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9	WHEREAS, The Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD)
10	administers a variety of housing programs that provide financing for the development of
11	new housing and the rehabilitation of single- and multi-family housing for low- and
12	moderate-income households in San Francisco; and
13	WHEREAS, In 2004, the City and County of San Francisco (City) published its "Ten
14	Year Plan to End Chronic Homelessness," and established a goal of creating 3,000
15	permanent affordable housing units for homeless households by 2014; and
16	WHEREAS, MOHCD developed the Local Operating Subsidy Program (LOSP) in
17	order to establish long-term financial support to operate and maintain permanent affordable
18	housing for homeless households. Through the LOSP, the City subsidizes the difference
19	between the cost of operating housing for homeless persons and all other sources of
20	operating revenue for a given project, such as tenant rental payments, commercial space
21	lease payments, Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act subsidies, project-based

Section 8 rent subsidies and California Mental Health Services Act operating subsidies; and

WHEREAS, All supportive housing projects selected for capital funding by the

Citywide Affordable Housing Loan Committee (Loan Committee) are eligible to receive

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LOSP	funds:	and
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WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors authorizes City funding for LOSP projects as part of the Annual Appropriation Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, MOHCD enters into grant agreements with supportive housing owners and operators for LOSP projects in consultation with the Department of Public Health (DPH) and Human Services Agency (HSA), administers LOSP contracts, reviews annual audits and prepares recommendations for annual adjustments to project funding, monitors compliance with LOSP requirements in accordance with capital funding regulatory agreements, and if necessary, takes appropriate action to enforce compliance; and

WHEREAS, Mercy Housing California XLIV, L.P., a California limited partnership (the Developer), is the owner and developer of a newly constructed affordable housing development located at 1180 4th Street (Project), which will provide 149 units of affordable family rental housing, of which 11 one-bedroom, 30 two-bedroom and 9 three-bedroom units will be occupied by formerly homeless households; and

WHEREAS, On March 21, 2014, the Loan Committee recommended approval to the Mayor of a LOSP grant award for the Project in an amount not to exceed \$10,254,142, which would be used to subsidize the operating costs for 50 of the Project units that are specifically designated for formerly homeless households; and

WHEREAS, MOHCD proposes to provide a LOSP grant in the amount not to exceed \$10,254,142 to the Developer pursuant to a LOSP Grant Agreement (the Agreement) in substantially the form on file with the Clerk of the Board in File No. 140650 and in such final form as approved by the Director of MOHCD and the City Attorney; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement is for a 15 year term, and therefore requires Board of

2	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Director of	
3	MOHCD or his designee to execute the Agreement for an amount not to exceed	
4	\$10,254,142; and, be it

6	proceed with actions necessary to implement the Agreement following execution, and	
7	ratifies, approves and authorizes all actions heretofore taken by any City official in	
8	connection with such Agreement; and, be it	
9	FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the	
10	Director of MOHCD or his designee to enter into any amendments or modifications to the	
11	Agreement, including without limitation, the exhibits that the Director determines, in	
12	consultation with the City Attorney, are in the best interest of the City, do not materially	
13	increase the obligations or liabilities for the City or materially diminish the benefits of the	
14	City, are necessary or advisable to effectuate the purposes and intent of this Resolution	
15	and are in compliance with all applicable laws, including the City Charter.
