[Urging Temporary	Protected	Status for	or the	Philippines]
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Resolution urging the Secretary of State and the United States Department of Homeland Security to grant Temporary Protected Status to the Philippines in order to support the recovery effort in the aftermath of Super Typhoon Haiyan.

WHEREAS, The United States and the Philippines have maintained a close bilateral relationship for over 60 years; and

WHEREAS, On November 8, 2013, Super Typhoon Haiyan struck the Philippines, affecting 16 million people, and killing over 6,000 individuals, and completely destroying dozens of the Philippines' poorest towns and villages, leaving over 4.1 million homeless to flee throughout the country in search for a safe haven and livelihood; and

WHEREAS, The Filipino community in United States is the largest outside the Philippines, with 3.4 million in the continental United States, 1,474,707 in California, 463,458 throughout the Bay Area, and 42,499 in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Numerous countries including the United States have issued coordinated responses to aid the Philippines by providing disaster relief experts and military personnel to distribute food, water, medicine, and shelter to those hit hardest by the storm, as well as more than \$37 million in humanitarian aid; and

WHEREAS, There has been an unprecedented grassroots response from individuals, schools, unions, community organizations, and businesses to provide immediate relief to survivors of Super Typhoon Haiyan through monetary and material donations and the sending of health professionals and other volunteers to impacted communities; and

WHEREAS, The Philippine government estimates the recovery costs from the damage caused by Super Typhoon Haiyan to be \$401,000,000,000; and

WHEREAS, Under Federal law, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) may designate a foreign country for Temporary Protected Status under the following circumstances: (i) on- going armed conflict; (ii) temporary effects of an environmental disaster, or (iii) other extraordinary and temporary conditions preventing the country's nationals living in the United States from safely returning to their home country; and

WHEREAS, The United States has granted Temporary Protected Status to nationals from El Salvador, Haiti, Honduras, Nicaragua, Somalia, Sudan, South Sudan, and Syria, whose homelands are suffering crises ranging from on-going armed conflicts to extraordinary natural disasters; and

WHEREAS, On December 13, 2013, the Philippine government formally requested that the United States government grant them Temporary Protected Status to temporarily stop the deportation of Filipino nationals; and

WHEREAS, The devastated Philippine economy will be not be able to absorb deported Filipino nationals from the United States while it is struggling to recover; and

WHEREAS, If granted Temporary Protected Status, Filipino nationals will be able to continue to work and send aid to their family members and typhoon survivors as well as support the rebuilding and recovery of devastated regions; and

WHEREAS, Granting Temporary Protected Status maintains and grows the mutual trust and bond the Philippines and the United States have developed over decades; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the DHS to grant Temporary Protected Status to the Philippines as the nation works to restore itself from the devastation of Super Typhoon Haiyan; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors directs the Clerk of the Board to forward the approved resolution to the Secretary of State and the Department of Homeland Security.
