10 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Homeland Security ("DHS") has several
11 Homeland Security Grant Programs, including the Urban Areas Security Initiative ("UASI") grant; and

12 WHEREAS, The UASI grant addresses the unique planning, equipment, training, and
13 exercise needs of high-threat, high-density Urban Areas, and assists those areas in building
14 an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover
15 from threats and acts of terrorism; and

16 WHEREAS, DHS distributes UASI grant funds to recipient jurisdictions in California
17 through the California Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES); and

18 WHEREAS, The Bay Area UASI Program includes the twelve contiguous Bay Area
19 counties and other governmental entities within those counties, and is governed by an
20 Approval Authority representing the largest cities and counties; and

21 WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco serves as the fiscal agent for the
22 Bay Area UASI program, and disburses funds to jurisdictions in the Bay Area pursuant to the
23 direction of the UASI Approval Authority; and

24 WHEREAS, The Bay Area UASI program anticipated and budgeted for a FY 2013
25 UASI grant award of \$21,931,312, based on the FY 2012 grant award; and

1 WHEREAS, The final amount allocated to the Bay Area UASI in FY 2013 is
2 \$22,619,300, which is an increase of \$687,988 over the anticipated amount; and,

3 WHEREAS, San Francisco Administrative Code 10.170.1 requires that an increase in
4 grant awards above \$100,000 be approved by the Board of Supervisors; and,

5 WHEREAS, The Bay Area UASI must expend UASI funds by May 31, 2015; and

6 WHEREAS, The grant does not require an amendment to the Annual Salary
7 Ordinance; and

8 WHEREAS, The grant does not provide for indirect costs; now, therefore be it

9 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes DEM, on behalf of the
10 City and County of San Francisco, to accept and expend the FY 2013 UASI grant increase in
11 the amount of \$687,988, for a total of \$22,619,300; and, be it



LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Accept and Expend Grant - Urban Areas Security Initiative Grant Increase:
Budget Revision - FY2013 - \$687,988]

Resolution retroactively authorizing the Department of Emergency Management, on behalf of the City and County San Francisco, as the fiscal agent for the Bay Area Urban Areas Security Initiative (UASI), to accept and expend an increase to FY2013 UASI grant funds in the amount of \$687,988 for a total of \$22,619,300 from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security through the California Office of Emergency Services, for the period of September 1, 2013, through May 31, 2015.

Background Information

The United States Department of Homeland Security ("DHS"), through its Urban Areas Security Initiative ("UASI") Grant Program, provides funding for the planning, equipment, training, and exercise needs of high-threat, high-density Urban Areas, and assists those areas in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from threats and acts of terrorism.


The combined Urban Areas of the City and County of San Francisco, the City of Oakland, and the City of San Jose form the Bay Area Urban Area. The Bay Area Urban Area includes the twelve contiguous Bay Area counties and governmental entities within those counties.

The City and County of San Francisco, the City of Oakland, the City of San Jose, and the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, San Mateo, Santa Clara and Sonoma have entered a Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") regarding the Bay Area Urban Area's mission, governance and reporting structures, responsibilities, and financial arrangements, as well as processes and mechanisms to use in applying for, allocating and distributing UASI grant funds through the Bay Area Urban Area. Under the MOU, the UASI Approval Authority determines the allocation and distribution of UASI grant funds. San Francisco serves as the primary grantee of UASI funds for the Bay Area Urban Area and as the fiscal agent for the Approval Authority. San Francisco disburses UASI funds pursuant to the Approval Authority's direction.

Based on the FY 12 UASI grant award, the Department of Emergency Management (DEM) included \$21,931,312 in the Annual Appropriation Ordinance (AAO). However, for fiscal year 2013, the Bay Area Urban Area was awarded \$22,619,300, an increase of \$687,988 from the 2012 award. This resolution requests approval for the addition of these funds. The term of the grant is from September 1, 2013 through May 31, 2015. The grant funds will be distributed throughout the region for planning, equipment, training, exercise, and organizational initiatives determined by the Approval Authority.

