and the existing parking at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street. The proposal does not include any significant alteration or modification to the exteriors of the existing buildings with the exception of minor changes to signage and fencing. The space would also function as a religious facility when the preschool is not in session. The project also requires a parking variance as two parking spaces are required for the use and the existing parking space at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street would be removed. The subject property is located in RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District.

### SITE DESCRIPTION AND PRESENT USE

The Project Sites, 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street are adjacent properties (Assessor's Block 6577, Lots 030 and 045) located on the south side of Cesar Chavez Street, between Dolores and Guerrero Streets at the eastern boundary of the Noe Valley neighborhood. 3771 Cesar Chavez Street is developed with a one and a half story over basement single-family dwelling that was constructed circa 1898. The building is set back towards the rear of the lot with large enclosed landscaped yard at the front and two off-street, surface parking spaces at the front of the lot. The lot is flag shaped with a small yard located to the west of the building. Total building area is approximately 4,064 gross square-feet. A portion of the building is currently used as a preschool/home daycare for 14 children. The owners of the preschool also live at the property. 3781 Cesar Chavez Street is the adjacent property to the west of 3771 Cesar Chavez Street. In 2010, Gan Noe Preschool purchased 3781 Cesar Chavez Street and began operating a home daycare/preschool for 8 or fewer children at this location as well but under a different licensee. The two properties were licensed for a total of 22 children. In 2011, an enforcement case was opened on 3781 Cesar Chavez Street for the alleged operation of a childcare facility with more than 40 children operating without proper approvals. The Project Sponsor was notified of the enforcement case but it was never investigated by the Department and remains active. The Project Sponsor submitted a petition signed by 40 people who have no objections to the project and staff received 32 pieces of public correspondence in support of the project.

ADOPTING FINDINGS RELATING TO THE APPROVAL OF CONDITIONAL USE AUTHORIZATION PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 209.3(F), 209.3(J), 317, AND 303 OF THE PLANNING CODE TO INCREASE ENROLLMENT AT AN EXISTING PRE-SCHOOL (D.B.A. GAN NOE PRESCHOOL) OPERATING AT 3771 AND 3781 CESAR CHAVEZ STREET AND ESTABLISH A RELIGIOUS FACILITY. ENROLLMENT AT THE PRE-SCHOOL WOULD INCREASE FROM 22 CHILDREN TO 42 CHILDREN AND THE PROJECT WOULD RESULT IN THE REMOVAL OF THE DWELLING UNIT AT 3781 CESAR CHAVEZ STREET. THE SUBJECT PROPERTY IS LOCATED IN A RH-2 (RESIDENTIAL, HOUSE, TWO-FAMILY) DISTRICT AND A 40-X HEIGHT AND BULK DISTRICT.

### **PREAMBLE**

On March 8, 2013, Jeremy Paul of Quickdraw Permit Consulting, on behalf of Leah Potash (hereinafter "Project Sponsor") filed an application with the Planning Department (hereinafter "Department") for Conditional Use Authorization under Planning Code Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 to allow an increase in enrollment at a preschool (d.b.a. Gan Noe Preschool) and allow for an accessory religious facility within the preschool, located within a RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District.

On July 18, 2013, the San Francisco Planning Commission (hereinafter "Commission") conducted a duly noticed public hearing at a regularly scheduled meeting on Conditional Use Application No. 2013.0259C.

The Department determined the Project to be exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") as a Class 1 categorical exemption.

The Commission has heard and considered the testimony presented to it at the public hearing and has further considered written materials and oral testimony presented on behalf of the applicant, Department staff, and other interested parties.

MOVED, that the Commission hereby authorizes the Conditional Use requested in Application No. 2013.0259C, subject to the conditions contained in "EXHIBIT A" of this motion, based on the following findings:

#### **FINDINGS**

Having reviewed the materials identified in the preamble above, and having heard all testimony and arguments, this Commission finds, concludes, and determines as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are accurate and constitute findings of this Commission.
- 2. Site Description and Present Use. The building is set back towards the rear of the lot with large enclosed landscaped yard at the front and two off-street, surface parking spaces at the front of the lot. The lot is flag shaped with a small yard located to the west of the building. Total building area is approximately 4,064 gross square-feet. A portion of the building is currently used as a preschool/home daycare that is licensed for 14 children. - 3. Surrounding Properties and Neighborhood. The immediate neighborhood is primarily residential, however, there are two churches and a large surface parking lot located on the north side of the street. There is a three-way signal light at both the east and west ends of the block. The adjacent properties to the west of the project sites are key lots that are much shorter than the average lot within this neighborhood. As a result of the smaller lots these properties also have smaller rear yards.

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- 4. Project Description. The Project Sponsor also operated a preschool within a single-family dwelling at 107 Justin Drive in Bernal Heights at the same time she was operating a preschool at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street. Conditional use authorization was sought for this location to expand its enrollment to 19 children but the application was cancelled in 2009 and the preschool was closed in 2010.

- 6. Public Comment. The Department received correspondence in opposition to the project from 20 neighbors including adjacent neighbors Richard and Ashley Rochman and Bill Sommer. These neighbors are concerned about parking and traffic, pedestrian safety, noise, driveway blockage related to the project.
  - The Project Sponsor submitted a petition signed by 34 people who have no objections to the project and staff received 32 pieces of public correspondence in support of the project including a letter of support from the Upper Noe Neighbors neighborhood group.
- 7. Planning Code Compliance: The Commission finds that the Project is consistent with the relevant provisions of the Planning Code in the following manner:
  - A. Institutions Child-Care Facility. Planning Code Section 209.3(f) requires Conditional Use authorization for child-care facilities providing less than 24 hour care for 15 or more children by licensed personnel and meeting the open space and other requirements of the State of California within the RH-2 Zoning District.

The Project Sponsor seeks Conditional Use authorization to establish a child-care facility providing less than 24-hour care for 15 or more and up to a maximum of 42 children within the RH-2 Zoning District.

B. Institutions – Religious Facility. Planning Code Section 209.3(j) requires Conditional Use authorization for a church or religious facility which has a tax-exempt status as a religious institution granted by the United States Government, and which institution is used primarily for collective worship or ritual or observance of common religious beliefs within the RH-2 Zoning District.

The Project Sponsor seeks Conditional Use authorization to establish a religious facility. The facility would operate a number of weekly programs with 12 or fewer attendees at any given time. Weekly events include: Saturday morning services, Wednesday night Torah, Bar and Bat Mitzvah lessons and tutoring, and weekly Hebrew classes. Large gatherings would include Rosh Hashana (Fall), Yom Kippur (Fall), Purim Party (Spring), and Passover dinner (Spring).

C. Off-Street Parking. Planning Code Section 151 requires one off-street parking space for each 25 children to be accommodated at any one time, where the number of such children exceeds 24.

The proposed child-care facility for a maximum of 42 children would be required to provide a minimum of two off-street parking spaces for the use, pursuant to Planning Code Sections 151 and 153. The Project would not include any required off-street parking space, which would be subject to an off-street parking variance. The Project Sponsor has submitted a Variance Application No. 2013.0259CV. The Zoning Administrator will hold a public hearing on Variance Application while the Planning Commission will consider Conditional Use Application.

D. Loss of Dwellings through Conversion. Conversion of Residential Units shall be prohibited, unless the Planning Commission approves the conversion at a public hearing.

The Planning Commission shall consider these criteria in the review of applications for Conversation of Residential Units;

(i) Whether conversion of the unit(s) would eliminate only owner occupied housing, and if so, for how long the unit(s) proposed to be removed were owner occupied;

The dwelling to be converted at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street is not owner occupied. The owners of 3781 purchased the property in 2010 and live next door at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street.

(ii) Whether conversation of the unit(s) would provide desirable new non-residential use(s) appropriate for the neighborhood and adjoining district(s);

The conversion of the dwelling unit at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street would support an existing preschool use. Desirable preschools are important in retaining young families in San

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Francisco and those that exist often have long waiting lists for open spaces which is often discouraging. The proposed preschool would serve families that want a preschool that favors Jewish values. There are few preschools in San Francisco that offer similar services and those that do offer it are located outside the neighborhoods that Gan Noe Preschool is trying to service. Therefore, the conversion would provide a desirable new non-residential use.

(iii) Whether conversation of the unit(s) will bring the building closer into conformance with the prevailing character of its immediate area and in the same zoning district;

The immediate neighborhood is within a RH District. Though there are two religious facilities located on the north side of Cesar Chavez Street however, the immediate neighborhood is primarily residential. Therefore, the conversion will not bring the property into closer conformance with the prevailing character.

(iv) Whether conversion of the unit(s) will be detrimental to the City's housing stock;

The conversion of the dwelling unit would be detrimental to the City's housing stock because it would result in the loss of a habitable dwelling unit.

(v) Whether conversion of the unit(s) is necessary to eliminate design, functional, or habitability deficiencies that cannot otherwise be corrected.

The existing dwelling unit is approximately 990 square-feet and contains one-bedroom and one bath. Other than being relatively small, the dwelling has no known design, functional, or habitable deficiencies.

Preschool/child care services are difficult to find in the City and those that operate often have long waiting lists. The ability of the City to provide these services will help its ability to attract and retain families in the City. Housing is also a scarce resource in the City. On balance, the need to help preschool/childcare services flourish in the City outweigh the benefit of retaining the existing dwelling unit.

- 8. Planning Code Section 303 establishes criteria for the Planning Commission to consider when reviewing applications for Conditional Use approval. On balance, the project does comply with said criteria in that:
  - A. The proposed new uses and building, at the size and intensity contemplated and at the proposed location, will provide a development that is necessary or desirable, and compatible with, the neighborhood or the community.

The Project would retain the existing buildings on the site and their present configuration. The proposed use is necessary and desirable for the neighborhood because the presence of preschools in San Francisco helps to retain families in the city. At present, preschools are few and far between with desirable preschools experiencing long wait lists for open spaces which discourages some families from attempting to raise their children within the city. Gan Noe is a unique preschool because it offers

preschool services with Jewish values. Every year the school must reject dozens of requests for placement from families due to lack of capacity. Similar preschools are located north of Market Street or on Brotherhood Way, leaving the heart of the city without such services. The proposed expansion would allow Gan Noe to better serve the neighborhoods of Noe Valley, Bernal Heights, Glen Park, and the Mission

Activities related to the proposed religious facility would take place after preschool hours within the same space and according the Sponsor would involve no more than 12 people at a time.

- B. The proposed project will not be detrimental to the health, safety, convenience or general welfare of persons residing or working in the vicinity. There are no features of the project be detrimental to the health, safety or convenience of those residing or working in the area, in that:
  - i. Nature of proposed site, including its size and shape, and the proposed size, shape and arrangement of structures;

The Project would not alter the existing site configuration of the buildings on the site. The children's play area would be located within the rear yard where it is currently located. Neighbors to the west of the subject property who share the same mid-block have expressed concerns about potential noise impacts from the additional children. In response, the Project Sponsor has stated that outdoor playtime will be staggered such that all children would never be in the play area at the same time. By law, the younger children cannot be within the play area at the same time as the older children.

ii. The accessibility and traffic patterns for persons and vehicles, the type and volume of such traffic, and the adequacy of proposed off-street parking and loading;

The Subject Property is in an established residential neighborhood that is well served by public transit, including 24th Street and the J-Church Muni Metro Line and J-Streetcar within two blocks of the Subject Property. Additionally, the proposed preschool facility is intended to meet the needs of the residents in the immediate neighborhood and should not generate significant amounts of vehicular trips citywide.

The Planning Code requires two off-street parking spaces for the proposed facility; however, the sponsor is seeking a variance from this requirement and would remove the existing garage parking space at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street. The project site is located on a street that is the primary arterial to and from Highway 101. Furthermore, there are signaled intersections at the east and west ends of the block. These factors often lead to traffic congestion within the subject block during commute hours. Neighbors have expressed concern that the proposed increase in enrollment would exacerbate the traffic situation within the block and that current parents park on sidewalks and block adjacent driveways during drop off. In response, the Project Sponsor has The Project Sponsor has agreed to apply for a white passenger loading zone, accommodating two parking spaces, on Sanchez Street in front of the facility's entrance and has agreed to institute a

staggered pick up and drop off that is supervised by staff to reduce traffic congestion during commute hours.

No additional off-street parking is required for the proposed religious facility. Programs related to the facility would include weekly Saturday morning services, weekly Wednesday night Torah study, Bar and Bat Mitzvah lessons and tutoring, and weekly Hebrew classes. Larger religious gatherings include Rosh Hashana (Sept.), Yom Kippur (Sept.), Purim Party (March), and Passover Dinner (April). Many attendees do not drive on the Sabbath or Jewish holidays in accordance with strict Jewish Law which reduces vehicular traffic.

iii. The safeguards afforded to prevent noxious or offensive emissions such as noise, glare, dust and odor;

The project would not emit noxious or offensive emissions such noise, glare, dust or odor.

iv. Treatment given, as appropriate, to such aspects as landscaping, screening, open spaces, parking and loading areas, service areas, lighting and signs;

No additional landscaping is proposed for the site. The Department shall review all lighting and signs proposed for the property in accordance with the Conditions of Approval contained in Exhibit A.

C. That the use as proposed will comply with the applicable provisions of the Planning Code and will not adversely affect the General Plan.

The Project complies with all relevant requirements and standards of the Planning Code and is consistent with objectives and policies of the General Plan as detailed below.

9. **General Plan Compliance.** The Project is, on balance, consistent with the following Objectives and Policies of the General Plan:

#### COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY ELEMENT

#### **OBJECTIVE 1:**

MANAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH AND CHANGE TO ENSURE ENHANCEMENT OF THE TOTAL CITY LIVING AND WORKING ENVIRONMENT.

#### Policy 1.1:

Encourage development which provides substantial net benefits and minimizes undesirable consequences. Discourage development that has substantial undesirable consequences that cannot be mitigated.

