12	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
13	Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in
14	this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public
15	Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the
16	Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference.
17	Section 2. The Transportation Code is hereby amended by revising Sections 1.1,
18	7.2.30 and 7.2.65, to read as follows:
19	SEC. 1.1. DEFINITIONS.
20	(a) Whenever in this Transportation Code words or phrases are used that are not
21	defined by the provisions of this Code, but are defined in the Vehicle Code, the definition and
22	meaning shall be applied as set forth in the Vehicle Code.
23	(b) Any words or phrases that are not defined in the Vehicle Code or in Division II of
24	this Code shall have the meanings set forth below.

1	(1)	California Public Utilities Commission, CPUC. The Public Utilities Commission
2	of the State	of California.
3	(2)	Chief of Police. The Chief of the San Francisco Police Department, or his or her
4	designee(s)).
5	(3)	City. The City and County of San Francisco.
6	(4)	Code. The Transportation Code of the City and County of San Francisco,
7	consisting o	of Division I, under the jurisdiction of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, and

1	(12)	Newsgathering Vehicle. A vehicle displaying a permit issued by the Police
2	Department	pursuant to Section 939.2 of the Police Code.
3	(13)	Non-motorized User-propelled Vehicle, NUV. Any device of two or more
4	wheels lacki	ng a belt, chain, or gears that is powered by the rider through pedals or by
5	pushing off	of or kicking at the ground, including, but not limited to, in-line skates, roller-
6	skates, kick	or push scooters, skateboards, and toy vehicles.
7	(14)	Park. To park or stop a vehicle, as defined in the Vehicle Code, or to cause or
8	permit a veh	nicle to be parked or stopped, unless the context requires a different meaning.
9	(15)	Parking Control Officer, PCO. A City employee authorized by the Municipal
10	Transportati	on Agency to enforce state laws and the San Francisco Municipal Code related to
11	Parking of v	ehicles.
12	(16)	Parking Meter. Any device, including any electronic pay station, that, upon
13	payment, re	gisters the amount of time for which a vehicle is authorized to Park in a particular
14	Parking Spa	ace.
15	(17)	Parking Permit. A permit issued by the Municipal Transportation Agency to a
16	person or a	vehicle which, when current, valid and properly displayed, entitles the vehicle or a
17	vehicle occu	upied by the person to specified exemptions from the Parking regulations of this
18	Code.	
19	(18)	Parking Space. A space demarcated by painted lines or other indicators for the
20	Parking of a	single vehicle.
21	(19)	Placard. A placard issued by a state agency to a person with disabilities
22	pursuant to	Vehicle Code Sections 22511.55 or 22511.59 that entitles the holder to Parking
23	privileges as	s specified in Vehicle Code Sections 22511.5 et seq.
24	(20)	Police Officer. An employee of the San Francisco Police Department

authorized to enforce the criminal laws of the state and of the San Francisco Municipal Code.

1	(21)	Port Commission. The Port Commission of the City and County of San
2	Francisco.	
3	(22)	Port Regulations. With respect to any property under the jurisdiction of the San
4	Francisco Po	ort Commission, such Parking and traffic conditions and regulations as are
5	imposed by	and on file and available for public inspection at the office of the Port
6	Commission	l.
7	(23)	Proof of Payment or Proof of Payment Program. A fare collection system that
8	requires trar	nsit passengers to possess a valid fare receipt or transit pass upon boarding a
9	transit vehic	le or while in a Proof of Payment Zone, and which subjects such passengers to
10	inspections	for proof of payment of fare by any authorized representative of the transit system
11	or duly author	orized peace officer.
12	(24)	Proof of Payment Zone. The paid area of a subway or boarding platform of a
13	transit syste	m within which any person is required to show proof of payment of fare for use of
14	the transit sy	ystem.
15	(25)	Public Property. Property owned or controlled by a public agency that is not
16	within the pu	ublic right-of-way.
17	(26)	Request for Review. A form submitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors
18	that seeks B	soard of Supervisors' review of a Final MTA Decision.
19	(27)	San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency or SFMTA. The Municipal
20	Transportati	on Agency of the City and County of San Francisco.
21	(28)	Sidewalk Bicycle. Any bicycle with wheel diameter of less than 21 inches
22	overall, inclu	uding tires.
23	(29)	Special License Plate. A license plate issued by a state agency to the vehicle
24	of a person	with disabilities pursuant to Vehicle Code Section 5007 that entitles the holder to
25	Parking priv	ileges as specified in Vehicle Code Sections 22511.5 et seq.

1	(30)	Special Traffic Permit. A permit issued by the Municipal Transportation Agency
2	required for	any obstruction of traffic upon a street or sidewalk area by any construction,
3	excavation o	or other activity, to the extent that such activity will not be conducted in
4	accordance	with City contract specifications or with the Municipal Transportation Agency's
5	"Regulations	for Working in San Francisco Streets" (otherwise known as the "Bluebook").
6	(31)	Stand. A zone established by the Municipal Transportation Agency for the
7	exclusive us	e of a class or classes of vehicles identified by signs posted at such Stand.
8	(32)	State. The State of California.
9	(33)	Truck. A commercial motor vehicle with six or more wheels that is designed,
10	used, or mai	ntained primarily for the transportation of goods.
11	(34)	Truck Loading Zone. A zone for the exclusive use of Trucks while loading or
12	unloading fre	eight, subject to any posted time limits.
13	(35)	Vehicle Code. The Vehicle Code of the State of California.
14	SEC. 7.2. II	NFRACTIONS.
15	In add	dition to public offenses created by the Vehicle Code, the actions listed in this
16	Section 7.2	are prohibited, and each and every violation of a prohibition listed below shall be
17	an infraction	, except as otherwise provided in: (a) this Code; or (b) the Vehicle Code; or (c) as
18	necessary to	comply with the direction of a Police Officer or Parking Control Officer; or (d) with
19	respect to a	Municipal Parking Facility, upon the direction of an authorized parking attendant;
20	or (e) with re	espect to any other Public Property, except with the permission of, and subject to
21	such condition	ons and regulations as are imposed by the agency that owns the property that are

available for public inspection at the agency's offices.

21	For t	he operator of any vehicle Parked in a Municipal Parking Facility:

time permitted for Parking at that Parking Meter. Any vehicle Parked at an inoperable or

2	Park for thea maximum time period permitted for that Parking Meterof two hours.	
3	(c) Each hour or portion thereof that a vehicle is Parked in violation of this Section	
4	shall be a separate and distinct offense, but no vehicle may be issued more than two citations	
5	within a 12-hour period.	
6	Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after	
7	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the	
8	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board	
9	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.	
10	Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors	
11	intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,	
12	numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal	
13	Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment	
14	additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under	
15	the official title of the ordinance.
