Attached, please find an original and two copies of a proposed resolution for Board of Supervisors approval. Approval would allow the Department of Public Health (DPH) to execute an amended Fiscal Year (FY) 2013-14 contract with the California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to provide substance use disorder services. Specifically, the amendment would (1) modify the contract Terms and Conditions and (2) increase funding by \$1,674,211 for FY 2013-14. Under the amended contract, DPH would provide more of the same services outlined in the original contract.
