12	electronic monitoring of and case management services for inmates for \$2,000,000 and an
13	original term of 3 years from May 1, 2014, to April 30, 2017, with two one-year options to
14	extend the term; and
15	WHEREAS, the Civil Service Commission approved Professional Services Contract
16	48796-13/14 on March 3, 2014; and
17	WHEREAS, California Penal Code, Sections 1203.016 and 1203.018 authorize the
18	Sheriff to expand the use of home detention with electronic monitoring for sentenced and

WHEREAS, The Sheriff's Department has prepared this proposed Agreement to enter into contract with LCA to administer a home detention program with electronic monitoring, which includes in the scope of work the rules and regulations of the program and which includes a provision requiring that the contractor demonstrate evidence of financial responsibility by maintaining a current liability insurance policy in amounts and under conditions sufficient to fully indemnify the City and County of San Francisco for reasonably foreseeable public liability, including legal defense costs, that may arise from, or be proximately caused by, acts or omissions of the contractor, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. ______, and which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Sheriff's Department to execute the Agreement with LCA in an amount not-to-exceed \$2,000,000 and for an original term from May 1, 2014, to April 30, 2017; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, the Sheriff will submit annually the rules and regulations of the home detention and electronic monitoring program for review and approval by the Board of Supervisors; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Sheriff will perform an annual review of the evidence of financial responsibility, which for this Agreement shall be the certificate of insurance required by the Agreement, to ensure compliance with requirements set by the Board of Supervisors and for adjustment of the financial responsibility requirements if warranted by caseload changes or other factors.
