

I would like to express my sincerest apologies that I am unable to get time off work to attend the Rules Committee re-appointment hearing for seat #10 on the Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee. I would truly appreciate your endorsement and continued support in my re-appointment to PSAC.

Following my appointment two years ago to this Committee, I was elected as the Chairman only four months into my tenure. I have had the honor as serving as the Chairman for over one year now and was re-elected this past January. Here are just a few of the accomplishments achieved under my leadership last year.

- 1) We had 55 guest speakers in 2013 averaging five presenters at each meeting.
- 2) We have a new website and new app for smartphones.
- 3) We have numerous new members now totaling 20 people serving on our Committee.

Regarding the re-appointment of Mr. Howard Strassner to seat #6, I strongly oppose him being allowed to continue as a member of PSAC. Unfortunately, Mr. Strassner has been nothing but trouble causing countless problems for me as Chair and amongst members. I and the Vice Chair were forced to officially report Mr. Strassner to the Ethics Commission for routinely violating the Sunshine Ordinance and Brown Act. Their investigation is still pending. Mr. Strassner has been extremely disruptive during meetings, rude, stormed out of a meeting, and has never once represented a transit or environmental organization. Mr. Strassner does not deserve to be re-appointed to PSAC, and our Committee would be much stronger, happier and more effective if Mr. Strassner's re-appointment request is denied.



#### **Board Qualifications:**

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee shall consist of twenty-three (23) voting members. The Board of Supervisors shall appoint twenty-one members from the following categories: two representatives from pedestrian safety organizations; two representatives from a senior or disability organization; one representative from bicycle or other non-motorized wheeled personal transport organization; one representative from transit or environmental organization; one representative from child advocate or school support organizations; one representative from a public health organization; two at-large representatives; eleven (11) persons appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors. Each member of the Board shall appoint a representative who resides in his or her district.

The Superintendent of Schools shall appoint two members, one of whom shall be a student and one of whom shall be a parent.

In addition to the twenty-three voting members, the following City Departments shall select a non-voting representative: Public Health; Municipal Transportation Agency; Public Works; Planning; Police; Recreation and Parks; District Attorney's Office; the Mayor's Office on Disability; and any other City departments whose work impacts pedestrians.

Advisory Committee members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. In addition, an Advisory Committee member's term shall expire by operation of law upon the issuance by the clerk of the Committee a notification adopted by the Advisory Committee

certifying that the member in question has three consecutive unexcused absences from meetings of the Advisory Committee.

The term of each Advisory Committee member shall be two years. However, half of the members will serve an initial one year term and half will serve a two year term to be determined by lot.

The Pedestrian Safety Advisory Committee shall (1) Make recommendations to the Board of Supervisors and other City departments in order to improve pedestrian safety and ambiance; (2) Develop concepts and review policies and planning efforts regarding pedestrian improvements; (3) Make recommendations on funding opportunities and priorities; (4) Review and make recommendations on policies and programs related to pedestrians in the Transportation Element of the Master Plan of the City and County of San Francisco; (5) Support the development of a Pedestrian Master Plan.

The Board of Supervisors urged the Municipal Transportation Agency to support the Advisory Committee with funding and staff resources and to present a monthly interdepartmental report to the Advisory Committee.

Report: The Committee shall report to the Board of Supervisors on an annual basis, with quarterly appearances before the Board of Supervisors as needed, on statistics on pedestrians injury and fatality statistics, causes of pedestrian injuries and fatalities, recommendations for changes in policies, funding and enforcement, and other pertinent issues.

Within six months of the appointment of members of the Advisory Committee as newly constituted by File No. 070082, the Committee shall report to the Board of Supervisors, in writing, as to the number of meetings for which the Advisory Committee has had a quorum.
