[Park Code - Rights in Permits]

Ordinance amending the Park Code to distinguish rights in permits for areas and facilities o pen to the public and rights in permits for events closed to the public; and making en vironmental findings.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco: Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 131087 and is incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. The Park Code is hereby amended by revising Section 7.15, and adding Section 7.15-1, to read as follows:

SEC. 7.15. PERMITS- RIGHTS GRANTED EVENTS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC.

(a) Any person possessing a valid permit, which states that an area <u>or facility</u> has been reserved for such person's use <u>other than for an event covered by Section 7.15-1</u>, has the <u>exclusive</u> right to use the area or facility <u>specified designated</u> in the permit for the time specified.

<u>(b)</u> Iz shall be unlawful for any person to refuse to leave an area or facility which has been reserved by a valid permit when asked to do so by the person or party displaying such permit, by a Recreation arnd Park Department employee, by a police officer, or by a member of the Park Patrol, and

 $\frac{74N}{2}$ person shall in any manner disturb or interfere with any person or party occupying the area <u>or facility</u> under a permit <u>described in subsection (a)</u>, nor with the belongings of such person or party.

(c) It shall be unlawful for a person who violates subsection (b) to refuse to leave an area or facility that has been reserved by a valid permit when asked to do so by the person or party displaying such a permit, by a Recreation and Park Department employee, by a police officer, or by a member of the Park Patrol.

(d) This Section shall not be used to impinge upon the lawful exercise of constitutionally protected rights of freedom of speech or assembly.

SEC. 7.15-1. PERMITS – EVENTS CLOSED TO THE PUBLIC.

(a) Any person possessing a valid permit, which states that an area or facility has been reserved for such person's use to conduct an event that is not open to the general public, such as a ticketed or guest-list event or an event limited to the members of an organization and their invitees. has the exclusive right to use the area or facility designated in the permit for the time specified.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to refuse to leave an area or facility under a permit as described in subsection (a) when asked to do so by the person or party displaying such a permit, by a Recreation and Park Department employee, by a police officer, or by a member of the Park Patrol.

(c) This Section shall not be used to engage in conduct otherwise prohibited by law, including but not limited to anti-discrimination laws.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

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Section 4. In enacting this ordinance, the Board intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Park Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the ordinance.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Park Code - Rights in Permits]

Ordinance amending the Park Code to distinguish rights in permits for areas and facilities open to the public and rights in permits for events closed to the public; and making environmental findings.

Existing Law

The Park Code gives any person with a valid permit to use park property, issued by the Recreation and Park Department, the exclusive right to use that space for the time specified. (Park Code Sec. 7.15.) It is unlawful for a person to refuse to leave space reserved by a permit when asked to do so by the permitholder, a Recreation and Park Department employee, a police officer, or a member of the Park Patrol, or for a person to disturb or interfere with a permit-holder's use of the permitted space.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposal would amend Section 7.15 of the Park Code to distinguish between the rights granted to individuals who have a valid permit issued by the Recreation and Park Department to use park property to conduct a private event, and the rights granted to individuals who have a valid permit issued by the Recreation and Park Department to use park property while the park property is otherwise open to the public.

The proposal would make it unlawful for a person to refuse to leave a public event on park property only when that person is disturbing or interfering with the permit-holder's event or use of the property. The proposal would also clarify that this provision may not be used to impinge upon the lawful exercise of constitutionally protected rights of freedom of speech or assembly.

For private events, the ordinance would make it unlawful for any person to refuse to leave a private event when asked to do so. (See Park Code Sec. 7.15-1.) The proposal would also provide that this provision may not be used to engage in conduct otherwise prohibited by law, including but not limited to anti-discrimination laws.