The Project would enhance the living and working environment in the City by providing a unique needed preschool service for residents and workers within the Noe Valley, Bernal Height, Glen Park, and Mission

neighborhoods. The Project would also need to comply with State licensing requirements for childcare/preschool facilities further minimizing possible undesirable consequences from such a use.

#### **OBJECTIVE 2:**

MAINTAIN AND ENHANCE A SOUND AND DIVERSE ECONOMIC BASE AND FISCAL STRUCTURE FOR THE CITY.

#### Policy 2.1:

Seek to retain existing commercial and industrial activity and to attract new such activity to the City.

#### Policy 3:

Maintain a favorable social cultural climate in the city in order to enhance its attractiveness as a firm location.

The Project will enhance an existing preschool facility that has served the surrounding community since 2005 by extending it services to a greater number of people.

#### **OBJECTIVE 3:**

PROVIDE EXPANDED EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR CITY RESIDENTS, PARTICULARLY THE UNEMPLOYED AND ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED.

#### Policy 3.1:

Promote the attraction, retention and expansion of commercial and industrial firms which provide employment improvement opportunities for unskilled and semi-skilled workers.

The Project will provide employment opportunities for nine semi-skilled San Francisco residents.

#### **GOVERNMENT, HEALTH AND EDUCATION SERVICES**

#### Objectives and Policies

#### **OBJECTIVE 7:**

ENHANCE SAN FRANCISCO'S POSITION AS A NATIONAL AND REGINAL CENTER FOR GOVERNMENT, HEALTH, AND EDUCATIONAL SERVICES.

#### Policy 7.2:

Encourage the extension of needed health and educational services, but manage expansion to avoid or minimize disruption of adjacent residential areas.

The proposed child-care facility will offer educational services to pre-school children of San Francisco residents. No exterior alteration will be proposed to the existing buildings. The proposed child-care facility's activities will take place either indoors or within the rear yard. The proposed conditions of approval would help reduce affects on parking and traffic within the neighborhood and ease noise levels during hours of operation.

- 10. Planning Code Section 101.1(b) establishes eight priority-planning policies and requires review of permits for consistency with said policies. On balance, the project does comply with said policies in that:
  - A. That existing neighborhood-serving retail uses be preserved and enhanced and future opportunities for resident employment in and ownership of such businesses be enhanced.
    - The proposal would strengthen an existing neighborhood-serving use that has served the neighborhood since 2005 and provide employment for up to nine people.
  - B. That existing housing and neighborhood character be conserved and protected in order to preserve the cultural and economic diversity of our neighborhoods.
    - The proposed use will retain the existing buildings on the site and the interior alterations to 3781 Cesar Chavez Street are such that they could be easily reversed and the property converted back to residential use.
  - C. That the City's supply of affordable housing be preserved and enhanced,
    - The Project would not affect the City's existing supply of affordable housing.
  - D. That commuter traffic not impede MUNI transit service or overburden our streets or neighborhood parking.
    - The proposed use is well served by public transit but it is located a few blocks away. The proposed preschool is not expected to be a destination use that attracts families from outside the immediate neighborhoods. The Sponsor has agreed to seek a passenger loading space in front of the property and implement a pick up and drop off program for families that choose to drive. The loading zone and the program have been included as conditions of approval for the Project.
  - E. That a diverse economic base be maintained by protecting our industrial and service sectors from displacement due to commercial office development, and that future opportunities for resident employment and ownership in these sectors be enhanced.
    - The Project will not displace any service or industry establishment. The project will not affect industrial or service sector uses or related employment opportunities. Ownership of industrial or service sector businesses will not be affected by this project.
  - F. That the City achieves the greatest possible preparedness to protect against injury and loss of life in an earthquake.
    - The Project will not affect the Subject Property's ability to withstand an earthquake.
  - G. That landmarks and historic buildings be preserved.

The Project would not alter the exterior appearance of the buildings in question.

H. That our parks and open space and their access to sunlight and vistas be protected from development.

The project will have no negative affect on existing parks and open spaces.

- 11. The Project is consistent with and would promote the general and specific purposes of the Code provided under Section 101.1(b) in that, as designed, the Project would contribute to the character and stability of the neighborhood and would constitute a beneficial development.
- 12. The Commission hereby finds that approval of the Conditional Use authorization would promote the health, safety and welfare of the City.

That based upon the Record, the submissions by the Applicant, the staff of the Department and other interested parties, the oral testimony presented to this Commission at the public hearings, and all other written materials submitted by all parties, the Commission hereby APPROVES Conditional Use Application No. 2013.0259CV pursuant to Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 of the Planning Code subject to the following conditions attached hereto as "EXHIBIT A" in general conformance with plans on file, received XXXX, XXXX, and stamped "EXHIBIT B", which is incorporated herein by reference as though fully set forth.

Gan Noe Preschool) from 22 to 42 children and establish a religious facility (d.b.a Chabad of Noe Valley) for the properties at 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street, Block 6577, Lots 030 and 045, pursuant to Planning Code Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 within a RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District; in general conformance with plans stamped "EXHIBIT B" included in the docket for Case No. 2013.0259CV and subject to conditions of approval reviewed and approved by the Commission on July 18, 2013 under Motion No XXXXX. This authorization and the conditions contained herein run with the property and not with a particular Project Sponsor, business, or operator.

#### RECORDATION OF CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Prior to the issuance of the building permit or commencement of use for the Project the Zoning Administrator shall approve and order the recordation of a Notice in the Official Records of the Recorder of the City and County of San Francisco for the subject property. This Notice shall state that the project is subject to the conditions of approval contained herein and reviewed and approved by the Planning Commission on July 18, 2013 under Motion No XXXXX.

#### PRINTING OF CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL ON PLANS

The conditions of approval under the 'Exhibit A' of this Planning Commission Motion No. XXXXX shall be reproduced on the Index Sheet of construction plans submitted with the Site or Building permit application for the Project. The Index Sheet of the construction plans shall reference to the Conditional Use authorization and any subsequent amendments or modifications.

#### **SEVERABILITY**

The Project shall comply with all applicable City codes and requirements. If any clause, sentence, section or any part of these conditions of approval is for any reason held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect or impair other remaining clauses, sentences, or sections of these conditions. Once a site or building permit has been issued, construction must commence within the timeframe required by the Department of Building Inspection and be continued diligently to completion. The Commission may also consider revoking the approvals if a permit for the Project has been issued but is allowed to expire and more than three (3) years have passed since the Motion was approved.

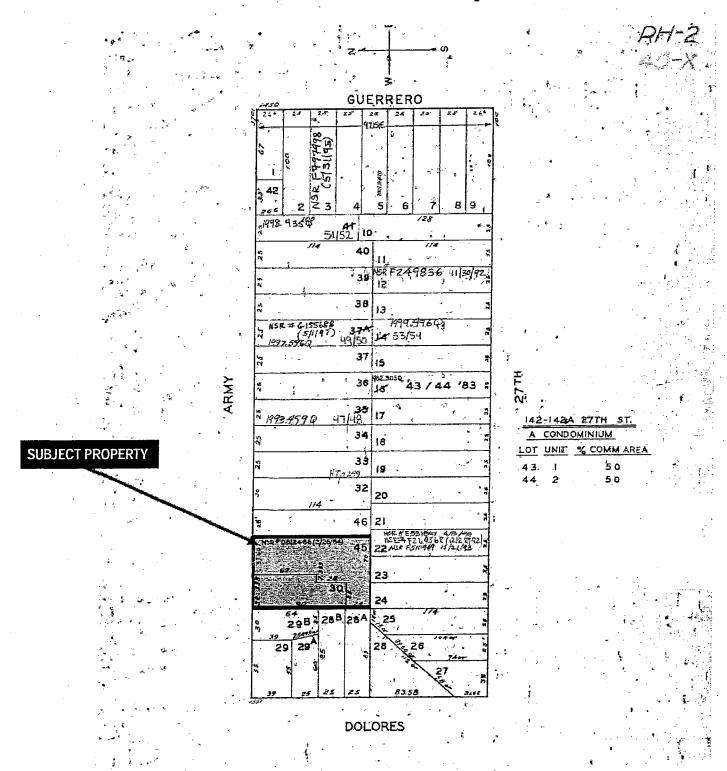

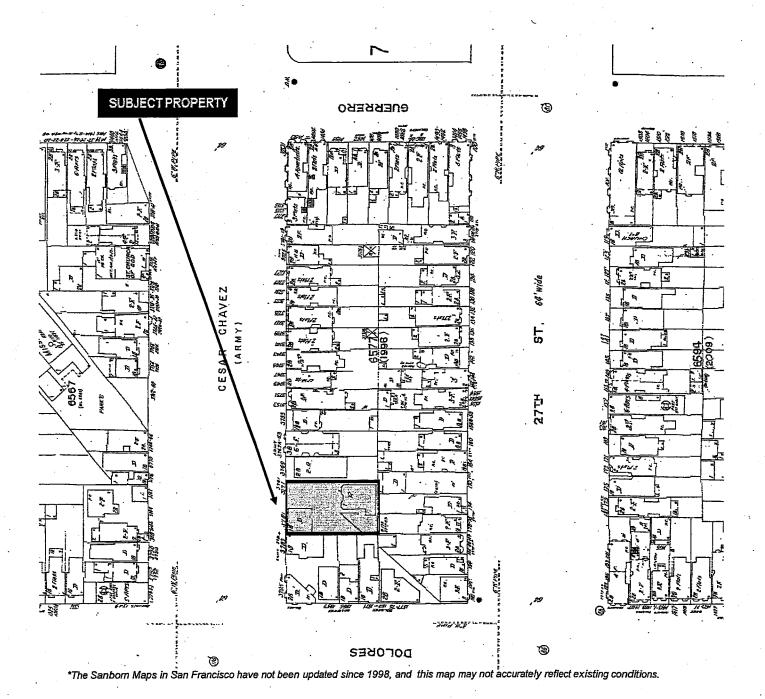

## Parcel Map





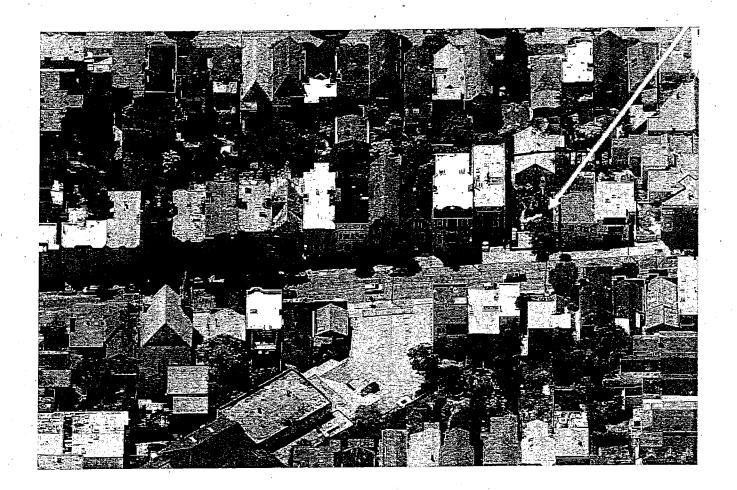

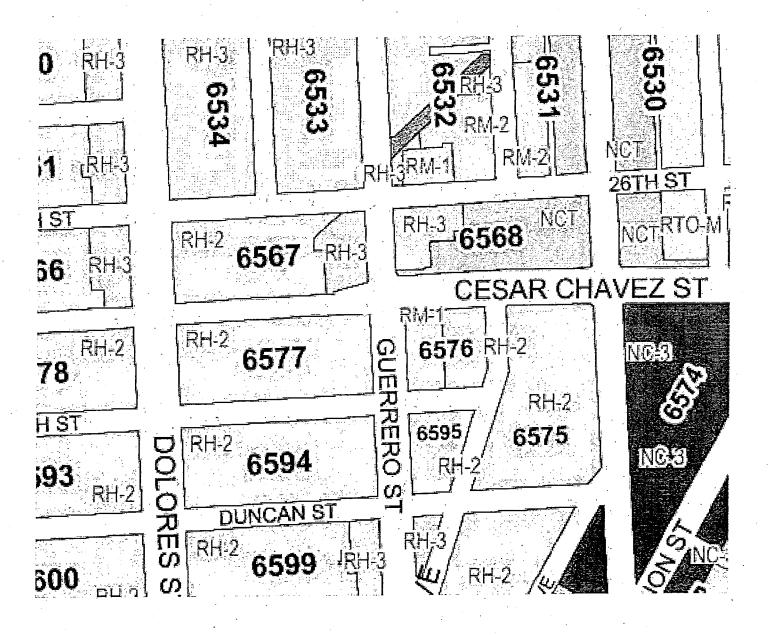

I hope this letter finds you all well and in good spirits.

I am writing to you as the spiritual leader at Chabad of Noe Valley & Gan Noe Preschool and the sponsor of this Conditional Use Permit request.

At the age of 21 and 24 respectively my wife Leah and I with our 6 month old daughter made a life time commitment to serve the needs of the thousands of Jews living in the Noe Valley, Glen Park, Castro, Diamond Heights, Bernal Heights and Mission neighborhoods.

Following the inspiration and teachings of the late Lubavitcher Rebbe, Rabbi Menachem Schneerson who encouraged young couples to become active members of society establishing Jewish centers and welcoming all in an embracing manner knowing that every human being possesses an inherent divine spark.

Dear President Fong and Honorable Commissioners,

I write to you today to explain why it is of utmost importance that Gan Noe Preschool moves away from the "Home Daycare" model and be approved to increase its capacity to 42 children and operate as a preschool.

I have been involved in early childhood education for over 15 years. I have served as the director of Gan Noe since it opened 8 years ago and I pride myself on the quality of the program. In many areas we have exceeded the home daycare licensing requirements to ensure our program runs professionally and matches the quality young San Francisco families seek. A few examples are:

- \*Though licensing does not require early childhood education to run a daycare, I spent 2 years studying child development and I became a qualified Preschool Director in 2007.
- Though licensing does not require daycare providers to have early childhood education, every teacher I hire is either licensed by the state of CA as a Preschool Teacher or is in the process.
- Though ilcensing requires a ratio of 1 to 61 have always maintained of ration of 1 to 4
- Though licensing does not require continued learning, together with my teachers I continue to expand my early childhood education yearly at the Bing Institute at Stanford University.

