One-Hundred Forty Nine years ago today, March 4th, 1865, President Lincoln gave his second inaugural address to a gathering of citizens in a muddy Pennsylvania field. During his speech, he called upon Americans to heal from the wounds of war, to have charity for all, and "to care for him who have borne the battle." While San Francisco has always been a peaceful and charitable city, many honorable veterans remain homeless, jobless and in need of medical services.

I would like to join the effort to care for the veterans in our community and I respectfully request consideration for appointment to the San Francisco Veteran's Affairs Commission.

As a military veteran, urban planner and San Francisco business owner, I have the experience, insight and expertise to help veterans live, work and thrive in our great City through my contributions on the Commission. In my work as an urban planner, I have become keenly aware of the challenges veterans face in finding affordable housing in a competitive real estate market. I have a proven ability to analyze legislative policy and understand the housing development process. This will be a useful skill to better inform legislators and other decision-makers on the impacts to veterans.

When men and women leave military service to rejoin their communities, there should be jobs available that match their abilities. San Francisco is rich in opportunities in education and innovation. I have personally experienced the transformative journey from soldier, to student, to innovative business owner. The San Francisco VA Medical Center is an invaluable resource to veterans from San Francisco and throughout northern California. Its staff is top notch in their mission to provide medical support to veterans and I rely on the Center for my own medical care. The staff is an impressive collection of skilled men and women who are committed to serving the needs of veterans. The patients are equally impressive as they are the men and women who's service ensured that our rights and civil liberties are protected. Through my experience as an urban planner, I believe that I can contribute to the Commission by analyzing policy matters that could improve the delivery of critical medical services including the transportation needs of patients and staff.

Sadly, President Lincoln was assassinated only six weeks after giving his second inaugural address but his uncompromising passion for honoring veterans lives on through the hard work of the Veteran's Affairs Commission, service organizations, care providers and everyday San Franciscans. I look forward to doing my part in this effort and serving as a Member of the San Francisco Veteran's Affairs Commission.

State your qualifications

I have several veterans in my family. My father told stories of swimming for safety through oil fires in the waters of Pearl Harbor. My brother solemnly received the bodies of young men fallen in Southeast Asia as a member of the Army service color corps during Vietnam. My uncles strutted in their brown uniforms while in segregated regimens in World War II. And, like my father, brother and uncles before me, I proudly served my country during the first Gulf War. Immediately after my Honorable Discharge in 1992, the VA Center in San Francisco uniquely supported my transition into civilian life by providing services to me through another woman veteran. She successfully guided me through a complex bureaucratic maze to acquire tailored services that fit me perfectly.

The VA Center's multiple support tools were the impetus and enabler for a college education and successful 22-year federal career. The opportunity to give back what I was given is one of the reasons I am seeking to serve veterans on the VA commission.

My experience also impressed on me that value of ensuring other women veterans receive comparable treatment.

Currently I serve on the Equity Advisory Committee of San Francisco Human Rights Commission advocating support for Reentry populations as a member of the Out Migration Subcommittee. I am aware of veterans' disproportionate contact with the criminal justice system and I hope to reverse this trend.

I am a graduate of Urban Habitat's Boards, Commissions and Leadership Institute (BCLI), an institute known for training and seating many conscientious community members on influential boards throughout the Bay Area.

Board Qualifications:

The Veterans Affairs Commission consists of a total of seventeen (17) members, twelve (12) of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and five (5) of whom are appointed by the Mayor as follows:

- At least three (3) must be women veterans (at least two (2) members shall be appointed by the Board):
- Two (2) members who served in the Armed Forces of the United States and who have a physical disability arising from that service (the Mayor and Board of Supervisors shall each appoint at least one (1) member), in accordance with the definitions applied in such cases by the Veterans' Administration; and
- All members shall reside in the City and County of San Francisco. The Board of Supervisors may only waive this requirement by Ordinance.

The term of each member of the Commission shall be four (4) years; provided, however, that the members first appointed shall, by lot, classify their terms so that three (3) members shall serve a one-year term, four (4) members shall serve a two-year term, four (4) members shall serve a three-year term and four (4) members shall serve a four-year term. On the expiration of these and all successive terms, their successors shall be appointed for a four-year term in a manner similar to that described for the initial members. In the event a vacancy occurs during the term of office of any member, a successor shall be appointed for the unexpired portion of the term of the office vacated in a manner similar to that described for the initial members.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The Commission shall directly advise the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors on all matters affecting veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States of America, on the problems, interests and needs of veterans who are residents of the City and County of San Francisco and on the coordination of economic development, health care, and social services programs as they relate to veterans who are residents of the City and County of San Francisco.

The Commission shall have the power and duty to:

- Hold hearings and submit recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor regarding the problems, interests, and needs of veterans; and
- Make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor concerning the coordination of economic development health care and social services programs as they relate to veterans who are residents of the City and County of San Francisco.

Reports: The Commission shall render an annual written report of its activities to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor.
