Board Qualifications:

The Developmental Disabilities Area Board consists of fifteen (15) members, two (2) of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The composition of the members are as follows: two (2) voting members appointed by the governing body of each of the five (5) counties (Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco and San Mateo), and five (5) members appointed by the Governor.

Appointees must have demonstrated interest and leadership in human services activities, and be selected from the following groups in the following proportions, to the extent feasible: 1) sixty percent (60%) from persons with developmental disabilities or the immediate relatives, guardians, or conservators of these persons; and 2) forty percent (40%) from representatives of the general public. They shall not be employees of a state, local, or private agency or facility that provides service to a person with a developmental disability, or be a member of the governing board of any entity providing this service when the service is funded in whole or in part with state funds. This disqualification shall not include: 1) a parent, relative, guardian, or conservator who receives public funds expressly for the purpose of providing direct services to his/her child, relative, ward, or conservatee who is a person with a developmental disability; 2) a person with a developmental disability who receives employment services through a provider receiving state or federal funds; or 3) a person who serves as a member of the state council.

The Area Board is one of thirteen (13) federally funded Boards established by California state law to protect and advocate for the rights of persons with developmental disabilities. The Board

is responsible for advocacy, monitoring, training, planning, resource development, public education, and public information on behalf of persons with developmental disabilities living in Alameda, Contra Costa, Marin, San Francisco and San Mateo counties. The Board does not operate or fund any direct social or health care services. The purpose is to carry out the responsibilities and duties assigned to it by the Lanterman Act and the State Plan under the Federal Developmental Disabilities Act.

Term of Office: Members may serve no more than two consecutive three-year terms. If a member is appointed to fill another member's unexpired term, the months served in the unexpired term shall not be counted towards the maximum of six years of service as an Area Board member.