Until now, we have been a licensed home daycare with a capacity of 14 children in my home. I have been the director, a teacher, the shopper, the janitor and the program planner.

This model is not sustainable for someone who has a family, as time and financial resources are far too limiting to operate in this way.

In addition, parents are looking for a program that can accommodate all of their preschool years to avoid unnecessary transitions for the child.

A home daycare with 14 children is unable to meet that basic need.

To continue to operate and provide this much needed service in the city, it is imperative that we gain Conditional Use Authorization to allow our capacity be increased to 42 children. Having 42 children will allow us to:

- . •Offer families their complete preschool need from diapers until kindergarten
- •Hire a full time administrator
- Maintain quality teachers with the ability to pay a salary that allows them to live in the city
- ·Hire a traffic monitor for drop-off and pickup times

I work tirelessly to provide a service that benefits this city and enables families to stay in the city. Many have told us, if not for our program, they would have long moved out of San Francisco. The city lacks quality preschools and it is imperative that quality programing be encouraged to expand in order to keep more families in this wonderful city.

It is my sincere hope that you will support our efforts by approving the CUP for us to serve 42 children, and together we will continue to make this city a better place to raise a family.

#### DESCRIPTION OF AUTHORIZATION SOUGHT:

**CONDITIONAL USE SOUGHT:** Gan Noe Preschool proposes to expand their existing Family Daycare and provide services for up to 42 children from infancy to five years of age. Chabad of Noe Valley proposes to serve as a religious institution for the Jewish community of the Mission, Glen Park, the Castro, Bernal and Noe Valley.

This proposal does not include significant alteration or modification of the existing buildings on site, and only proposes minor signage and changes to fencing and sound barrier materials.

The proposed preschool use is defined under <u>Institutions</u> in section 209.3(f) of the San Francisco Planning Code, and is a Conditional Use in the subject zoning district. Chabad of Noe Valley is a religious institution under section 209.3(j).

Pursuant to Planning Code Section 303[c] before approving a conditional use authorization, The Planning Commission needs to find that the facts presented are such to establish the findings stated below.

- (1) The proposed use or feature, at the size and intensity contemplated and that the proposed location will provide a development that is necessary or desirable or compatible with the neighborhood or the community
  - i. Gan Noe Preschool is situated at the hub of three vibrant San Francisco neighborhoods that have experienced significant increases in family populations in recent years. The difficulty of finding quality child care has been a major reason for working families to leave San Francisco. Every year Gan Noe must reject dozens of requests for placement due to lack of capacity under their state licensing provisions. This Conditional Use Authorization will allow Gan Noe to better serve the needs of the Mission, Noe Valley and Glen Park neighborhoods.
  - ii. Chabad of Noe Valley Inc. is a federally recognized 501.c.3 religious nonprofit institution. Chabad of Noe Valley serves the Jewish community of this

district with a number of small programs with 12 or less participant at any time:

- After school Hebrew classes,
- Bar Mitzvah training,
- Adult study
- Small religious gatherings on a weekly basis.

On particular annual holidays larger gatherings are hosted for religious observances and celebration. These are:

- Rosh Hashana (Sept.)
- Yom Kippur (Sept.)
- Purim (March)
- Passover Dinner (April)

Most people in the Chabad community do not drive on the Sabbath or Jewish holidays in accordance with orthodox Jewish Law. Many walk to events as they choose to reside close to the place they participate in religious practice.

- (2) That such use or feature as proposed will not be detrimental to the health, safety, convenience or general welfare of persons residing or working in the vicinity, or injurious to property, improvements or potential development in the vicinity, with respect to aspects including but not limited to the following:
  - (a) The nature of the proposed site, including its size and shape, and the proposed size, shape and arrangement of structures;
    - i. The height and bulk of the existing buildings will remain the same and this project will not significantly alter the appearance or character of the buildings or the vicinity. The two parcels have considerable open space between them and allow proper age segregation of play areas and ample interior classroom space, and gathering place for worship and study.
  - (b) The accessibility and traffic patterns for persons and vehicles, the type and volume of such traffic, and the adequacy of proposed off-street parking and loading;
    - ii. This location is conveniently accessible by foot, bicycle, Muni, school van, and private automobile from the Mission District, Noe Valley, Glen Park and beyond. The Gan Noe community currently makes use of all of these options. The Planning Code does not require parking or loading for the proposed use; however there is sufficient street parking and loading in front of 3771 and 3781 to allow pickup and drop-off. Gan Noe Preschool will institue a supervised pickup and drop-off system to facilitate child retrieval without creating unnecessary burdens on street traffic during peak hours.
    - iii. Most people in the Chabad community do not drive on the Sabbath or Jewish holidays in accordance with orthodox Jewish Law. Many walk to

events as they choose to reside close to the place they participate in religious practice. The daily observances and learning opportunities at Chabad of Noe are intended for small groups only, rarely exceeding 12 participants thus there is no observable increase in volume of street traffic

or burden on offstreet parking as a result of the religious institution at the subject property.

- (c)The safeguards afforded to prevent noxious or offensive emissions such as noise, glare, dust and odor;
  - iv. The Project will not create any noxious or offensive emissions, such as glare, dust or odor. Gan Noe is working closely with our neighbors to fully manage the sound impacts associated with happy children at play. Gan Noe has retained the services of the CM Salter acoustical engineering firm and is working with our neighbors to mitigate noise problems.
  - v. The religious institution will not create any noxious or offensive emissions.
- (d)Treatment given, as appropriate, to such aspects as landscaping, screening, open spaces, parking and loading areas, service areas, lighting and signs;
  - vi. No changes visible from the street are proposed to such aspects as landscaping and screening, and we will obtain the necessary building permits for any new business signs.
- (3) That such use or feature as proposed will comply with the applicable provisions of this Code and will not adversely affect the Master Plan.

Under the provisions of Code Section 303, the Commission may authorize a Conditional Use after finding that the proposed use will provide a development that is necessary or desirable for and compatible with the neighborhood or the community; that such use will not be detrimental to the health, safety, welfare, convenience or general welfare of persons residing or working in the vicinity; and that such use will not adversely affect the General Plan.

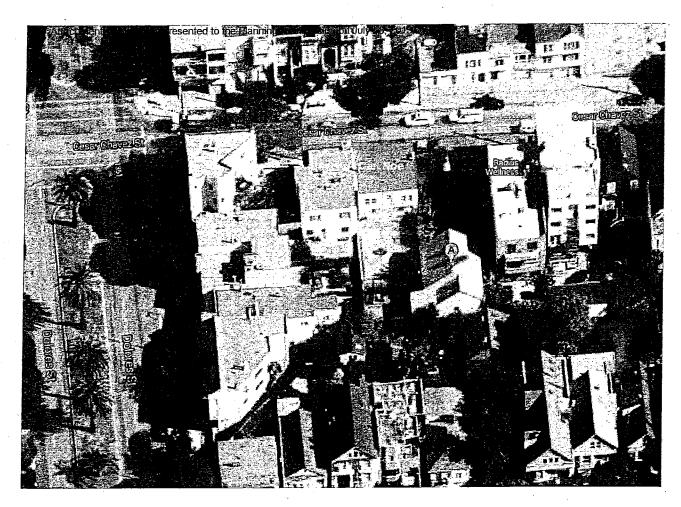
The Project complies with the criteria of Section 303 of the Code in that:

The Project will be compatible and in keeping with the character of the neighborhood because it will not involve any exterior changes to the building, and it will provide a desirable and necessary community service.

City Planning Code Section 101.1 establishes eight priority planning policies and requires review of permits for consistency with said policies. The project is consistent with the said policies, in that:

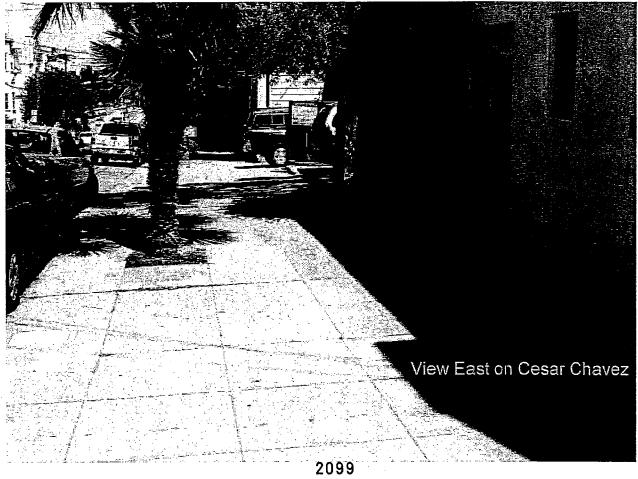
- 1. The Project will provide a service to the neighborhood by providing employment opportunities for neighborhood residents at all skill and experience levels. The preschool employs 9 teachers and support staff and prefers to hire from within the district. After the expansion there will be 13 employees. Chabad of Noe Valley employs 1.
- 2. The Project will not change the existing housing and neighborhood character; one residential dwelling unit will remain at the adjacent site serving the director of the Gan Noe Preschool, Mrs. Leah Potash and the sole employee of Chabad Noe Valley, Rabbi Gedalia Potash.
- The Project will be beneficial to the supply of affordable housing as child care for working families is necessary for district housing to be truly affordable.
  - It is necessary for observant religious Jews to walk to and from the place of worship every week on the Sabbath providing a place for said worship in a highly residential district is an important asset to the affordability of that district for observant religious people of the Jewish faith.
- 4. The Project will not significantly impact traffic or create a higher demand for parking spaces than the permitted alternative uses on the site. Gan Noe Preschool is developing an effective traffic management system for peak pickup and drop-off hours at it's increased enrollment.
- 5. The Project will not displace or alter any elements of the City's industrial or service sectors.
- 6. Earthquake safety requirements will be considered during review of building permit applications.
- 7. The Project will have no adverse impact on landmarks or historic buildings
- 8. The Project will have no adverse impact on parks or open space, or their access to sunlight or vistas.

The project is consistent with and would promote the general and specific purposes of the Code provided under Section 101.1 in that, as designed, the project would contribute to the character and stability of the neighborhood and would constitute a beneficial use providing a necessary service in a vibrant family oriented neighborhood.