Proposed Resolution

The proposed resolution authorizes the Department of Emergency Management (DEM), on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco as the primary grantee of UASI funds for the Bay Area Urban Area and as the fiscal agent for the UASI Approval Authority, to accept and expend an additional \$687,988 in UASI grant funds for fiscal year 2013 from the United States Department of Homeland Security, through the California Emergency Management Agency. The proposed resolution also authorizes DEM's Executive Director, or designee, to take any steps necessary to accept, distribute and expend the grant funds.

The Department of Emergency Management is pleased to present the following Grant Report in summary of the above-referenced item submitted by the Department of Emergency Management.

Legislation For Approval: The proposed resolution seeks the Board of Supervisors' approval for the acceptance and expenditure of an additional \$687,988 in funds from the Federal Department of Homeland Security (DHS) through the California Office of Emergency Services (CalOES) to provide financial assistance to address the unique planning, equipment, training, exercise, and organizational needs of high-threat, high-density Urban Areas, and assist those areas in building an enhanced and sustainable capacity to prevent, protect against, respond to, and recover from natural or human caused disasters as well as threats and terrorism.

The grant was awarded to the Bay Area UASI from the Department of Homeland Security as a pass through from the California Office of Emergency Services. Based on the FY 12 UASI grant award, the Department included \$21,931,312 in the Annual Appropriation Ordinance (AAO). However, the FY 13 award was actually \$22,619,300, an increase of \$687,988. San Francisco will continue to act as the fiscal agent for all regional Homeland Security Grant funds.

Departments: **Department of Emergency Management (DEM).** Department acts as the fiscal agent and expenditures benefit the Bay Area UASI which includes the City and County of San Francisco, the City of Oakland, and the City of San Jose, as well as the twelve contiguous Bay Area counties and the other Bay Area governmental jurisdictions within those counties.

The Bay Area UASI was established, in grant year FY2006, as a requirement of the Department of Homeland Security for regions to create a governance structure for the distribution of the Urban Area Strategic Initiative grant funding.

The Bay Area UASI is lead by a grant funded general manager and staff consisting of employees from the cities and counties within the Bay Area region. Based on requirements of the grant, as well as recommendations of regional working groups and committees, grants are allocated through a regional Advisory Group and under the policy direction of the Approval Authority, which consists of representatives of the Cities of San Jose, Oakland, and San Francisco, and the Counties of Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, Monterey, Santa Clara, San Francisco, San Mateo, and Sonoma. CalOES also holds a seat on the Approval Authority. The chair of the Approval Authority is the Executive Director of the San Francisco Department of Emergency Management.

As the fiscal agent, DEM would be authorized to accept and expend these additional grant funds on behalf of the Bay Area, and to receive grant reimbursements for expenses incurred on behalf of the region.

DEM is responsible for administering the grant for the Bay Area UASI, ensuring that the grant funds are spent according to the grant guidelines, and ensuring that each of the Bay Area counties and cities that may receive a portion of these grant funds adheres to the grant and financial guidelines.

Each sub-recipient county or city that participates in this grant will enter into a grant MOU with DEM that outlines their obligation under the grant allocation, including requirements for contracting and procurement, record keeping and reimbursement documentation, and adherence to federal grant assurances.

Amount:

The FY 13 grant award represents an increase in the FY 12 award by \$687,988 for a total FY 13 award of \$22,619,300 and is allocated to the above jurisdictions by agreement of the UASI Approval Authority.

Grant Period:

September 1, 2013 through May 31, 2015

Source of funds:

U.S. Department of Homeland Security, through the California Office of Emergency Services. No match is required.

Indirect Costs:

The proposed resolution waives indirect costs, because the grant program does not allow the charging of indirect costs.

Description:

The proposed resolution authorizes the Department of Emergency Management to accept and expend an additional \$687,988 in federal grant funding from the FY 2013 Homeland Security Grant Program (Award # 2013- 00110, OES # 075-95017), issued by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) through the California Office

of Emergency Services (CalOES). This reflects an increase to the \$21,931,312 originally approved in the AAO.

