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11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:
12	Section 1. Findings.
13	(a) Ordinance No. 296-06 adopted Administrative Code Section 12X.6 to establish
14	the Community Oversight Committee regarding enforcement of marijuana offenses. The
15	ordinance charged the Committee with the responsibility for monitoring and reporting to the
16	Board of Supervisors regarding the City's implementation of Administrative Code Chapter
17	12X, Policy Making Marijuana Offenses the Lowest Law Enforcement Priority, and
18	recommending policy changes to further the purposes of that Chapter.
19	(b) Rule 2.21 of the Board of Supervisors' Rules of Order requires the Clerk of the
20	Board to determine and identify each year every subordinate body that has not met at least
21	once every four months, and to ask the City Attorney to prepare legislation repealing the
22	ordinance or resolution that created the body.
23	(c) The Clerk of the Board has determined that the Community Oversight
24	Committee regarding enforcement of marijuana offenses has not met in more than four
25	months.

Section 2. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by deleting Section 12X.6, to
 read as follows:

- SEC. 12X.6. COMMUNITY OVERSIGHT. 3 -(a) An advisory Community Oversight Committee shall monitor the implementation of 4 section 12X of the Administrative Code. The Community Oversight Committee shall consist of seven 5 voting members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Members shall serve at the pleasure of the 6 7 Board of Supervisors, for a term of two years. The Board shall appoint one member with each of the 8 following qualifications or backgrounds: 9 (1) One medical cannabis patient; (2) One member of the public defender's office: 10 (3) One representative of a medical cannabis dispensary operating in San Francisco; 11 12 (4) One civil liberties advocate; 13 (5) One harm reduction practitioner: 14 (6) One representative of a drug policy reform organization; and 15 (7) One representative from any of the following categories: juvenile justice advocate, advocate for homeless persons, resident of public housing, or representative of an organization 16 17 providing services to or advocating on behalf of residents of public housing in San Francisco. 18 (b) The Police Department, the Department of Public Health and the District Attorney are 19 encouraged to send one representative as a non-voting liaison to the advisory committee. -(c) At the initial meeting of the advisory committee, and annually thereafter, the committee 20 21 shall select a chairperson, and any other officers deemed necessary by the committee. Consistent with the requirements of state and local law, the committee shall establish rules for its own organization. All 22 23 meetings shall be open to the public, except as provided by law. 24 -(d) The Community Oversight Committee shall:

1 (1) Monitor the implementation of this Ordinance by gathering information, with the 2 cooperation of the San Francisco Police Department and other law enforcement agencies. 3 (2) Receive statements from individuals who believe they were subjected to law enforcement activity contrary to the lowest law enforcement priority policy. 4 5 6 to report all adult marijuana arrests, citation, and property seizures, and all instances of officers 7 assisting in federal arrests, citations, and property seizures for any marijuana offenses by adults within 8 the City and County of San Francisco. The Community Oversight Committee shall design the 9 supplemental report with the goal of allowing the Committee to ascertain whether San Francisco law 10 enforcement officers followed the lowest law enforcement priority policy. (4) Request additional information from any San Francisco Law Enforcement Officer who 11 12 engaged in law enforcement activity relating to one or more marijuana offenses under circumstances 13 that appear to violate the lowest law enforcement priority policy. An officer's decision not to provide 14 additional information shall not be grounds for discipline. 15 (5) Submit written reports semi-annually to the San Francisco Board of Supervisors on the 16 implementation of this Ordinance. The Community Oversight Committee shall submit the first report no 17 later than nine months after the effective date of this ordinance. The report shall include but not 18 necessarily be limited to: the number of arrests, citations, property seizures, and prosecutions of adults for marijuana offenses in the City and County of San Francisco; the breakdown of marijuana arrests 19 20 and citations of adults by race, age, specific charge, and classification as infraction, misdemeanor, or 21 felony; any instances of law enforcement activity that the Committee believes violated the lowest law enforcement priority policy; and the estimated time and money spent by the City and County on law 22 23 enforcement and punishment of adults for marijuana offenses. The report shall comply with all state 24 and local confidentiality laws.

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(6) Within one year of the effective date of this Ordinance, make recommendations to the

- 2 *Police Department and Police Commission regarding regulations for implementing this Ordinance.*
- 3 (7) Recommend to the Board of Supervisors policy changes that would further the purposes
 4 of this Chapter.
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Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

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11 Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors 12 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, 13 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal 14 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment 15 additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under 16 the official title of the ordinance.