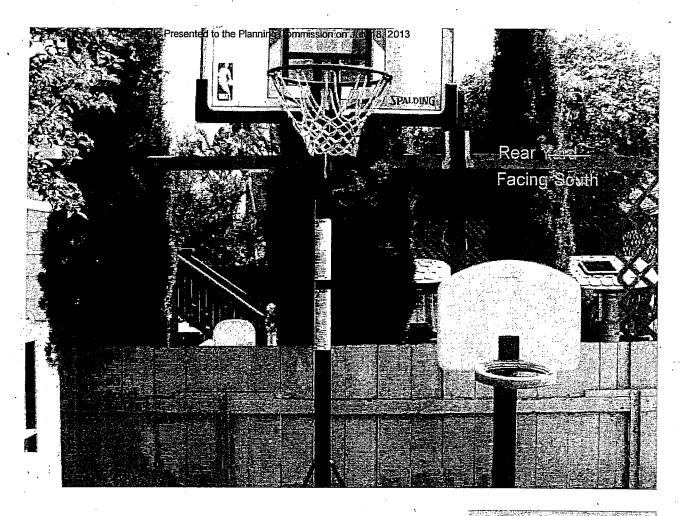


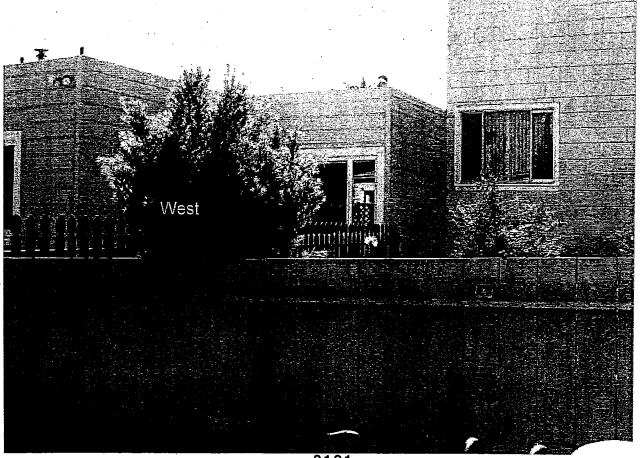




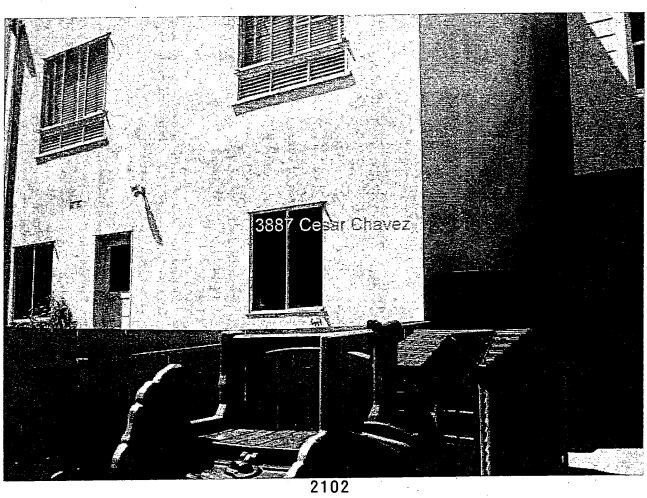


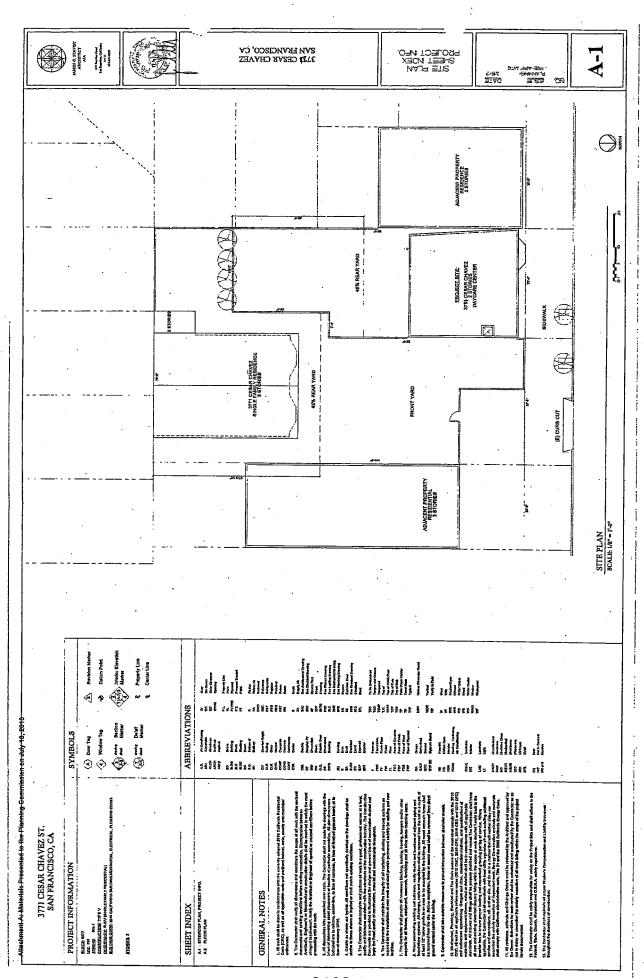


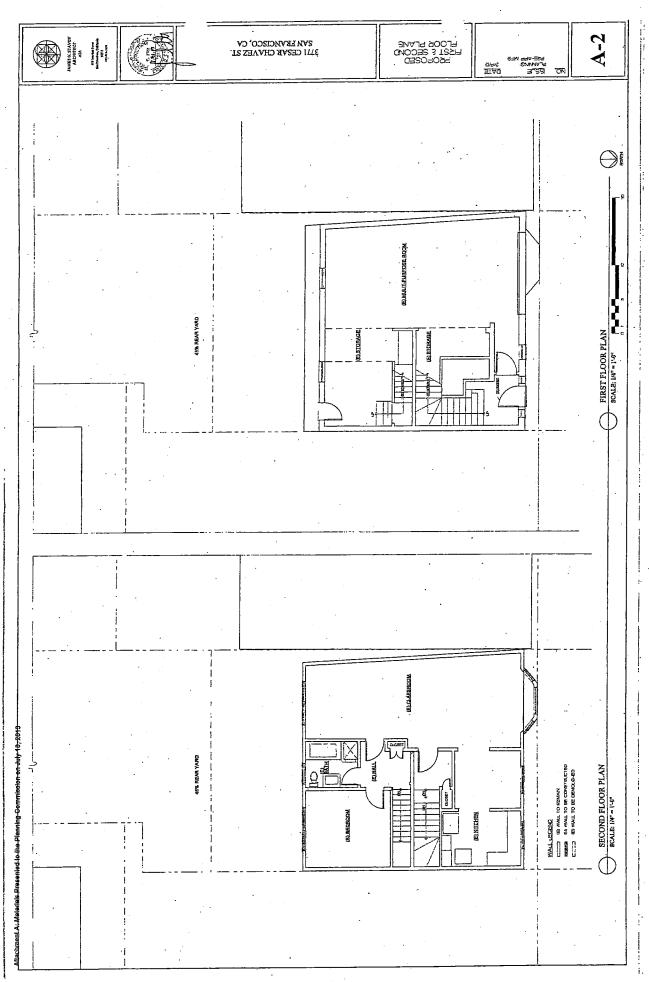


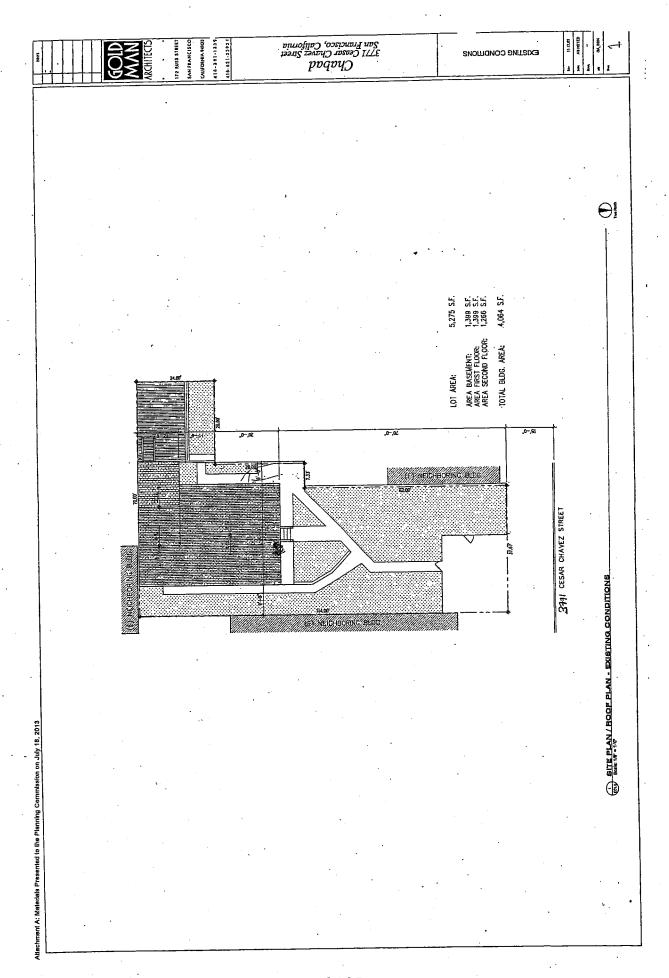


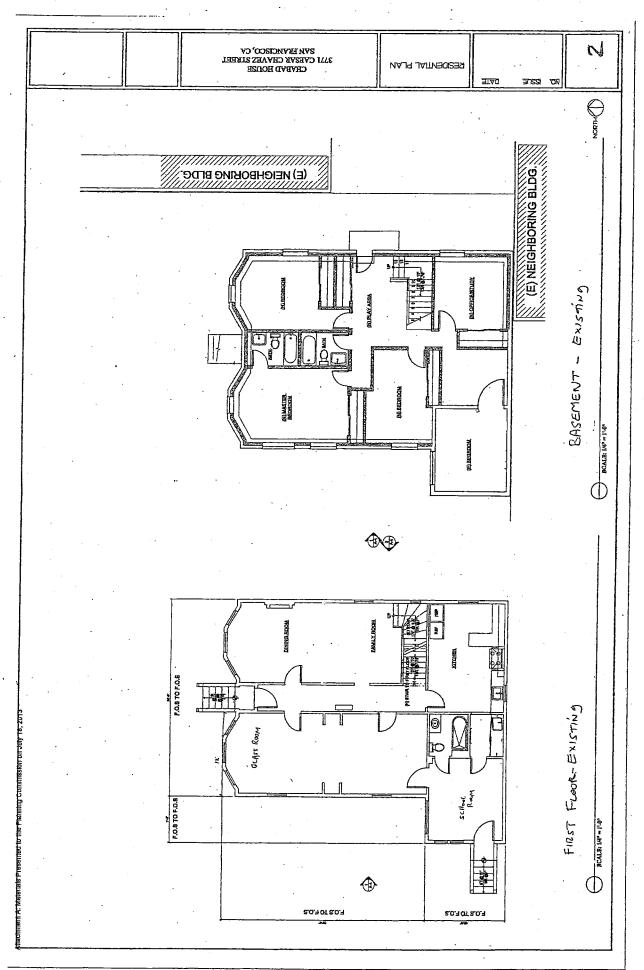


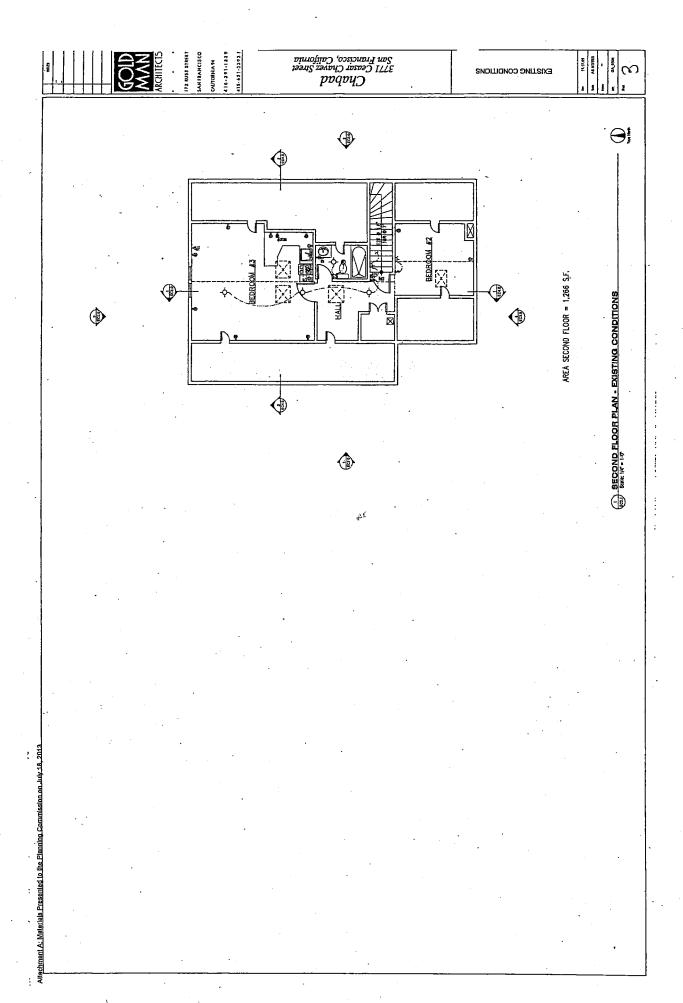

ADOPTING FINDINGS RELATING TO THE APPROVAL OF CONDITIONAL USE AUTHORIZATION PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 209.3(F), 209.3(J), 317, AND 303 OF THE PLANNING CODE TO INCREASE ENROLLMENT AT AN EXISTING PRE-SCHOOL (D.B.A. GAN NOE PRESCHOOL) OPERATING AT 3771 AND 3781 CESAR CHAVEZ STREET AND ESTABLISH A RELIGIOUS FACILITY. ENROLLMENT AT THE PRE-SCHOOL WOULD INCREASE FROM 22 CHILDREN TO 42 CHILDREN AND THE PROJECT WOULD RESULT IN THE REMOVAL OF THE DWELLING UNIT AT 3781 CESAR CHAVEZ STREET. THE SUBJECT PROPERTY IS LOCATED IN A RH-2 (RESIDENTIAL, HOUSE, TWO-FAMILY) DISTRICT AND A 40-X HEIGHT AND BULK DISTRICT.

#### **PREAMBLE**

On March 8, 2013, Jeremy Paul of Quickdraw Permit Consulting, on behalf of Leah Potash (hereinafter "Project Sponsor") filed an application with the Planning Department (hereinafter "Department") for Conditional Use Authorization under Planning Code Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 to allow an increase in enrollment at a preschool (d.b.a. Gan Noe Preschool) and allow for an accessory religious facility within the preschool, located within a RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District.

#### CASE NO. 2013.0259C 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street

On July 18, 2013, the San Francisco Planning Commission (hereinafter "Commission") conducted a duly noticed public hearing at a regularly scheduled meeting on Conditional Use Application No. 2013.0259C.

The Department determined the Project to be exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") as a Class 1 categorical exemption.

The Commission has heard and considered the testimony presented to it at the public hearing and has further considered written materials and oral testimony presented on behalf of the applicant, Department staff, and other interested parties.

MOVED, that the Commission hereby authorizes the Conditional Use requested in Application No. 2013.0259C, subject to the conditions contained in "EXHIBIT A" of this motion, based on the following findings:

#### **FINDINGS**

Having reviewed the materials identified in the preamble above, and having heard all testimony and arguments, this Commission finds, concludes, and determines as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are accurate and constitute findings of this Commission.
- 2. Site Description and Present Use. The Project Sites, 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chvez Street are adjacent properties (Assessor's Block 6577, Lots 030 and 045) located on the south side of Cesar Chavez Street, between Dolores and Guerrero Streets at the eastern boundary of the Noe Valley neighborhood. 3771 Cesar Chavez Street is developed with a one and a half story over basement single-family dwelling that was constructed circa 1898. The building is set back towards the rear of the lot with large enclosed landscaped yard at the front and two off-street, surface parking spaces at the front of the lot. The lot is flag shaped with a small yard located to the west of the building. Total building area is approximately 4,064 gross square-feet. A portion of the building is currently used as a preschool/home daycare that is licensed for 14 children. The owners of the preschool also live at the property. 3781 Cesar Chavez Street is the adjacent property to the west of 3771 Cesar Chavez Street. The property is developed with a one-story over garage, single-family dwelling that was constructed in 1942. The property is also used as a preschool/home daycare that is licensed for 8 children. The rear yard is the primary children's play area.
- 3. Surrounding Properties and Neighborhood. The Project sites are located on the south side of the two-lane portion of Cesar Chavez Street which serves as the primary arterial for access to the 101 Freeway from Noe Valley. The immediate neighborhood is primarily residential, however, there are two churches and a large surface parking lot located on the north side of the street. There is a three-way signal light at both the east and west ends of the block. The adjacent properties to the west of the project sites are key lots that are much shorter than the average lot within this neighborhood. As a result of the smaller lots these properties also have smaller rear yards.

