Resolution declaring the month of May 2014 as Building Safety Month in the City and County of San Francisco and encouraging San Francisco residents to fully participate in Building Safety Month activities.

WHEREAS, San Francisco and the State of California are continuing multiple efforts to address critical issues of safety, energy efficiency, and resilience in the built environment that affect our residents, both in everyday life and in times of natural disaster, and are taking active steps to strengthen public confidence in the safety of our structures; and

WHEREAS, These International Codes, the most widely adopted building safety, energy and fire prevention codes in the nation, are used by most U.S. cities, counties and states, and help protect the public from natural disasters such as hurricanes, snowstorms, tornadoes, wildfires and earthquakes when impacted; and
