Resolution determining that the issuance of a Type 42 on-sale beer and wine public premises license to Larry Livingston for The Basement, located at 222 Hyde Street (District 6), will serve the public convenience or necessity of the City and County of San Francisco in accordance with California Business and Professions Code, Section 23958.4, and recommending that the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control impose conditions on the issuance of the license.

WHEREAS, Larry Livingston is seeking the issuance of a Type 42 on-sale beer and wine license for The Basement, located at 222 Hyde Street; and,

WHEREAS, The Planning Department has verified that the area is properly zoned and recommends approval; and,

WHEREAS, The Police Department has filed one (1) protest with the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control under California Business and Professions Code, Section 24013, and recommends that the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control issue the liquor license with conditions; and

WHEREAS, The conditions recommended by the Police Department are the following: 1) Sales of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted between the hours of 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 a.m., Sunday through Wednesday, and 11:00 a.m. until 12:00 a.m. on Thursday through Saturday for the first (6) six months, beginning the first day the license is issued; 2) This license shall not be exchanged for an on sale general alcohol license; 3) No noise shall be audible beyond the area under control of the license; 4) Loitering (defined as "to stand idly about; linger aimlessly without lawful







Dear Supervisors,

Our neighborhood in District 6 is simply overwhelmed. We are already too stressed by an over-saturation of bars and other establishments with the availability of liquor, excessive over-consumption of drinking and socially unacceptable and noisy bad behavior, litter and crime...The BOS must act to protect us from additional threats.

This area of Tenderloin is already designated a high crime area and houses more paroles than any other area of the city trying to recover. There is ample evidence of the extensive substance abuse problems and a consumption issues already here in addition to the crime that accompanies it, including pedestrian deaths and DUIs as well as drunks passed out on the sidewalks every street in the neighborhood.

The premises at issue are located within the immediate vicinity of several children's playgrounds, and issuance of this license would add to the danger facing our neighborhood children.

The bars previously located at this site have provided nothing more than a public nuisance to the community.

What did we learn from the Lower Polk Street Bar Moratorium passed by the BOS in April 2013? This is not a new problem.

We learned there were serious problems associated with mixing a bar into a highly density residential area. The BIG problem here is this is a far more densely populated residential area than that of Lower Polk Street Neighbors that is already suffering without adding another uncontrollable bar.

The applicants at 222 Hyde Street "The Basement" have failed to make an acceptable case that granting this license would be necessary, convenient, desirable, or compatible for this neighborhood. This was a bad initial choice by the Planning Dept. and the ABC initially and it will continue to be for the community. We have an opportunity to correct this error rather than repeat it. Many of the social and drunken behavioral problems associated with the noise issues are not a controllable or a police enforceable issue…as by the

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time the police respond the low priority loud and unruly patrons are replaced by others or it subsides for minutes...only to have the noise return when the police leave. Bar owners have not shown they can control the noise problems associated with their bars. We have endured too much of this situation already. It's a culture that that begins with the owners attitude towards a "Good Neighbor Policy"...this owner by his own admission at public outreach forums has thrown up his hands already as far as proposed crowd control measures and he is yet to even open.

Please help keep some quiet sanity and safety for our residential community by respecting the recommendations of 12-midnight closure of the ALU and the Police Dept. if a permit has to be issued at all. I would recommend denial and seek another more suitable business for this location.

The BOS are allowing the Alcohol Beverage Commission to run unabated to continue to issue more and more licenses than the law allows by finding ways to circumvent the laws that were meant to regulate the procreation of these bars. The law says one license for every 1854 residents per census tract area...by the explosion of bars in the Tenderloin one would believe the whole city lives in District 6. Please send a strong message to the ABC, let them know they have already wore out their welcome and have become a pariah in this San Francisco neighborhood. If only as much effort was put into enforcement of "Good Neighbor Policies" as put into issuing all these new licenses and transfers to our already oversaturated residential area there would be fewer problems, but that just is NOT the case. Many people believe for the price of a cocktail they can come into our residential area and exhibit socially unacceptable behavior by screaming, vomiting, urinating and defecating in our doorways, entryways, and streets. They come to participate in bad behavior that they cannot get away with in and around their own homes in other neighborhoods. It is a very low police priority and affects the quality of life and sanity of everyone in the neighborhood. This is precisely why this conditional use permit should not be granted for this bar in this problem area in the first place, however if granted hours of operations and conditions should be imposed to ensure our quiet enjoyment of our homes. If they wish to operate a bar with longer hours they should seek another location in another area of the city perhaps near your home.

222 Hyde has a rich history and was in business since 1940's and a night club called 222 Hyde recently closed on March of this year.

The corner of Turk & Hyde used to house the world famous Black Hawk Jazz club in the 1940's to 1960's. Greats like Miles Davis, John Coltrane enjoyed drinks at "The Three Deuces" (222 Hyde Street) for VIP treatment. Some says those greats weren't allowed to hang around for drinks at main lounge of Black Hawk Jazz Club because of their color of skins. In my opinion not continuing tradition at this location is such a loss not only to the neighborhood but also to city of San Francisco. I believe providing great music and drinks at this location will continue that tradition.

I have reach out to folks at "Faithful Fools Street Ministry" (234 Hyde Street) when I signed the lease at 222 Hyde Street. Sister Carmen Barsody and Sam Dennison was very kind and they see no problem with the business as long as it won't open too late (like after 2am) and I agreed. I also reached out to Alex Darr (Outreach Minister at Faithful Fools) and he welcomes me to the neighborhood. I have nice talk with them and I have every intention to work with them to make the neighborhood better. I have let them know that they are welcome to host a donation drive party at 222 Hyde when the business is closed like Sunday and Mondays.

Currently 200 block of Hyde Street is run by drug dealers like most of Tenderloin streets. I will have security cameras in front of building and hire a security guard to fend off those drug dealers.

Obviously, I can't have a bar/lounge business without the beer&wine license so it is critical that I get the City's approval. If I get the license to operate the business I will need to hire many employees. The net employment gain will be good for the neighborhood and the city. Once operational all of the employees and the business will pay tax and contribute to the local economy.

I truly believe that the business will provide positive and cultural environment for the neighborhood and the city.
