MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force, pursuant to the provisions of the San Francisco Administrative Code, Section 67.30, for the terms specified:

Mark Rumold, seat 1, succeeding David Snyder, term expired, must be appointed from names submitted by the local chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists and be an Attorney, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending April 27, 2016.

Ali Winston (residency requirement waived), seat 2, succeeding Richard Knee, term expired, must be appointed from names submitted by the local chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists and be a Journalist, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending April 27, 2016.

Josh Wolf, seat 3, succeeding Kitt Grant, term expired, must be a member of the press or electronic media with an interest in citizen access, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending April 27, 2016.

Allyson Washburn, seat 5, succeeding herself, term expired, must be appointed from names submitted by the League of Women, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending April 27, 2016.

Lee Hepner, seat 7, succeeding David Sims, term expired, must be experienced in consumer advocacy, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending April 27, 2016.

Chris Hyland, seat 9, succeeding himself, term expired, must be a member of the public who has demonstrated interest in or has experience in the issues of citizen access and participation in local government, for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending April 27, 2016.

FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 1. The membership of the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- Applicant Ali Winston, new appointment, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a person with experience that uniquely qualifies him to serve on the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force.
- 3. Qualifications, Professional Experience, and Civic Activities

I am currently an attorney at the Electronic Frontier Foundation (EFF). EFF is a San Francisco-based, member-supported non-profit dedicated to protecting civil liberties in the digital world. As part of its mission, EFF works to educate lawmakers, courts, and the public on issues related to open government, free speech, innovation, and privacy, and the various ways technology can enhance and compromise those fundamental values.

My work at EFF focuses almost exclusively on issues related to government transparency in the national security context. I frequently litigate cases under the federal Freedom of Information Act, and I am intimately familiar with the process of filing public records requests at both the state and federal level. Through my work at EFF, I have also written amicus briefs in cases addressing novel issues related to freedom of information laws, transparency, and open government. As a result of this work, I understand both the promise of, and obstacles to, truly effective application of public record laws and transparent government.

I am also keenly interested in local government, and I am hopeful that serving on the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force will provide an opportunity to apply my knowledge of transparency laws and open government to meaningfully contribute to the San Francisco community. Local government's close relationship with citizens provides a tremendous opportunity for greater accountability and responsiveness from government — qualities that ultimately lead to a better and more participatory democracy. I am hopeful to contribute, even in a small way, to the promise of local government by serving on the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force.

Dear Supervisors:

The Society of Professional Journalists, Northern California Professional Chapter ("SPJ NorCal") is pleased to nominate Mark Rumold for appointment to the City's Sunshine Ordinance Task Force ("SOTF").

As you know, Section 67.30(a) of the Sunshine Ordinance reserves a voting seat on the SOTF for an attorney nominated by SPJ NorCal, and it stipulates that all SOTF members "must have experience and/or demonstrated interest in the issues of citizen access and participation in local government."

Mr. Rumold is an attorney with the Electronic Frontier Foundation, an organization that advocates actively and effectively for open access to the internet and the free flow of information and ideas thereon. His work has included cases with applicability of the California Public Records Act, one of the Sunshine Ordinance's base bodies of law.

Given the City's ongoing initiative to consolidate and upgrade its electronic records backup, storage and retrieval systems, Mr. Rumold's experience in the digital world and in open data advocacy makes him ideally suited to serve on the SOTF.

We strongly urge you to give favorable consideration to Mr. Rumold's candidacy and to forward his nomination to the full Board as expeditiously as possible. As you know, the seat for which Mr. Rumold is applying is one of two on the SOTF that are vacant. This sometimes makes it difficult to muster a quorum and therefore to fulfill the SOTF's mission and conduct the business the City has entrusted to it.

I will be unable to attend the Rules Committee hearing on June 5th because I will be out of the country for one week, but I have requested someone from NAM to attend on my behalf if that works with their schedule. If not, I hope that this written statement will suffice and I can meet any of you once I am back on June 9th. Today, I met with Supervisor Katy Tang, Jen Low, Legislative Aide for Supervisor Norman Yee and Hillary Ronen, Legislative Aide for Supervisor David Campos. I shared with them that I had an excellent experience working at India West, which is a major Indian American newspaper in the bay area. In that capacity, I covered community events in San Francisco in the areas of business, politics, education and the arts. I also worked on business development and advertising. In my current job as Program Coordinator for the Wadhwani Foundation (a philanthropic foundation), I work on building partnerships with community colleges, businesses, community based organizations and workforce investment boards to enhance occupation training programs through education technology. 