- 4. Project Description. The project sponsor is seeking Conditional Use authorization pursuant to Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 to increase enrollment at an existing pre-school (d.b.a. Gan Noe Preschool) operating at 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street and establish a religious facility. Enrollment at the pre-school would increase from a combined enrollment of 22 children to 42 children and the project would result in the removal of the dwelling unit and the existing parking at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street. The proposal does not include any significant alteration or modification to the exteriors of the existing buildings with the exception of minor changes to signage and fencing. The space would also function as a religious facility when the preschool is not in session. The project also requires a parking variance as two parking spaces are required for the use and the existing parking space at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street would be removed. The subject property is located in RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District.
- 5. **Project Background.** Gan Noe Preschool has been operating at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street since 2005 as a home daycare/preschool for 14 or fewer children. In 2010, Gan Noe Preschool purchased 3781 Cesar Chavez Street and began operating a home daycare/preschool for 14 or fewer children at this location as well. The two properties were licensed for a total of 28 children. In 2011, an enforcement case was opened on 3781 Cesar Chavez Street for the alleged operation of a childcare facility with more than 40 children operating without proper approvals. The Project Sponsor was notified of the enforcement case but it was never investigated by the Department and remains active.

The Project Sponsor also operated a preschool within a single-family dwelling at 107 Justin Drive in Bernal Heights at the same time she was operating a preschool at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street. Conditional use authorization was sought for this location to expand its enrollment to 19 children but the application was cancelled in 2009 and the preschool was closed in 2010.

- 6. Public Comment. The Department received correspondence in opposition to the project from 20 neighbors including adjacent neighbors Richard and Ashley Rochman and Bill Sommer. These neighbors are concerned about parking and traffic, pedestrian safety, noise, driveway blockage related to the project.
  - The Project Sponsor submitted a petition signed by 34 people who have no objections to the project and staff received 32 pieces of public correspondence in support of the project including a letter of support from the Upper Noe Neighbors neighborhood group.
- 7. Planning Code Compliance: The Commission finds that the Project is consistent with the relevant provisions of the Planning Code in the following manner:
  - A. Institutions Child-Care Facility. Planning Code Section 209.3(f) requires Conditional Use authorization for child-care facilities providing less than 24 hour care for 15 or more children by licensed personnel and meeting the open space and other requirements of the State of California within the RH-2 Zoning District.

The Project Sponsor seeks Conditional Use authorization to establish a child-care facility providing less than 24-hour care for 15 or more and up to a maximum of 42 children within the RH-2 Zoning District.

B. Institutions - Religious Facility. Planning Code Section 209.3(j) requires Conditional Use authorization for a church or religious facility which has a tax-exempt status as a religious institution granted by the United States Government, and which institution is used primarily for collective worship or ritual or observance of common religious beliefs within the RH-2 Zoning District.

The Project Sponsor seeks Conditional Use authorization to establish a religious facility. The facility would operate a number of weekly programs with 12 or fewer attendees at any given time. Weekly events include: Saturday morning services, Wednesday night Torah, Bar and Bat Mitzvah lessons and tutoring, and weekly Hebrew classes. Large gatherings would include Rosh Hashana (Fall), Yom Kippur (Fall), Purim Party (Spring), and Passover dinner (Spring).

C. Off-Street Parking. Planning Code Section 151 requires one off-street parking space for each 25 children to be accommodated at any one time, where the number of such children exceeds 24.

The proposed child-care facility for a maximum of 42 children would be required to provide a minimum of two off-street parking spaces for the use, pursuant to Planning Code Sections 151 and 153. The Project would not include any required off-street parking space, which would be subject to an off-street parking variance. The Project Sponsor has submitted a Variance Application No. 2013.0259CV. The Zoning Administrator will hold a public hearing on Variance Application while the Planning Commission will consider Conditional Use Application.

D. Loss of Dwellings through Conversion. Conversion of Residential Units shall be prohibited, unless the Planning Commission approves the conversion at a public hearing.

The Planning Commission shall consider these criteria in the review of applications for Conversation of Residential Units;

(i) Whether conversion of the unit(s) would eliminate only owner occupied housing, and if so, for how long the unit(s) proposed to be removed were owner occupied;

The dwelling to be converted at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street is not owner occupied. The owners of 3781 purchased the property in 2010 and live next door at 3771 Cesar Chavez Street.

(ii) Whether conversation of the unit(s) would provide desirable new non-residential use(s) appropriate for the neighborhood and adjoining district(s);

The conversion of the dwelling unit at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street would support an existing preschool use. Desirable preschools are important in retaining young families in San

Francisco and those that exist often have long waiting lists for open spaces which is often discouraging. The proposed preschool would serve families that want a preschool that favors Jewish values. There are few preschools in San Francisco that offer similar services and those that do offer it are located outside the neighborhoods that Gan Noe Preschool is trying to service. Therefore, the conversion would provide a desirable new non-residential use.

(iii) Whether conversation of the unit(s) will bring the building closer into conformance with the prevailing character of its immediate area and in the same zoning district;

The immediate neighborhood is within a RH District. Though there are two religious facilities located on the north side of Cesar Chavez Street however, the immediate neighborhood is primarily residential. Therefore, the conversion will not bring the property into closer conformance with the prevailing character.

(iv) Whether conversion of the unit(s) will be detrimental to the City's housing stock;

The conversion of the dwelling unit would be detrimental to the City's housing stock because it would result in the loss of a habitable dwelling unit.

(v) Whether conversion of the unit(s) is necessary to eliminate design, functional, or habitability deficiencies that cannot otherwise be corrected.

The existing dwelling unit is approximately 990 square-feet and contains one-bedroom and one bath. Other than being relatively small, the dwelling has no known design, functional, or habitable deficiencies.

Preschool/child care services are difficult to find in the City and those that operate often have long waiting lists. The ability of the City to provide these services will help its ability to attract and retain families in the City. Housing is also a scarce resource in the City. On balance, the need to help preschool/childcare services flourish in the City outweigh the benefit of retaining the existing dwelling unit.

- 8. Planning Code Section 303 establishes criteria for the Planning Commission to consider when reviewing applications for Conditional Use approval. On balance, the project does comply with said criteria in that:
  - A. The proposed new uses and building, at the size and intensity contemplated and at the proposed location, will provide a development that is necessary or desirable, and compatible with, the neighborhood or the community.

The Project would retain the existing buildings on the site and their present configuration. The proposed use is necessary and desirable for the neighborhood because the presence of preschools in San Francisco helps to retain families in the city. At present, preschools are few and far between with desirable preschools experiencing long wait lists for open spaces which discourages some families from attempting to raise their children within the city. Gan Noe is a unique preschool because it offers

preschool services with Jewish values. Every year the school must reject dozens of requests for placement from families due to lack of capacity. Similar preschools are located north of Market Street or on Brotherhood Way, leaving the heart of the city without such services. The proposed expansion would allow Gan Noe to better serve the neighborhoods of Noe Valley, Bernal Heights, Glen Park, and the Mission

Activities related to the proposed religious facility would take place after preschool hours within the same space and according the Sponsor would involve no more than 12 people at a time.

- B. The proposed project will not be detrimental to the health, safety, convenience or general welfare of persons residing or working in the vicinity. There are no features of the project be detrimental to the health, safety or convenience of those residing or working in the area, in that:
  - Nature of proposed site, including its size and shape, and the proposed size, shape and arrangement of structures;

The Project would not alter the existing site configuration of the buildings on the site. The children's play area would be located within the rear yard where it is currently located. Neighbors to the west of the subject property who share the same mid-block have expressed concerns about potential noise impacts from the additional children. In response, the Project Sponsor has stated that outdoor playtime will be staggered such that all children would never be in the play area at the same time. By law, the younger children cannot be within the play area at the same time as the older children.

 The accessibility and traffic patterns for persons and vehicles, the type and volume of such traffic, and the adequacy of proposed off-street parking and loading;

The Subject Property is in an established residential neighborhood that is well served by public transit, including 24th Street and the J-Church Muni Metro Line and J-Streetcar within two blocks of the Subject Property. Additionally, the proposed preschool facility is intended to meet the needs of the residents in the immediate neighborhood and should not generate significant amounts of vehicular trips citywide.

The Planning Code requires two off-street parking spaces for the proposed facility; however, the sponsor is seeking a variance from this requirement and would remove the existing garage parking space at 3781 Cesar Chavez Street. The project site is located on a street that is the primary arterial to and from Highway 101. Furthermore, there are signaled intersections at the east and west ends of the block. These factors often lead to traffic congestion within the subject block during commute hours. Neighbors have expressed concern that the proposed increase in enrollment would exacerbate the traffic situation within the block and that current parents park on sidewalks and block adjacent driveways during drop off. In response, the Project Sponsor has The Project Sponsor has agreed to apply for a white passenger loading zone, accommodating two parking spaces, on Sanchez Street in front of the facility's entrance and has agreed to institute a

staggered pick up and drop off that is supervised by staff to reduce traffic congestion during commute hours.

No additional off-street parking is required for the proposed religious facility. Programs related to the facility would include weekly Saturday morning services, weekly Wednesday night Torah study, Bar and Bat Mitzvah lessons and tutoring, and weekly Hebrew classes. Larger religious gatherings include Rosh Hashana (Sept.), Yom Kippur (Sept.), Purim Party (March), and Passover Dinner (April). Many attendees do not drive on the Sabbath or Jewish holidays in accordance with strict Jewish Law which reduces vehicular traffic.

iii. The safeguards afforded to prevent noxious or offensive emissions such as noise, glare, dust and odor;

The project would not emit noxious or offensive emissions such noise, glare, dust or odor.

iv. Treatment given, as appropriate, to such aspects as landscaping, screening, open spaces, parking and loading areas, service areas, lighting and signs;

No additional landscaping is proposed for the site. The Department shall review all lighting and signs proposed for the property in accordance with the Conditions of Approval contained in Exhibit A.

C. That the use as proposed will comply with the applicable provisions of the Planning Code and will not adversely affect the General Plan.

The Project complies with all relevant requirements and standards of the Planning Code and is consistent with objectives and policies of the General Plan as detailed below.

9. **General Plan Compliance.** The Project is, on balance, consistent with the following Objectives and Policies of the General Plan:

#### COMMERCE AND INDUSTRY ELEMENT

**OBJECTIVE 1:** 

MANAGE ECONOMIC GROWTH AND CHANGE TO ENSURE ENHANCEMENT OF THE TOTAL CITY LIVING AND WORKING ENVIRONMENT.

Policy 1.1:

Encourage development which provides substantial net benefits and minimizes undesirable consequences. Discourage development that has substantial undesirable consequences that cannot be mitigated.

The Project would enhance the living and working environment in the City by providing a unique needed preschool service for residents and workers within the Noe Valley, Bernal Height, Glen Park, and Mission

neighborhoods. The Project would also need to comply with State licensing requirements for childcare/preschool facilities further minimizing possible undesirable consequences from such a use.

#### **OBJECTIVE 2:**

MAINTAIN AND ENHANCE A SOUND AND DIVERSE ECONOMIC BASE AND FISCAL STRUCTURE FOR THE CITY.

#### Policy 2.1:

Seek to retain existing commercial and industrial activity and to attract new such activity to the City.

#### Policy 3:

Maintain a favorable social cultural climate in the city in order to enhance its attractiveness as a firm location.

The Project will enhance an existing preschool facility that has served the surrounding community since 2005 by extending it services to a greater number of people.

#### **OBJECTIVE 3:**

PROVIDE EXPANDED EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR CITY RESIDENTS, PARTICULARLY THE UNEMPLOYED AND ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED.

#### Policy 3.1:

Promote the attraction, retention and expansion of commercial and industrial firms which provide employment improvement opportunities for unskilled and semi-skilled workers.

The Project will provide employment opportunities for nine semi-skilled San Francisco residents.

#### **GOVERNMENT, HEALTH AND EDUCATION SERVICES**

#### Objectives and Policies

#### **OBJECTIVE 7:**

ENHANCE SAN FRANCISCO'S POSITION AS A NATIONAL AND REGINAL CENTER FOR GOVERNMENT, HEALTH, AND EDUCATIONAL SERVICES.

#### Policy 7.2:

Encourage the extension of needed health and educational services, but manage expansion to avoid or minimize disruption of adjacent residential areas.

The proposed child-care facility will offer educational services to pre-school children of San Francisco residents. No exterior alteration will be proposed to the existing buildings. The proposed child-care facility's activities will take place either indoors or within the rear yard. The proposed conditions of approval would help reduce affects on parking and traffic within the neighborhood and ease noise levels during hours of operation.

- 10. Planning Code Section 101.1(b) establishes eight priority-planning policies and requires review of permits for consistency with said policies. On balance, the project does comply with said policies in that:
  - A. That existing neighborhood-serving retail uses be preserved and enhanced and future opportunities for resident employment in and ownership of such businesses be enhanced.

The proposal would strengthen an existing neighborhood-serving use that has served the neighborhood since 2005 and provide employment for up to nine people.

B. That existing housing and neighborhood character be conserved and protected in order to preserve the cultural and economic diversity of our neighborhoods.

The proposed use will retain the existing buildings on the site and the interior alterations to 3781 Cesar Chavez Street are such that they could be easily reversed and the property converted back to residential use.

C. That the City's supply of affordable housing be preserved and enhanced,

The Project would not affect the City's existing supply of affordable housing.

D. That commuter traffic not impede MUNI transit service or overburden our streets or neighborhood parking.

The proposed use is well served by public transit but it is located a few blocks away. The proposed preschool is not expected to be a destination use that attracts families from outside the immediate neighborhoods. The Sponsor has agreed to seek a passenger loading space in front of the property and implement a pick up and drop off program for families that choose to drive. The loading zone and the program have been included as conditions of approval for the Project.

E. That a diverse economic base be maintained by protecting our industrial and service sectors from displacement due to commercial office development, and that future opportunities for resident employment and ownership in these sectors be enhanced.

The Project will not displace any service or industry establishment. The project will not affect industrial or service sector uses or related employment opportunities. Ownership of industrial or service sector businesses will not be affected by this project.

F. That the City achieves the greatest possible preparedness to protect against injury and loss of life in an earthquake.

The Project will not affect the Subject Property's ability to withstand an earthquake.

