Resolution supporting Assembly Bill 2591, authored by Assemblymember Shirley Weber, the Basic Material Needs for Homeless Children Act.

WHEREAS, During the 2013-2014 school year there were nearly 270,000 homeless children and youth identified in California public schools under the definition provided by the United States McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act; and

WHEREAS, According to government data, academic research, a survey of more than 200 homeless liaisons and various other sources, these students have poorer academic and life outcomes when compared to their affluent peers; and

WHEREAS, A significant hardship that contributes to these poor outcomes as identified by many of these sources is an absence of access to basic material needs such as school supplies, toiletries, shoes, clothes, dental supplies and other materials; and

WHEREAS, Organizations which would be funded under this proposed legislation have effectively aided tens of thousands of children in dozens of schools in San Francisco and elsewhere in the state; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has established ties to nonprofit community benefit organizations to create public-private partnerships to address the material needs of homeless and low-income children; and

WHEREAS, These nonprofit and private partners in the community have sponsored Assembly Bill 2591, the Basic Material Needs for Homeless Children Act, authored by Assemblymember Shirley Weber and coauthored by Assembly member Nancy Skinner; and

WHEREAS, AB 2591 will provide additional funding to the San Francisco Human Services Agency to provide basic material needs assistance to homeless children by

partnering with various nonprofits, including homeless shelters and domestic violence shelters; and

WHEREAS, AB 2591 would enable social service agencies throughout California to meet the basic material needs of homeless children and youth throughout California; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco urges the Bay Area state delegation to support Assembly Bill 2591, the Basic Material Needs for Homeless Children Act.