In English:

Chair Yee, Members Tang and Campos,

My name is Chris Hyland and I am the incumbent for Seat 9 on the Task Force. Thank you for having us appear before you once again, and working expeditiously to fill these important seats. With my opening greetings in 3 languages I wanted to emphasize my multi-racial and diverse background, a fact that I failed to mention 2 weeks ago, but did so 2 years ago when the previous Rules Committee selected me for Seat 9. My mother is of Turkish decent (my Grandmother was of Turkish-Mongolian origin), and my father is Irish-German-American.

My father was also an ambassador for the United Nations, and in the first 20 years of my life I lived in 5 different countries including Turkey, Sudan, Bangladesh, Oman and Yemen. I also attended boarding school in the United Kingdom. These were formative years and instilled in me an appreciation for different cultures and the ability to interact with people from all walks of life. - My degrees are in English & Psychology from Georgetown University, and I have an MBA from Johns Hopkins University. I was trained as a paralegal and have some understanding of the law. This training has all been very useful navigating through the cases we hear on the task force, narrowing the focus of discussions, and in crafting the minutes of our task force and sub committees.

Chair Yee, Members Tang and Campos,

I wanted to send you a brief note of thanks for your time hearing the lengthy comments of all the applicants (and public comments) for the SOTF open positions yesterday. Thank you in particular to Chair Yee for supporting my reappointment to seat 9.

I promised to be brief when my turn came up to speak and i feel i have more to add here by email in the hopes of persuading Members Campos and Tang to also support me for a 2nd term.

For the benefit of Member Campos i will summarize my statement below, and then add a few more points that i hope will sway the balance.

- I started out by thanking Richard Knee (our professor emeritus) for his 12 years of service and underscored how important his institutional knowledge was in helping all of us new members over the past 2 years.
- I stated that i introduced the idea that we should have special meetings to put a dent into the back log of cases that we inherited and we have been successfully doing that for the past 9 months (and continue to do so).
- I handed the Committee Members and the Clerk an attendance sheet that our clerk put together. I emphasized the fact that i have one of the best (if not the best) attendance records. I have no children, just pets, and have my own business so am able to meet the needs of both the regular and special meetings. I also serve on not one but two committees the Education & Outreach and the Rules Committee.
- Anticipating Member Tang's question as to what i would like to change within the SOTF i noted that in the absence of televised coverage for our meetings i was hoping (if re-elected) to reactivate the Technology Committee so as to provide a snapshot through our website of a "day in the life of the SOTF". I also have a technology background (I am an Information Technology Recruiter) and i envisaged a portal for both the first time complainant, as well as the Custodians of Records in our city departments. This exposure to different cultures early on has allowed me to interact well with people from all backgrounds and walks of life and has proved directly useful at the SOTF (public comment from natives of Pakistan and Egypt come to mind, amongst others).
- My Information Technology background will continue to be an asset, as will my background as a paralegal.
- Lastly, going back to my opening point about Institutional Knowledge. With 4 members choosing not to run again i think it prudent to re-elect those members that are choosing to run again. It would be a shame to lose any part of the institutional capital we have worked so hard to build over the past 2 years.

In summary I would like to emphasize the qualities i hope to continue to bring in a 2nd term:

- 3) Ethnically diverse background

Dear Supervisors Yee, Tang, Campos --

My name is Bruce Wolfe. I appreciate the opportunity of your consideration for appointment to the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force in Seat 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 or 11 as a person with a mobility disability. I have served on our Sunshine Ordinance Task Force since 2005 with a one year hiatus in 2008, through 2012. I returned to the SOTF at the behest of a former Ethics Commissioner and long-time open government advocate, Joe Lynn, and my dedication to maintaining that transparency as our means to balance democracy. My experience, enjoyment and civic duty continues to interest me as I learn new aspects of this area of policy and law, and continued collaboration with my colleagues on the SOTF on how to best optimize the process, create consistency, use innovation and increase efficiency.

<u>I am a person with a mobility disability for over the past 20 years after a work injury.</u> Perhaps you knew or had been visited by my service dog, Charlie, over the past decade as we sadly lost him at the ripe old age of fourteen and a half years old last June. He is sorely missed but a new member of the team, Lady, will carry his legacy under the dome. That said, his presence along with over 30 of disability advocacy has given me the confidence to serve on the SOTF not just as eligible for the appointment and seat but with the added value of bringing my experience along.

Additionally, my interest in open government equally spans my lifetime from the east coast to west over 30 years ago. Here in San Francisco, my interest was piqued through my attendance at City College as a student managing its Shared Governance program for student participation. While the Sunshine Ordinance did not apply then, the thrust of my interest was towards getting all state agencies that operate and elected locally to abide by it. And, we have been successful on many including City College which agreed to apply some of its elements.

My full-time job over the past seven years has been with a consumer advocacy and protection organization.

