Proposed Grant Project Summary: The San Francisco Office of the Public Defender continues to expand and improve holistic representation of its Juvenile Unit through the implementation of a Legal Educational Advocacy Program (LEAP). The Public Defender represents the educational needs of clients on the delinquency caseload and at the Principal Center Collaborative Court School (PCC), San Francisco's court ordered probation school, in order to address the long standing histories of truancy, absenteeism, and failing school placements which are pervasive among court-involved youth.