G. That landmarks and historic buildings be preserved.

#### CASE NO. 2013.0259C 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street

The Project would not alter the exterior appearance of the buildings in question.

H. That our parks and open space and their access to sunlight and vistas be protected from development.

The project will have no negative affect on existing parks and open spaces.

- 11. The Project is consistent with and would promote the general and specific purposes of the Code provided under Section 101.1(b) in that, as designed, the Project would contribute to the character and stability of the neighborhood and would constitute a beneficial development.
- 12. The Commission hereby finds that approval of the Conditional Use authorization would promote the health, safety and welfare of the City.

#### DECISION

#### **AUTHORIZATION**

This authorization is for a conditional use to increase enrollment at preschool (d.b.a. Gan Noe Preschool) from 22 to 42 children and establish a religious facility (d.b.a Chabad of Noe Valley) for the properties at 3771 and 3781 Cesar Chavez Street, Block 6577, Lots 030 and 045, pursuant to Planning Code Sections 209.3(f), 209.3(j), 317, and 303 within a RH-2 (Residential, House, Two-Family) District and a 40-X Height and Bulk District; in general conformance with plans stamped "EXHIBIT B" included in the docket for Case No. 2013.0259CV and subject to conditions of approval reviewed and approved by the Commission on July 18, 2013 under Motion No. 18930. This authorization and the conditions contained herein run with the property and not with a particular Project Sponsor, business, or operator.

#### RECORDATION OF CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Prior to the issuance of the building permit or commencement of use for the Project the Zoning Administrator shall approve and order the recordation of a Notice in the Official Records of the Recorder of the City and County of San Francisco for the subject property. This Notice shall state that the project is subject to the conditions of approval contained herein and reviewed and approved by the Planning Commission on July 18, 2013 under Motion No. 18930.

#### PRINTING OF CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL ON PLANS

The conditions of approval under the 'Exhibit A' of this Planning Commission Motion No. 18930 shall be reproduced on the Index Sheet of construction plans submitted with the Site or Building permit application for the Project. The Index Sheet of the construction plans shall reference to the Conditional Use authorization and any subsequent amendments or modifications.

#### SEVERABILITY

The Project shall comply with all applicable City codes and requirements. If any clause, sentence, section or any part of these conditions of approval is for any reason held to be invalid, such invalidity shall not affect or impair other remaining clauses, sentences, or sections of these conditions. This decision conveys no right to construct, or to receive a building permit. "Project Sponsor" shall include any subsequent responsible party.

#### **CHANGES AND MODIFICATIONS**

Changes to the approved plans may be approved administratively by the Zoning Administrator. Significant changes and modifications of conditions shall require Planning Commission approval of a new Conditional Use authorization.

#### **Conditions of Approval**

#### **PERFORMANCE**

1. Validity and Expiration. The authorization and right vested by virtue of this action is valid for three years from the effective date of the Motion. A building permit from the Department of

Building Inspection to construct the project and/or commence the approved use must be issued as this Conditional Use authorization is only an approval of the proposed project and conveys no independent right to construct the project or to commence the approved use. The Planning Commission may, in a public hearing, consider the revocation of the approvals granted if a site or building permit has not been obtained within three (3) years of the date of the Motion approving the Project. Once a site or building permit has been issued, construction must commence within the timeframe required by the Department of Building Inspection and be continued diligently to completion. The Commission may also consider revoking the approvals if a permit for the Project has been issued but is allowed to expire and more than three (3) years have passed since the Motion was approved.

Once submitted staff will share the final signage plan with the Commission as an informational item prior to approval. #### MONITORING

4. Enforcement. Violation of any of the Planning Department conditions of approval contained in this Motion or of any other provisions of Planning Code applicable to this Project shall be subject to the enforcement procedures and administrative penalties set forth under Planning Code Section 176 or Section 176.1. The Planning Department may also refer the violation complaints to other city departments and agencies for appropriate enforcement action under their jurisdiction. #### **OPERATION**

- 5. Garbage, composting and recycling storage. Space for the collection and storage of garbage, composting, and recycling shall be provided within enclosed areas on the property and clearly labeled and illustrated on the architectural addenda. Space for the collection and storage of recyclable and compostable materials that meets the size, location, accessibility and other standards specified by the San Francisco Recycling Program shall be provided at the ground level of the buildings.

7. Noise Control. The premises shall be adequately soundproofed or insulated for noise and operated so that incidental noise shall not be audible beyond the premises or in other sections of the building and fixed-source equipment noise shall not exceed the decibel levels specified in the San Francisco Noise Control Ordinance.

The following conditions were taken from the environmental noise study that was prepared by Charles M. Salter Associates for Gan Noe Preschool. The recommendations were presented by the Project Sponsor at the hearing and hence adopted by the Planning Commission.

- a. The Project Sponsor will work with both the neighbors and Department staff on replacing the existing fence around the play area with taller sound-isolating fence.
- b. The new fence shall be acoustically treated on the play yard side of the fence with sound absorptive material (2-inch thick P.E.P.P.).
- c. Landscape alternative play spaces within the garden at 3771 Cesar Chavez.
- d. Cover the entire hardscape play area with rubber matting.
- e. The Project Sponsor shall conduct quarterly teacher trainings on "good neighbor" policies.
- f. Signage shall be posted for instructing adults on "good neighbor" policies.
- g. Replace the fiberglass basketball backboard with heavier constructed materials such as dense polycarbonate.
- h. Give neighbors a 14-day advance notice of pending holiday celebrations.

Prior to issuance of a Building Permit to construct the Project and implement the approved use, the Project Sponsor shall appoint a community liaison officer to deal with the issues of concern to owners and occupants of nearby properties. The Project Sponsor shall provide the Zoning Administrator with written notice of the name, business address, and telephone number of the community liaison. Should the contact information change, the Zoning Administrator shall be made aware of such change. The community liaison shall report to the Zoning Administrator what issues, if any, are of concern to the community and what issues have not been resolved by the Project Sponsor.

- 10. Traffic Plan. Prior to permit approval, the Project Sponsor shall provide the Department with a morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up plan that will include a white passenger loading zone on Cesar Chavez Street in front of the entrance to the proposed preschool. Additionally, the Sponsor shall monitor the white zone for passenger loading and unloading during morning pick-up and afternoon drop-off hours.

Dear President David Chiu and Board of Supervisors,

On behalf of Gan Noe Preschool and Chabad of Noe Valley I hereby submit our official written response to the appeal of the Conditional Use Permit that was unanimously approved on July 18, 2013, for the activities of Gan Noe Preschool and Chabad of Noe Valley.

The Appellant presents three grounds for his appeal. We will address each one individually.

1. Appellant's Argument #1: The Planning Commission recently approved three preschools with a condition of having a crossing guard; Gan Noe Preschool should have this requirement too.

#### Response to Argument #1:

Safety is the top priority for all Gan Noe operations. Gan Noe analyzed traffic and parking on Cesar Chavez Street and determined that the operation of Gan Noe Preschool with 42 children would have no effect (i.e., a de-minimus impact) on traffic flow and parking spaces on the street. However, to provide for the safety for our pre-school children and to prevent any unnecessary queuing of cars on Cesar Chavez Street, especially during the early morning drop-off time, Gan Noe is implementing a comprehensive Traffic Management Plan (TMP). Gan Noe presented the Traffic Management Plan to the SF Planning Commission at the July 18, 2013, Conditional Use Permit hearing.

An integral component of the Traffic Management Plan is the Traffic Monitor, who will be on-site daily. The Traffic Monitor will wear a standard safety vest (yellow or orange vest for visibility) and will be equipped with a whistle and directional sign (i.e., crossing guard type stop sign or equivalent.) The main duty of the Traffic Monitor is to supervise the white zone (drop-off and pick-up) area in front of Gan Noe to ensure compliance with the parking and drop-off schedule for the school.

The corner of Dolores Street and Cesar Chavez Street has a three-way electric traffic signal to direct traffic flow and left-turns. At Gan Noe, about 20% of the children use alternative transportation means to arrive at school, primarily walking or bicycle. The Traffic Monitor will also be authorized to assist any parents and children who, in addition to the City's traffic signal, need or request additional assistance in crossing the street.

Gan Noe has an impeccable safety record. In our eight years of operation as a daycare provider, Gan Noe has maintained the highest levels of safety performance and compliance, a standard that we are committed to raising even higher with the addition of a daily Traffic Monitor.

2. Appellant's Argument #2: The Appellant claims that Gan Noe has a record of alleged violations of its daycare permits.

Response: The Planning Commission approved the conditional use permit application with a unanimous vote. The conditional use permit approval is a pre-requisite to building permit application and pre-school licensing approval. The purpose of seeking this conditional use permit is to serve the growing needs of our local community in FULL compliance with State of California's CCLD (Community Care Licensing Division) requirements. We always have worked closely with licensing and will continue to do so.

3. Appellant's Argument #3: The appellant claims "The Planning Commission abused its discretion" in considering and approving the Conditional Use Permit application.

Response: The City Planning Department staff fully reviewed Gan Noe's permit application and recommended approval of the Conditional Use Permit. After two and a half hours of hearing and deliberation, we believe the Planning commission recognized the dire need for more quality preschools in San Francisco and made a very thorough and informed to decision to unanimously approve Gan Noe Preschool's conditional use permit.

I write to you today to explain why it is of utmost importance that Gan Noe Preschool moves away from the "Home Daycare" model and be approved to increase its capacity to 42 children and operate as a preschool.

I have been involved in early childhood education for over 15 years. I have served as the director of Gan Noe since it opened 8 years ago and I pride myself on the quality of the program. In many areas we have exceeded the home daycare licensing requirements to ensure our program runs professionally and matches the quality young San Francisco families seek.

#### A few examples are:

- Though licensing does not require early childhood education to run a daycare, I spent 2 years studying child development and I became a qualified Preschool Director in 2007.
- Though licensing does not require daycare providers to have early childhood education, every teacher I hire is either licensed by the state of CA as a Preschool Teacher or is in the process.
- $\bullet$  Though licensing requires a ratio of 1 to 6 I have always maintained of ration of 1 to 4
- Though licensing does not require continued learning, together with my teachers I continue to expand my early childhood education yearly at the Bing Institute at Stanford University.

Until now, we have been a licensed home daycare with a capacity of 14 children in my home. I have been the director, a teacher, the shopper, the janitor and the program planner.

This model is not sustainable for someone who has a family, as time and financial resources are far too limiting to operate in this way. In addition, parents are looking for a program that can accommodate all of their preschool years to avoid unnecessary transitions for the child. A home daycare with 14 children is unable to meet that basic need.

To continue to operate and provide this much needed service in the city, it is imperative that we gain Conditional Use Authorization to allow our capacity be increased to 42 children. Having 42 children will allow us to:

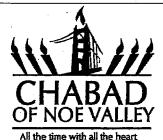
- Offer families their complete preschool need from diapers until kindergarten
- Hire a full time administrator
- Maintain quality teachers with the ability to pay a salary that allows them to live in the city
- Hire a traffic monitor for drop-off and pickup times

I work tirelessly to provide a service that benefits this city and enables families to stay in the city. Many have told us, if not for our program, they would have long moved out of San Francisco. The city lacks quality preschools and it is imperative that quality programming be encouraged to expand in order to keep more families in this wonderful city.

It is my sincere hope that you will support our efforts by approving the CUP for us to serve 42 children, and together we will continue to make this city a better place to raise a family.

# STATEMENT OF APPELLANT RICHARD ROCHMAN AND CITIZENS CONCERNED ABOUT CESAR CHAVEZ STREET (4 C's) IN SUPPORT OF THE APPEAL OF THE CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT FOR 3771-3781 CESAR CHAVEZ STREET

Hearing Date: September 17, 2013

Appellants (Citizens Concerned about Cesar Chavez Street (4 C's)) agree with the Planning Commission that child care facilities provide "a development that is necessary or desirable" for the community and that it is important for the City to promote familyfriendly policies and projects. But it is equally important to ensure that the policies and projects are family friendly. It would not be family friendly to locate a daycare facility on a dangerous street where children can get hurt. But that is just what the Planning Commission has done here.

# I. The 3700 Block of Cesar Chavez Is an Unsafe Location for a Daycare with 42 Children

A. The Planning Commission failed to consider that the 3700 block of Cesar Chavez is exceptionally dangerous — not just in comparison to other blocks with Child Care Facilities, but even in comparison to other blocks of Cesar Chavez.

It is well known to the Board of Supervisors that city agencies do not talk to each other or cooperate as often as they should. This is an example of that ongoing problem. The SFMTA maintains records of the number of traffic collisions and injury accidents for each block in the city. Anyone can quickly and easily obtain that information by submitting a request. (See SFMTA Public Records Policy and Procedures.) One would expect the Planning Department to have obtained the relevant SFMTA records *any time* a proposed project triggers concerns about traffic safety, especially when the safety of young children is at stake, and to have alerted the Planning Commission to its findings. We were surprised and dismayed to discover that the Planning Department does not do so.

This was a serious mistake—the type of mistake that can lead to people being injured or killed.

Because the Planning Department did not do it, we asked the SFMTA to tell us the number of traffic collisions and injury accidents on the 3700 block of Cesar Chavez, as well as on the three other blocks where the Planning Commission has recently approved child care facilities. The SFMTA provided us with a Traffic Collision History Report of Midblock Collisions for each of the four blocks. (Exhibits A-D.) What we discovered was shocking:

The 3700 block of Cesar Chavez has <u>SIXTEEN</u> times as many injury accidents as the 1250 block of Sanchez Street, which is just five blocks away and is where the Commission recently granted a permit to Moldovan Academy. The 3700 block of Cesar Chavez has <u>NINETEEN</u> times as many traffic collisions as the 200 block of Harvard Street, which is less than two miles away and is where the Commission recently granted a permit to Alpha Kids Academy. In fact, the 3700 block of Cesar Chavez has <u>EIGHT</u> times as many injury accidents as *ALL* of the other blocks where the Commission has in the past year approved child care facilities *combined*.

