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4	Describing and setting forth a proposal to the voters at an election to be held on November
5	4, 2014 to amend the Charter of the City and County of San Francisco to require the
6	Department of Elections to call a special election when there is a vacancy in the office of
7	Mayor, Assessor-Recorder, City Attorney, District Attorney, Public Defender, Sheriff,
8	Treasurer, or Member of the Board of Supervisors, unless a general municipal election for
9	the vacated seat is regularly scheduled to be held less than a year after the vacancy; and to
10	authorize the Board of Education and the Governing Board of the Community College
11	District to make appointments to fill vacancies on their respective boards to serve until a
12	successor is elected at a regularly scheduled election.
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14	The Board of Supervisors hereby submits to the qualified voters of the City and County,
15	at an election to be held on November 4, 2014, a proposal to amend the Charter of the City and
16	County by revising Sections 3.100 and 13.101.5 and Article XVII, to read as follows:

23	The Mayor shall be the chief executive officer and the official representative of the City
24	and County, and shall serve full time in that capacity. The Mayor shall devote his or her entire
25	time and attention to the duties of the office, and shall not devote time or attention to any other

1	occupation or business activity. The Mayor shall enforce all laws relating to the City and County,
2	and accept service of process on its behalf.
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4	The Mayor shall have the power to:

6	15. Make an appointment to fill any vacancy in an elective office of the City and County
7	until a successor shall have been elected;
8	1615. Subject to the provisions of Charter Section 2.113, submit to the voters a

24	(a) If the office of Assessor-Recorder, City Attorney, District Attorney, Public
25	Defender, Sheriff, Treasurer, or Member of the Board of Supervisors, Board of Education or

Governing Board of the Community College District becomes vacant because of death, 1 2 resignation, recall, permanent disability, or the inability of the respective officer to otherwise carry out the responsibilities of the office, the office shall remain vacant until a successor is 3 4 elected as provided in this Section. Mayor shall appoint an individual qualified to fill the 5 vacancy under this Charter and state laws. (b) If the Office of Mayor becomes vacant because of death, resignation, recall, 6 7 permanent disability or the inability to carry out the responsibilities of the office, the President of 8 the Board of Supervisors shall become Acting Mayor and shall serve until a successor is elected 9 as provided in this Section. until a successor is appointed by the Board of Supervisors. 10 (c) Any person filling a vacancy pursuant to subsection (a) or (b) of this Section shall serve until a successor is selected at the next election occurring not less than 120 days after the 11 12 vacancy, at which time an election shall be held to fill the unexpired term, provided that (1) if an 13 election for the vacated office is scheduled to occur less than one year after the vacancy, the 14 appointee shall serve until a successor is selected at that election or (2) if an election for any seat on the same board as the vacated seat is scheduled to occur less than one year but at least 15 16 120 days after the vacancy, the appointee shall serve until a successor is selected at that election 17 to fill the unexpired term. 18 (c) If an office becomes vacant as provided in subsection (a) or (b), within 14 days of the 19 vacancy the Director of Elections shall call a special municipal election to fill the vacancy. (1) The special municipal election required by this Subsection (c) shall be held 20 21 not less than 105 days nor more than 120 days from the date of its calling, unless the date of the 22 special municipal election is within 105 days of a general municipal or statewide election, in which event the special municipal election shall be consolidated with the general municipal or 23 24 statewide election.

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1	(2) Notwithstanding Subsection (c)(1), if an election for the vacated office is
2	scheduled to occur less than one year after the vacancy, no special municipal election shall be
3	held, and a successor to that office shall be elected at that general municipal election.
4	(d) When the office of Member of the Board of Supervisors becomes vacant, the Clerk of
5	the Board of Supervisors shall designate and supervise staff responsible for making reasonable
6	efforts to respond to inquiries from members of the public in the supervisorial district as to
7	which the office is vacant, to keep residents and community organizations in the district apprised
8	of City business related to that district, and to keep a district office open in City Hall on average
9	at least 20 hours a week, until a successor is elected. In calculating the number of votes
10	required for any act by the Board of Supervisors while the office is vacant, the Board of
11	Supervisors shall be counted as having eleven members, notwithstanding the vacancy in the
12	office.
13	(e) If the office of Member of the Board of Education or Governing Board of the
14	Community College District becomes vacant because of death, resignation, recall, permanent
15	disability, or the inability of the respective officer to otherwise carry out the responsibilities of
16	the office, the board on which the vacancy occurs shall appoint an individual qualified to fill the
17	vacancy under this Charter and state laws. Any person filling a vacancy pursuant to this
18	subsection (e) shall serve until a successor is selected at the next election occurring not less than
19	120 days after the vacancy, at which time an election shall be held to fill the unexpired term,
20	provided that (1) if an election for the vacated office is scheduled to occur less than one year
21	after the vacancy, the appointee shall serve until a successor is selected at that election or (2) if
22	an election for any seat on the same board as the vacated seat is scheduled to occur less than
23	one year but at least 120 days after the vacancy, the appointee shall serve until a successor is
24	selected at that election to fill the unexpired term.
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1	(f) This Section shall apply to vacancies that occur after November 4, 2014. If a vacancy
2	in an office listed in this Section occurs after November 4, 2014 and the Mayor or Board of
3	Supervisors appoints an individual to fill that vacancy before the effective date of the Charter
4	amendment amending this Section 13.101.5 at the November 4, 2014 election, the appointee
5	shall vacate the office by operation of law on the effective date of the Charter amendment, and
6	the vacancy shall be filled as provided in this Section.
7	(d) If no candidate receives a majority of the votes cast at an election to fill a vacated
8	office, the two candidates receiving the most votes shall qualify to have their names placed on
9	the ballot for a municipal runoff election at the next regular or otherwise scheduled election
10	occurring not less than five weeks later. If an instant runoff election process is enacted for the
11	offices enumerated in this Section, that process shall apply to any election required by this
12	Section.