Budget:

The original budget by activity for the subject grant with revised allocation:

(1) <u>Original Equipment Budget:</u>	\$6,143,349
Funds will be used for the purchase of equipment for first responders throughout the region such as: Cyber Security Enhancement Equipment, Terrorism Incident Response Equipment, Interoperable Communications Equipment, Information Technology Equipment, a CBRNE Response vehicle and a passenger van to transport firefighters, CBRNE Logistical Support Equipment, Detection and Decontamination Equipment, personal protective equipment, Incident Management Team equipment, and necessary NERT equipment.	
<u>Additional funds added to equipment budget:</u>	\$62,902
The \$62,902 of additionally awarded funds will be allocated to software maintenance and the purchase of probation data software.	
New Equipment Total:	6,206,251
(2) <u>Original Planning Budget:</u>	\$7,469,987
The original budget amount allocated funds for the continuation of a Metrics/Data Exchange project, the preparation of a Grant Effectiveness strategy, a Medical Volunteers strategic plan for Alameda and a neighborhood support center plan, master response plan updates, and hazard mitigation planning for San Francisco. Additional funding will be used by Alameda, San Mateo, Santa Clara, and Sonoma Counties to pay for multidisciplinary project planning staff. Both the cities of Oakland and San Jose will continue funding multidisciplinary planning staff. DEM will also continue to fund an Emergency Response planner, a Risk Management Planner, and three strategic planners. The San Francisco Fire Department will continue to receive funding for one position to provide updated plans and protocols within their department and the San Francisco Police Department will continue to receive funding for one position to provide updated plans and protocols within their department as well as continued funding for one position for Risk Capability Planning and one position for Critical Infrastructure Planning. The San Francisco GSA will also receive funding for staffing positions to work with the Lifelines Council and Disaster Logistics Planning.	

<u>Additional funds added to Planning Budget:</u>	\$300,000
The \$300,000 of additionally awarded funds will be allocated to Public/Private Partnership planning, Disaster Recovery planning, and SF72, DEM's website planning application.	
New Planning Total:	\$7,769,987
<u>(3) Original Training Budget:</u>	\$2,077,000
The original budget amount represents the planned allocation to conduct regional Rescue Boat Operator Training, regional bomb squad classes, Hazmat training, Earthquake Management Training, Rescue system courses, tactical medicine courses, and various response courses for campus police departments. DEM will continue funding one Training Planner.	
<u>Additional funds added to Training Budget:</u>	
The \$50,500 of additionally awarded funds will be allocated to specialized Training courses for the NCRIC.	\$50,500
New Training Total:	\$2,127,500
<u>(4) Original Exercise Budget:</u>	\$1,700,000
The amount represents the planned allocation for regional exercise planning, supplies, and the conduct of exercises using HSEEP (Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program) guidelines and requirements. DEM will also continue funding two exercise planners and Alameda County will be provided funding to hire an Exercise overhead planning team.	
<u>Additional funds added to the Exercise Budget:</u>	\$150,000
The \$150,000 in additional funds will be allocated for a regional Mass Prophylaxis exercise.	
New Exercise Total:	\$1,850,000
<u>(5) Original Organizational Budget:</u>	\$3,444,411
The original budget amount represents the planned allocation for information sharing and collaboration as well as critical infrastructure protection. This amount pays for salary and fringe costs of regional intelligence analysts that staff the Northern California Regional Intelligence Center (NCRIC).	
<u>Additional funds added to Organizational budget:</u>	\$90,186
The \$90,186 in additional funding will be allocated to the NCRIC to hire a cyber security analyst.	
New Organizational Total:	\$3,534,597

(6) Original Management & Administration Budget: \$1,096,565

The original budget amount for Management and Administration expenses include UASI grant administration staff, line item office expenses, Controller's Accounting, City Attorney, office and equipment maintenance and leases. The amount budgeted reflected 5% of the cash grant, which was the maximum allowable under the guidelines.

Additional funds added to the Management and Administration Budget:

\$34,400

The additional \$34,400 will be allocated to office supplies and equipment maintenance and leases. This amount, when added to the original budget amount totals 5% of the grant award, the maximum allowable under the guidelines.