We then wondered whether the problem was simply that Cesar Chavez, as a whole, was a more dangerous street than the streets on which other child care facilities were located, so we asked the SFMTA to give us the Midblock Collision Reports for the adjacent blocks of Cesar Chavez—the 3600 block, which is the four-lane boulevard ending at Guerrero, and the 3800 block, which (like the 3700 block) is a narrow, two-lane street, ending at Church. (Exhibits E & F.) We learned that the real problem is that the 3700 block is *uniquely* dangerous: The 3700 block of Cesar Chavez has more than <u>FIVE</u> times as many injury accidents as the 3800 block and <u>TWICE</u> as many injury accidents as the 3600 block.

B. The 3700 block is exceptionally dangerous because it is a narrow two-lane road that is fed by three heavily trafficked four-lane highways.

The 3700 block of Cesar Chavez Street presents unusual and difficult issues of traffic safety. It is a narrow, two-lane street that funnels traffic to and from the four-lane

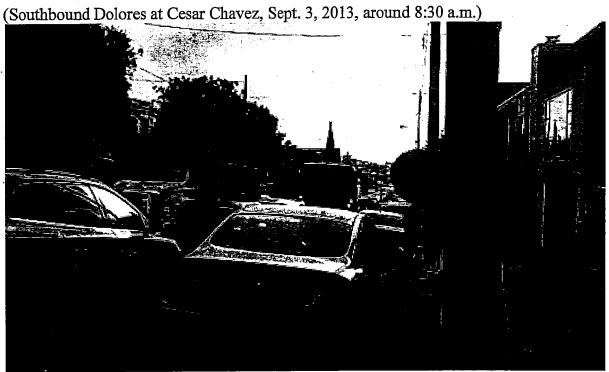
roadways of Dolores Street, Guerrero Street, and the boulevard portion of Cesar Chavez. Moreover, each of those larger roadways effectively acts as an on-ramp and off-ramp for major highways: Dolores and Guerrero each connect to Interstate 280, and Cesar Chavez connects to Highway 101. Over the past dozen years, this narrow artery has become a vital route connecting tech workers who live in the middle part of the City, especially Noe Valley, with their jobs in Silicon Valley.

The increasingly heavy demand placed on this narrow street has created a situation that is as alarming as it is predictable. In the morning during the school year, traffic heading northbound on Dolores at the light at Cesar Chavez is bumper to bumper in both lanes to 27th Street and beyond. Southbound traffic on Dolores is likewise stacked up past 26th Street in both lanes. Traffic on the eastbound section of Cesar Chavez itself fully occupies the entire block, and must often wait through two or three cycles of the traffic light to cross Guerrero.

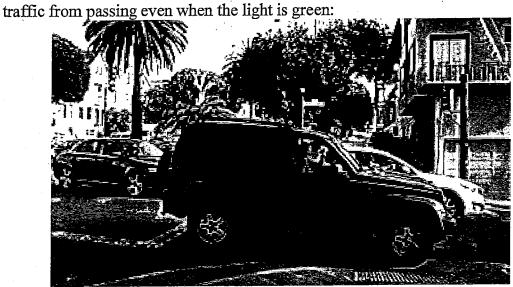

Now consider that a significant proportion of southbound Dolores traffic, northbound Dolores traffic, and eastbound traffic on Cesar Chavez is *all* trying to merge

onto the 3700 block—this narrow two-lane stretch of Chavez that passes in front of Gan Noe preschool—and anyone can see that the result is gridlock in all directions, preventing

The gridlock also makes it very unsafe (or impossible) for pedestrians trying to cross the street. Here, a pedestrian contemplates how to cross the street, watches the light turn green with no opportunity to cross, and remains unmoved as the light changes again:

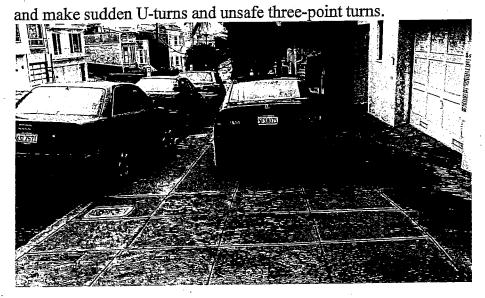

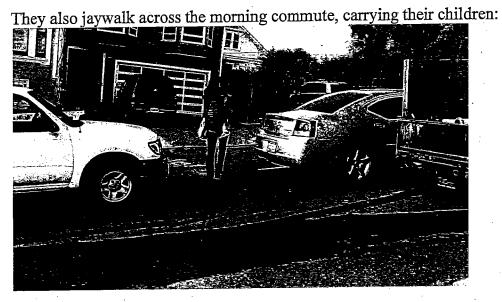


(Pedestrian forced to try again with the next light cycle)

Parents at the existing day care—which is licensed for only 14 children—navigate the chaos to bring their toddlers to Gan Noe preschool any way they can. As was established in the testimony of numerous neighbors before the Planning Commission, parents block driveways, drive on the sidewalk, park on the sidewalk, block the sidewalk (forcing pedestrians into traffic), unload their children from the left side of the vehicle,

### C. The traffic mitigation measures in the CU Permit do not promote safety; they make the situation *more* dangerous.

The conditional use permit's traffic mitigation measure purports to offer a two-prong approach: (1) a supervised drop-off and pickup system with staggered arrival and departure schedules; and (2) a loading zone in front of the properties at 3771-3781 Cesar Chavez. These proposals will not adequately protect children or commuters. In fact, they will worsen an already dangerous situation.

According to its application for a Conditional Use Authorization, Gan Noe already "maintains a supervised pickup and drop-off system to facilitate child retrieval without creating unnecessary burdens on street traffic during peak hours." (Exhibit G.) As stated in the sponsor's supplemental information to the Application, and as also stated in the Letter of Gan Noe Parent Silas KC Geneson (dated 6/6/13), this system includes staggered arrival and departure schedules. Plainly, such a system is not workable. As demonstrated in the objections of the neighbors and in the attached photographs, parents are engaging in a variety of unsafe and unlawful maneuvers just to drop their children off at preschool in the midst of a gridlocked morning commute. A doubling or tripling of the enrollment is *not* the way to solve these problems. Even if the drop-off were extended over a 60-minute period—which is twice as long as what Gan Noe has proposed (Exhibit H)—each of the 42 children would be allotted less than 90 seconds to complete a task that (as set forth in the Objections of William Sommer and William A. Battel to the Planning Commission) currently takes between 10 and 15 minutes per child.

The creation of a loading zone will not address the issues of safety or gridlock, either. As explained in the Objection of William Sommer to the Planning Commission, parents routinely park illegally "even when a legal parking space is only a few feet away." The reason for this is obvious:

No one wants to try to parallel park on a narrow two-lane street under the pressure and scrutiny of anxious and angry drivers stuck in the morning gridlocked commute.

Accordingly, parents will use the loading zone only if they can access it easily and safely—i.e., by waiting for a drive-in spot to open up. Parents might wait by stopping midblock or by circling the block, but either option would only worsen the traffic situation and make it more dangerous.

It is telling that Gan Noe has not yet sought permission to create a loading zone. A few years ago, neighbor William Sommer suggested that the Potashes obtain a loading zone, and reiterated that suggestion at the Pre-Application meeting. At a meeting with Gedalia Potash at Supervisor Wiener's office on June 5, several neighbors stated they would support the creation of a loading zone so that Gan Noe could try out its plan under existing enrollment to see whether it could work—i.e., to see whether Gan Noe can walk before it tries to run. That Gan Noe has not taken up that offer of support is a strong indication that even Gan Noe recognizes its traffic mitigation plan will not work.

A loading zone will also increase the likelihood of a collision with cyclists. By the end of the year, if not sooner, bike lanes will be striped on both sides of Cesar Chavez Boulevard, beginning at Guerrero, which will substantially increase nonmotorized traffic

on Cesar Chavez in this part of Noe Valley. The bike lanes are part of San Francisco Bike Route 60, which connects Vicente Street with Third Street by way of Portola Drive, Clipper Street, Sanchez Street, and Cesar Chavez, including the 3700 block of Cesar Chavez. Gan Noe's plan for 42 vehicles to be alternately parking and then merging midblock back onto the narrow two-lane street as cyclists proceed towards or away from the bike lanes on the boulevard portion of Cesar Chavez is a recipe for carnage. It is the equivalent of adding 84 new residents to this block, each with a car—and each arriving home or leaving for work during the morning commute. Yet neither the project sponsor nor the Planning Commission has offered any plan to mitigate this risk.

Traffic congestion is a nonlinear function. In other words, as a road approaches its maximum capacity, small changes in traffic volume can cause proportionately larger changes in the risk of collisions and congestion-related delays. Traffic on *this* block of Cesar Chavez Street, as demonstrated in the objections of the neighbors and the attached photographs, already exceeds its capacity. It would be irresponsible to *increase* traffic on this block, especially an increase in traffic that requires 42 vehicles to stop, park, and merge back into traffic during the morning and afternoon commutes on SF Bike Route 60.

### D. The permit made drop-off and pick-up even more dangerous by failing to require crossing guards.

As demonstrated by the traffic collision reports from the SFMTA and the photographs of the crosswalks in part I.B., the intersections at either end of Cesar Chavez are unusually dangerous. Even a minimal concern for safety would require that crossing guards be placed at both the Cesar Chavez/Dolores and the Cesar Chavez/Guerrero intersections to aid families who arrive on foot or who choose to park and walk in their children.

In fact, the Planning Commission followed this common-sense approach for other child care facilities. In the year prior to the hearing on Gan Noe's application, the Commission approved three other child care facilities. *Each time*, the Commission

included the requirement that "crossing guard(s) shall monitor the passenger loading and unloading 'white' zone during morning and afternoon pick-up and drop-off hours."

(Exhibit I.)

The draft motion submitted to the Planning Commission at the hearing on the Gan Noe application, however, *did not include any crossing guards*. Instead, it provided only that "the Sponsor shall monitor the white zone for passenger loading and unloading during morning pick-up and afternoon drop-off hours." (Exhibit J.)

The Commission remarked on the inadequacy of the draft motion's traffic plan at the hearing beginning at 6:18:15 of the video:

COMMISSIONER SUGAYA: Um, I'd just like to add that in the traffic plan there's not a mention of a traffic monitor.

COMMISSIONER ANTONINI: I think we had asked as a condition there be a traffic monitor.

ZONING ADMINISTRATOR SANCHEZ: It does make reference that they must monitor that zone, so we would interpret that to [mean] you have to monitor it, whether or not there's someone . . .?

PRESIDENT FONG: All right, we need three people in yellow vests, orange vests. COMMISSIONER MOORE: You need more.

COMMISSIONER SUGAYA: Well, I think that "monitor" without specifically saying someone is kind of like, you know, you can watch it from the window or something. SEVERAL COMMISSIONERS: All right.

There is then an exchange between Commissioner Moore and Jeremy Paul about using traffic procedures implemented at other schools, during which Mr. Paul represents that "we have already done so."

At 6:19:53 of the video, a proposal was made to amend the traffic plan in the draft motion so as to require crossing guards:

PRESIDENT FONG: Mr. Paul, I believe you that you have a plan in place, but clearly to the neighbors it's not quite enough. So I think what she is asking is that you update, improve, verify, increase, give a little more thought, a little more attention, a little more money, a little more volunteers, and whatever, to make it a better situation.

MR. PAUL: I understand, President Fong. We haven't implemented that yet, but that is absolutely what will be in place before we move up the numbers of kids. PRESIDENT FONG: Thank you.

COMMISSIONER SUGAYA: Could that be submitted to staff, also?

COMMISSIONER ANTONINI: I'm comfortable with the parking plan be enumerated, the parking monitor plan be enumerated, and that be submitted to staff to show evidence that it has been taken care of.

CLERK IONIN: So, just to add that condition of approval to the original motion, that an orchestrated pickup/drop-off solution with a parking monitor be submitted to staff.

COMMISSIONER ANTONINI: Sounds good.

CLERK IONIN: On that motion, Commissioner Antonini?

COMMISSIONER ANTONINI: Aye. CLERK IONIN: Commissioner Borden?

COMMISSIONER BORDEN: Aye.

CLERK IONIN: Commissioner Moore?

COMMISSIONER MOORE: Aye.

CLERK IONIN: Commissioner Sugaya?

COMMISSIONER SUGAYA: Aye. CLERK IONIN: Commissioner Wu?

COMMISSIONER WU: Aye.

CLERK IONIN: And Commission President Fong?

PRESIDENT FONG: Aye.

CLERK IONIN: So moved. Commissioners, that motion passes unanimously 6-0.

Because the issue of traffic safety is so important, I emailed Michael Smith, the planner, and Jeremy Paul, agent of the project sponsor, on the Monday after the hearing to ensure that the Commission's modification to require crossing guards would be included in the final motion. (Exhibit K.) Two days later, hearing no response, I sent another email, pointing out that crossing guards had been required for other child care facilities, even though they were located on streets with far less traffic than this block of Cesar Chavez. Mr. Smith responded that he could not include this condition "because it was not specifically stated by the Commission that it must be required." I emailed Mr. Smith about half an hour later, pointing out that the Commission had explicitly stated that the draft motion's traffic plan was inadequate and that the Commission had amended it to require that personnel be designated to monitor the traffic. Mr. Smith replied that he "cannot arbitrarily add provisions after the fact." (Exhibit K.)

The final Motion thus fails to reflect the Commission's amendment at the hearing.

Other than to correct the reference to "morning pick-up and afternoon drop-off" in the

drat motion, the traffic condition in the permit is otherwise the same as the condition the Commission explicitly rejected at the hearing as inadequate: "the Sponsor shall monitor the white zone for passenger loading and unloading during morning pick-up and afternoon drop-off hours."

