Elinore Lurie, Ph.D., Candidate for District 2 Advisory Council to the Commission on Aging

Elinore Lurie, Ph.D., received her Ph.D. in Sociology from Columbia University in 1970. She specialized in gerontology and in research on services to the elderly throughout her career, conducting research in applied and community-based settings, such as On Lok (now Lifeways) Senior Health Services and in designing the initial needs assessment for Planning for Elders and an evaluation plan for the Community Living Campaign. Dr. Lurie also taught and conducted research at the University of California, San Francisco, including courses in gerontology. Dr. Lurie has published in these areas, in evaluation research, health services research, in transitional care fot the elderly, and in mental health and aging. Her primary emphasis was on community-based services for the elderly.

Additionally, Dr. Lurie has held office in, organized sessions for, and made presentations at scholarly and professional societies, including the Gerontological Society of America and the American Society on Aging. Dr. Lurie has been the Executive Director of the Society for the Study of Social Problems and the Mental Health Association of San Francisco; a Board Member of San Francisco Suicide Prevention, PECC, and twice President of the Community Living Campaign (CLC). As President and Board Member of both PECC and CLC, she has engaged in advocacy for the elderly and disabled.

Currently Dr. Lurie is Member from District 2, Advisory Committee to the Commission on Aging, San Francisco; Community Member, DAAS Transitions to Home Governing Board; Board Member, Community Living Campaign; Advisory Committee and Transition to Home Committee Member, San Francisco Village. Dr. Lurie has especially enjoyed working with and for Mark Farrell, Supervisor for District 2, and has written a paper describing elderly members of this district, the environment for them, and services availabe in this District. She would like to continue working further and contributing to the Advisory Council to the Commission on Aging, now that she has learned the responsibillities and scope of the work, and is able to contribute effectively.

Elinore Lurie is 79 years old, married with two adult children, and lives in District 2 just north of the Lake Street corridor. She has lived continuously in San Francisco since 1965 and at her present address since 1974. Dr. Lurie is Caucasian, like the majority of residents of District 2. Her husband is a retired psychiatrist whose interests include geriatric and community-based psychiatry. He has also been active in community organizations and has been President of the San Francisco Senior Center (now part of NCPHS.)

#### **Board Qualifications:**

The Advisory Council is not to exceed 22 members (voting members), 11 of whom shall be appointed by the Board of Supervisors and 11 members appointed by the Commission on the Aging. More than 50% of each group of 11 members shall be persons who are 60 years of age or older. The Council shall be representative of the geographic and ethnic populations of the City and County of San Francisco by districts determined by the Commission. The Council shall include service providers, older persons with the greatest socio and economic need, consumers, and others specified by federal regulation.

The Advisory Council members shall be appointed to serve two-year terms. When vacancies occur due to resignation or other causes, they shall be filled by the appointment of a person to fill the unexpired portion of the term by the Commission or corresponding Supervisor.

The Advisory Council shall advise the Commission on the Aging on all matters relating to the development and administration of its area plan and the operations conducted thereunder, including needs assessment, priorities, programs, and budgets, and such other matters relating to the well-being of all senior citizens 60 years of age and older within the scope and spirit of Federal, State and local regulations, laws and ordinances. The Advisory Council member shall be responsible for representing the needs and concerns of all senior citizens in the City and County of San Francisco, duties of which are outlined in the Bylaws.
