[Adding the Name "Donaldina Cameron Alley" to Old Chinatown Lane]

Resolution adding the name "Donaldina Cameron Alley" to Old Chinatown Lane in recognition of Donaldina Cameron and her many contributions to San Francisco.

WHEREAS, Donaldina Cameron became the superintendent of the Presbyterian Home at the age of 25 and continued the mission of saving Chinese immigrant women from indentured servitude; and

WHEREAS, Donaldina Cameron created a foundation to help Asian women victims of discrimination and violence through her work with the Donaldina Cameron House; and

WHEREAS, The Cameron House has since developed into a comprehensive direct service agency that serves low income Asian immigrants in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Donaldina Cameron devoted her life to assisting women and families in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Donaldina Cameron was known to spend time on Old Chinatown Lane outreaching to girls in need of help; and

WHEREAS, Donaldina Cameron also founded the Chung Mei Home and the Ming Quong Home for orphaned children; and

WHEREAS, Donaldina Cameron retired from her work in 1934, and she is recognized for educating and saving over 3,000 Chinese women and children; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, There shall be an honorary naming of "Donaldina Cameron Alley" in recognition of her valued contributions to the City of San Francisco and the community of Chinatown; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors requests the Municipal Transportation Agency to erect street signs indicating both the honorary and the existing

names of the street, either on a single sign or on separate signs, with the honorary name "Donaldina Cameron Alley" in smaller letters, and the existing name "Old Chinatown Lane" in larger letters above or beneath the honorary name; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That both of the street names, "Donaldina Cameron Alley" and "Old Chinatown Lane," shall remain posted permanently; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works is directed to add the honorary street name to its official list of Commemorative Street Names in accordance with Public Works Code 789 et seq.

Dear Supervisors - David, Jane & Scott:

Although I will not be in town for the long awaited renaming of the three Chinatown/North Beach Alleys, I wanted to write you this email letter of support for the proposed alleys: Old Chinatown Land to its former name honoring "Donaldina CAMERON" alley; Bartol alley to "ENID NG LIM" alley and Merchant alley next to the Hilton for BUD MOOSE (Geoff's mentor).

I personally met Ms. Cameron in my late teen years at Cameron House where I have worked at as a pastor & youth director... and last year, a new book on her life was written acknowledging her courageous work in old Chinatown when many girls were sold into indentured servant hood, prostitution... She helped to create one of the first Asian Women's Shelter in the country at Cameron House.

Regarding, Cameron Alley, (Old Chinatown Lane), The board and staff asked me if the alleyway could be renamed from old Chinatown lane to acknowledge the work of Ms. Cameron and Cameron House in time for their February 8, 2014 celebration of 140 years of service to the community.

Regarding Enid — I knew and loved her very much as my co-worker. I knew Enid Lim at Cameron House, the Presbyterian Church in Chinatown and as my colleague working at Chinatown CDC. She really was like the "mom" in our young team of organizers & planners at CCDC back in the '90s. Her wisdom and ability to relate to so many people city wide astounded us young activist back then. She knew everyone — from Nob Hill to City Hall folks to everyone in Chinatown.

In the 1990s, I got to co-emcee the Chinese New Year Parade with her every year... and as I still emcee the review stand, I always think of her.

She pulled together many collaborations working on "clean streets & alleyways" to "historic preservation". She led both Chinatown TRIP and the Chinatown Environmental Control Task Force... She has unselfishly worked for the community's & San Francisco's interest for so many decades... This renaming is so "right" for her.

After Enid passed away, we at CCDC have always hoped for an opportunity to honor her legacy and it is quite appropriate that we honor her at Bartol alley for a number of reasons: She helped to save 1000 Montgomery for the Community and afterwards - On Lok located there where she lived during her last year of life. On top of that, she was part of CCDC when we worked to renovate that particular Alley.

Although I did not know Harold Bud Moose, I know Geoff Palermo who owns the Hilton and Geoff has been so generous to the Chinatown Community. He is very community minded and is now working well with the Chinese Cultural Center whose executive director Mabel Teng recently told me – is also endorsing the renaming of Merchant Alley.

Thank you President Chiu for paving the way through these renaming resolutions to honor these heroes.
