Resolution retroactively authorizing the Fire Department to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$1,771,421 from the Federal Emergency Management Agency to upgrade and replace its Defibrillator inventory for the period of March 8, 2013, through March 7, 2014, and conduct regional training for the period of May 1, 2013, through April 30, 2014.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Fire Department (SFFD) responds to over 120,000 incidents each year, including fires, vehicle accidents, and medical and other emergencies; and

WHEREAS, SFFD employees use Defibrillators as life-saving medical equipment in their emergency medical response; and

WHEREAS. The Department has the need for specialized training in its response to the wide variety of incidents that occur in San Francisco as well as regionally; and

WHEREAS, Due to funding issues, the Department has not been able to replace or upgrade its Defibrillators nor provide specialized training on a regular basis with any funds out of its operating budget; and

WHEREAS, The SFFD applied for and was awarded a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) grant in the amount of \$1,771,421 to purchase 41 Defibrillator units and conduct regional training; and

WHEREAS. The use of these grant funds would allow the Department to replace its outdated Defibrillators with units that have new health and safety features; and

WHEREAS, The use of these grant funds would also allow the Department to host much needed specialized trainings and invite its regional partners; and

WHEREAS, The FEMA grant requires SFFD to purchase 41 Defibrillators by March 7, 2014 and conduct the training by April 30, 2014; and

WHEREAS, The Fire Commission recommended approval of this grant at its meeting on August 8, 2013; and

WHEREAS, The grant does not require an ASO amendment; and

WHEREAS, The grant requires the City to provide matching funds worth 20 percent of the total award, or \$442,855; and

WHEREAS, The SFFD proposes to maximize the use of the grant funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the SFFD to accept and expend grant funds in the amount of \$1,771,421 from FEMA; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Chief of the SFFD is hereby authorized and empowered to execute, deliver, and perform, in the name of the City and County of San Francisco, all applications, contracts, agreements, amendments, and payment requests necessary for the purpose to secure the FEMA grant funds and implement and carry out the purposes specified in the applicable grant application.
