

DAH Target Population

Eligibility Criteria

- Homeless
- Mental health diagnosis, substance abuse diagnosis, and/or complex medical needs
- Extremely low income
- Agree to pay percentage of income toward rent via third party rent payment provider
- City and County of San Francisco residents

> Access Points

- Acute and psychiatric hospital
- Long Term Care
- Intensive Case Management
- Treatment Programs
- Primary Care Clinics
- Medical Respite and Sobering Center
- Street Outreach Teams

Service-Enriched Housing

- Support Services staff actively engage residents to help individuals make choices that reduce their physical, psychiatric, and social harm.
- Tailored on-site support
 - Case management and care planning
 - Access to and maintenance of benefits
 - Access to and maintenance of medical and behavioral health services
 - Substance abuse, mental health, life skills counseling
 - Nurse management and medication management
 - Community groups and community building social activities
 - Secure food and clothing
 - Educational/vocational connections
 - Assistance with housing stability