Currently, as you know there has been a great increase in complaints coming to the SOTF despite that all Sunshine Ordinance compliance results in less than 5% through the complaint process of the SOTF. The SOTF offers the public a number of services with a single person staff supplied by the Clerk of the Board and one legal counsel supplied by the City Attorney's office. The rest of the services are provided by the all volunteer membership of the body most of whom hold full-time jobs. With an additional staffer, much more expedited services could be provided to reduce the number of complaints on a daily basis.

In addition, with the advent of information technology and now the commitment through Dept of IT and SFData.org, more and more public information is being made accessible through the web and other applications. I am an IT professional across the broad spectrum of information/technology/security/social media who has brought a modicum of necessary expertise to the SOTF.

The Sunshine Ordinance is based in state law of the CA Public Records Act and Ralph M. Brown Open Meetings Act. Much work still needs to be done by the SOTF.

1. <u>Training:</u> Of its many charges, I hope to increase the amount of training to the city family. As a martial arts instructor of over 35 years, a social worker, college level instructor, life coach and trained hundreds in computing, I have some sense how to guide folks towards understanding at their level. I would plan on

- identifying problem areas of departments and agencies with repeat violations and work with department heads to help curb and get things under control. Compliance is mandatory. I am interested in bringing the full force of my expertise in this area which is why I decided to re-apply to the SOTF.
- 2. Streamlining the hearing process: One of the many areas of concern is the time and hour of SOTF hearings and meetings. The hearing process was overhauled some years ago which help create a much fairer process and did reduce the time spent on each case. But cases were not as plentiful as they are today as all areas of government from federal to our little city are being challenged for information by the public. Of a few areas in question:
 - 1. Hearing timeframe needs to be annually reviewed and optimized as necessary without losing any respect for either party.
 - 2. Multiple complaints should be considered co-joined when focused on the same respondent regarding the same set of issues so there will be one hearing covering multiple complaints on the same respondent unless specifically distinct from each other.
- 3. <u>Information Technology:</u> There is ample opportunity to help increase the availability of public information and records through new efforts to centralize data and make available on the web. I have attended COIT meetings regularly as representative of SOTF since its inception where this subject was under consideration as the contract was being awarded to Microsoft.

Additionally, to increase the role of the SOTF administrative department to help the general public and to intervene as necessary to expedite and acquire the public information they seek to reduce the amount of complaints coming before the SOTF.

I am a staunch, unbiased open government advocate and experienced in Gov2.0 information technology which also lends to the ever-increasing nature of transparency in government. My aim is to be fair, reasonable and adhere to the principle of bringing greater Sunshine and more expedited access of public information and meetings as possible.

Again, I appreciate the opportunity of your consideration for appointment to the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force.

Board Qualifications:

The Sunshine Ordinance Task Force 2000 consists of a total of thirteen members, eleven of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The Mayor or his/her designee, and the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors or his/her designee serve as non-voting members. All members must have experience and/or demonstrated interest in the issues of citizen access and participation in local government. The City Attorney shall serve as legal advisor to the Task Force.

The members are drawn from the following categories: two appointed from names submitted by local chapter of the Society of Professional Journalists, one an attorney and one a local journalist; one appointed from the press or electronic media; one appointed from names submitted by the local chapter of the League of Women Voters; four members of the public who have demonstrated interest in or have experience in the issues of citizen access and participation in local government; two members of the public experienced in consumer advocacy; one appointed from names submitted by New California Media, to be a journalist from a racial/ethnic-minority-owned news organization.

The term of each appointive member shall be two years unless earlier removed by the Board of Supervisors. In the event of such removal or vacancy during the term of office of any appointive member, a successor shall be appointed for the unexpired term of the office vacated.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

At all times, the Task Force shall include at least one member who shall be a member of the public who is physically handicapped and who has demonstrated interest in citizen access and participation in local government.

The Task Force shall advise the Board of Supervisors and provide information to other City departments on appropriate ways in which to implement Chapter 67 of the Administrative Code. The Task Force shall develop appropriate goals to ensure practical and timely implementation of Chapter 67; propose to the Board of Supervisors amendments to Chapter 67; report to the Board of Supervisors at least once annually on any practical or policy problems encountered in the administration of Chapter 67; make referrals to a municipal office with enforcement power under the Sunshine Ordinance or under the California Public Records Act and the Brown Act whenever it concludes that any person has violated any provisions of this ordinance or the Acts.

In addition to regular Task Force meetings, Task Force members are expected to participate in committee work.

Reports: Receive and review the Annual Report of the Supervisor of Public Records and may request additional reports or information as it deems necessary. Shall issue public reports as it sees fit, evaluating compliance with this ordinance and related California laws by the City or any Department, Officer, or Official thereof.
