[Urging the Establishment of a 30-Day Home Delivered Meals Waitlist Policy]

Resolution urging the City and County of San Francisco to establish a 30-day home delivered meals waitlist policy, and in an emergency, within two to five days.

WHEREAS, On December 12, 2013, it was resolved that the Board of Supervisors and the City and County of San Francisco committed to ensuring that all San Franciscans are food secure and hunger free by 2020; and

WHEREAS, On December 12, 2013, it was resolved that the Department of Aging and Adult Services provide an analysis of the funding required and policies needed to ensure homebound seniors and disabled adults are served within 30 days, and, in an emergency, within 2 to 5 days; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco recognizes that our community benefits when homebound seniors and adults with disabilities live independently without the risk of poor nutrition, neglect or social isolation; and

WHEREAS, The 60+ population is expected to grow 20% between 2010 and 2020 (Census 2010); and

WHEREAS, A recent national study (U.S. Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor & Pensions, 2011) found approximately half of health conditions affecting older persons are related to poor nutrition, often leading to early entry into long-term care facilities; and

WHEREAS, One year of home-delivered meals costs about the same as one day in the hospital, with an average of \$3,949 per day in the United States (2011 Comparative Price Report Medical and Hospital Fees by Country – released by the International Federation of Health Plans); and

WHEREAS, A needs assessment conducted in 2012 by the San Francisco Human Services Agency and Department of Aging and Adult Services showed the gap between the number of meals served and the number of meals needed was approximately 84,000 meals daily; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Aging and Adult Services estimates that an additional 4,972 individuals are living below 200% of poverty with ambulatory, independent living and self-care difficulties and in need of home-delivered meals; and

WHEREAS, Two hundred and thirty-one people are currently on the waitlist for homedelivered meals, and the average wait time is 42 days; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors and the City and County of San Francisco urges the Department of Aging and Adult Services to allocate funding to establish a 30-day home delivered meals waitlist policy, and in an emergency, within two to five days; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, A report on the implementation of the policy and the allocation of funding will be made to the Food Security Task Force and the Board of Supervisors on a quarterly basis.