In short, the traffic condition here fails to include even the minimal safety measures required for other child care facilities, even though those blocks have only a tiny fraction of the traffic and injury accidents of this block. Moreover, the traffic condition here fails to include even the mitigation measures explicitly required by the Commission at the hearing. Because the Department has repeatedly asserted that it cannot modify the traffic condition, it is now entirely up to the Board of Supervisors, if it believes the project should be approved, to craft and impose the conditions necessary to make this project safe.

## II. The Operators of the Proposed Preschool Have a Track Record of Disregarding (and Covering Up Violations of) the Laws, Rules, and Regulations Governing the Safe Operation of Daycare

The operation of a family day care (or a child care facility) is governed by a carefully crafted set of laws, rules, and regulations—and rightly so. Because parents are not present to witness the conduct of the day care, the children are at the complete mercy of the adults to whom they have been entrusted.

The Community Care Licensing Division (CCLD) of the State Department of Social Services is the state agency charged with enforcing regulations relating to safety at preschools and family day care facilities. Many of its records are public and can be inspected, on request. One would expect the Planning Department to obtain those records whenever an existing family day care operator seeks permission to operate a child care facility, and to provide them to the Planning Commission when the proposed operator has a history of violating the law and covering up those violations. We were surprised and

dismayed to discover that the Planning Department does not do so. This was another serious mistake.

We visited CCLD, spoke with their enforcement team, and inspected the public records of the family day care operated by the project sponsor at 3771 Cesar Chavez, as well as the family day care operated *illegally* by the project sponsor at 3781 Cesar Chavez and 107 Justin Drive. (Exhibit L.) The enforcement file shows that CCLD has cited Gan Noe preschool for over a *dozen* "Type A" violations—the most serious type of violations—just in the past year. These violations include the failure to have working smoke detectors, the repeated operation of the facility with more children than was permitted by the license, the failure to comply with the condition that the home be free of defects or conditions that might endanger a child, the obstruction of the sole exit with storage items, and the failure to conduct fire or disaster drills. (Exhibits L-P.)

Gan Noe has also committed two "zero-tolerance violations": continuing to operate a family day care facility long after the licensee had vacated the premises. In both instances, Gan Noe was aware of the violation but continued to misrepresent to CCLD personnel that the licensee was still living at the premises.

Up until April 12, 2013, the Potashes owned and operated three family day care facilities: at 3771 Cesar Chavez (Leah Potash, licensee), 3781 Cesar Chavez (Nathan Pikover, licensee), and 107 Justin Drive (Miriam Rieber, licensee). On April 12, 2013, the day care at 107 Justin Drive was abruptly shut down by CCLD because the licensee, Miriam Rieber—the "adult licensed to operate a Family Day Care Home and who is primarily involved in providing care for the children" in "the licensee's residence" (Cal. Code Regs., tit. 22, § 102352, subds. (h)(1), (1)(2))—was nowhere to be found and had not been seen for at least some months. (Exhibit N.)

The abrupt, agency-initiated shutdown should not have come as a surprise to the Potashes. At an unannounced inspection three weeks earlier, staff had told CCLD that no one lived at the house and that they did not even know who Miriam Rieber was.

According to staff, Leah Potash was the owner of the day care. On her watch, CCLD issued a report detailing five Type A violations—i.e., those violations of the regulations and of the Health & Safety Code that, if not corrected, have a direct and immediate risk to the health, safety or personal rights of those in care—and three Type B violations—i.e., those violations that, without correction, could become an immediate risk to the health, safety or personal rights of children. One of them—a "ZERO TOLERANCE VIOLATION"—was the abandonment of the day care by the licensee. Another was the presence of a staff member who had no criminal record clearance. The absence of any smoke detectors, the absence of any evidence that fire and disaster drills had ever been conducted, and the absence of any evidence that the staff had been trained in first aid or CPR were also noted, as was the failure of the staff to open the door to authorized CCLD employees for a period of 10 minutes. (Exhibit N.) Finally, the CCLD Facility Report stated that the day care was "operating under false pretenses." Immediate fines of \$650 were imposed. (Exhibit Q.)

In retrospect, it does not appear that the Potashes ever intended Miriam Rieber to actually act as the licensee. Rieber spoke French, and Gedalia Potash had to be present with her at each CCLD visit to translate for her—yet Gan Noe never advertised its day care as offering any languages other than English and some exposure to modern Hebrew. After the visit on August 14, 2009, CCLD never saw Rieber again. Given that none of the staff had ever heard of Rieber, it seems likely that she had vacated the premises long before CCLD discovered it in March 2013. Indeed, there were no beds in any of the rooms! (Exhibit N.)

But what is even more interesting than the sham family day care being run by the Potashes at 107 Justin Drive is the Potashes' response to getting caught. Following the March 19, 2013, inspection, the Potashes did not seize the opportunity to acknowledge that the licensee, Miriam Rieber, had abandoned the family day care; nor did they arrange for a new licensee to carry on the day care; nor did they timely warn parents that they

would very shortly need to make other arrangements for their children. No. The Potashes carried on, as though nothing had happened, for the next three weeks until CCLD issued a Temporary Suspension Order, to Gedalia Potash, on April 12, effective as of the close of business that day. (Exhibit N.)

The Potashes learned no lessons—at least, no good lessons—from the 107 Justin Drive debacle. As it turned out, they were running the same scheme—a sham licensee—at the same time at 3781 Cesar Chavez. The putative licensee at 3781 Cesar Chavez, Nathan Pikover, was a young man on his way up, working first at Yelp and then at a startup called TranscribeMe; he was not the operator of a family day care. He moved to Hayes Valley in April 2012, yet neither he nor the Potashes alerted CCLD or the parents that the family day care had thereby become illegal.

CCLD had to uncover the information itself, through persistent investigation.

CCLD's suspicions as to the illegality of the family day care at 3781 Cesar Chavez were first triggered during a large family day care prelicensing visit in September 2012, when no normal items, such as "plates, appliances, cooking utensils in the cabinets or food in the refrigerator," were observed. During the next prelicensing visit at the end of October, when CCLD noted that there was no "soap, shampoos, toothpaste, towels, shaving utensils, etc.," Pikover was not present and staff said they were not sure when he would be returning. At another unannounced visit six months later—a few days after CCLD had closed down the sham family day care at 107 Justin Drive—Pikover was again absent. Staff continued to assert that Pikover did live in there, but admitted that he did not have a work schedule at the day care. Only when CCLD arrived for yet another unannounced visit on June 28 did the Potashes *finally* concede that Pikover had moved out. (Exhibits M, P.)

Once again, we can infer how the Potashes would operate a large child care facility by examining how they operated a family day care next door to their house. The outlook is not promising. According to CCLD, there were at least six Type A violations on their

watch at this location. The Potashes failed to safeguard electrical outlets that were not in use, there was mold in the refrigerator and debris in the bathtub, they failed to ensure children were kept away from knives in the kitchen, they used the stairway (which was the only way in or out of the house) as storage, and they had more children than were allowed on the small family day care license at 3781 Cesar Chavez—a license that, in any event, was of no legal effect once Pikover moved out. (Exhibits M, P.)

Those, however, are just the violations that CCLD has witnessed. The neighbors, who see the Gan Noe day care on a regular basis, have stated that there have been well over 25 children at times. Gan Noe is currently licensed for only 14 children. At its maximum, Gan Noe has been licensed only for 22 children—although Gedalia Potash, at various times, has represented to Planning Department staff and neighbors whom he solicited for his "petition" that Gan Noe was licensed for 14 children at each residence. (See Motion No. 18930 at p. 3) He apparently does not make that claim anymore—and it has *never* been true—but it is illuminating of Gedalia Potash's tendency to report as fact how he would like things to be rather than how things actually are. The Potashes also have been told by CCLD "the two facilities cannot co-mingle children from the two facilities at anytime." (Exhibit N.) Nonetheless, the Potashes have done just that on a daily basis.

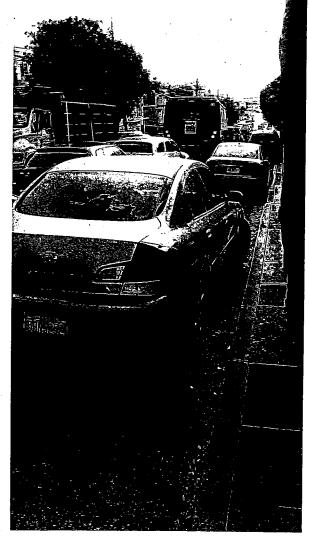
### III. The Planning Commission Failed to Exercise Its Discretion and Misunderstood the Facts

During the hearing (at 5:50:04 of the video), Commissioner Sugaya referred to "these State *alleged* violations" and Commissioner Borden (beginning at 05:55:12 of the video) conceded that "obviously this is a unique situation for us," and "it is concerning when there are issues with the licensing," but concluded that "I don't know the nature of the violations and the concerns and whether or not they're valid."

These were not allegations; they were *violations* established by CCLD and signed, in each instance, by the project sponsor or an agent. The nature of the violations was fully

discussed in the documents presented at the hearing (and attached as exhibits here). The Commission's lack of familiarity with the long record of serious violation found by CCLD, like the Commission's lack of awareness of the unique dangers presented by this block, were the result of a staff summary that failed to consider or discuss SFMTA data or the CCLD enforcement files. Gan Noe's record of legal violations—and its persistence in repeating the violations and in covering them up—demonstrates that the project sponsor cannot be trusted to operate a child care facility in a safe and legal manner and that the project sponsor's promises to behave better in the future should not be credited.

We urge the Board of Supervisors to give this matter the close attention the Commission was denied the opportunity to provide. As has been shown, this is not a site



that can safely support a 42-child preschool.

Harvard St and Sanchez St, for example, have only ONE-SIXTEENTH the rate of injury accidents as this block of Cesar Chavez—and the preschool on Junipero Serra is on a separated frontage road dedicated only to the residences and facilities located there.

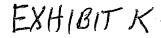

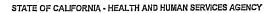

There is a full time teacher as Devora states is a full time teacher and she only knows her first name by Donna. In the outside area it is observed that the rear fence is open to another day care facility. The only thing blocking the two facilities is a door house. Devora was told that the two facilities cannot co-mingle children from the 2 facilities at anytime. It is noted that the corrections that needed to be made in the first visit were partially completed. It is observed in the lower garage/Synogouge level that the electrical outlets were covered, there is also observed L Brackets that hold on to the "ARK" cabinet. The two storage facilities outside have been locked and made inaccessible and no paint cans were observed. The garbage cans have also been placed away and were not observed. The lamp cover in the lower level have also been replaced and repaired. Postings including the license are now all visible. Aide states that she is not sure when the Licensee will be returning. The issues however at hand remains that the one aide needs to be associated to the facility immediately & that the barrier that was advised to the licensee to secure at the kitchen has not been completed. In this inspection this will be noted and because this barrier was found left open a knife was on the counter which would then make the knife accessible to children. The bottom of the front stairs have been turned into a storage space and at the narrowest point is only about 27 inches. As noted on the first visit about the issues in the Kitchen, there were no personal hygiene items observed. A bottle of Aiax and Hand soap was all that was observed. 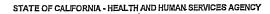

I have read about the plans to increase the number of children at the day-care center located at 3771-3781 Cesar Chavez Street between Guerrero and Dolores Streets. I am also aware of concerns stated by neighbors on Dolores and Cesar Chavez.

Since I do not live adjacent to the properties in question, I cannot comment on the noise and the inadequacy of the space being provided by the owners.

I can, as an experienced city planning consultant and urban designer, with considerable experience and first hand knowledge of the issues pertaining to site-access issues, state unequivocally that permitting an enlarged day care population will cause major traffic and safety problems for the children and parents, as well as the commuters driving on Cesar Chavez seeking access to I-280 or Highway 101 to get to the Silicon Valley.

Cesar Chavez is a narrow boulevard between Guerrero and Dolores, and it is heavily used by commuters because of its direct links to the two freeways. Cesar Chavez is a very convenient and well-used way to get from the neighborhoods around the proposed day-care center, and those two major highways.

The day care center has no on site provision for access and drop-off from Cesar Chavez, which promotes double parking and parking illegally on sidewalks and in driveways.

Turning movements at Gurrero and Dolores are extremely common in both directions at the morning and evening commutes, and since turning drivers cannot see the parked cars dropping or picking up children at the day-care center they are liable to accidentally run into them, which is, of course, a threat to the parents and the children who attend the day care facilities proposed.

This is an untenable situation, until and unless the owners of the day care facility provide off-site drop-off and pick-up space in front of the day care center, which is practically infeasible.

I understand that there have already been traffic accidents on this block of Cesar Chavez.

It is my understanding that the operators of the day care center are seeking permission to consolidate and expand the number of children at the Cesar Chavez location. That, it appears, would lead to a serious breach of public safety, and would exacerbate the hazardous situation that already exists.

The Planning Commission should therefore not approve the permit being sought by the operators of the facility.

Dear Mr. Chiu:

The future of a city is dependent upon its children. Most parents of San Francisco families need to maintain employment outside of their homes. This necessitates the requirement for preschool and childcare services. Unfortunately, there is a shortage of childcare and preschool facilities in San Francisco. As a result, San Francisco families are relocating to suburbs with sufficient child-related services. This exodus of families is contributing to the significant decline of children within the population of San Francisco.

I rarely support the granting of conditional use permits, which frequently benefit developers, and lead to unwelcome changes in the character of our residential neighborhoods. Chabad Noe Valley, however, is a non-profit organization that serves the residential communities of Noe Valley, Bernal Heights, the Mission district, and even the Castro, where I reside. Chabad Noe Valley is located in a mixed-use neighborhood, containing many businesses and a few houses of worship within a six block radius. Increasing the enrollment of Gan Noe Preschool will enhance this neighborhood, one I claim as my own, as I regularly walk to and from Chabad Noe Valley.

It is for these reasons that I most highly support granting a conditional use permit to Gan Noe Preschool, which would enable this educational facility to increase its enrollment to 42 children. Please say "yes" to the children and families of San Francisco, and "no" to the appeal that would deny the conditional use permit, which was unanimously approved by the Commission for Gan Noe Preschool and Chabad Noe Valley.
