5 Environmental Quality Act.

13 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

14 Section 1. Findings.

15 (a) The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this
16 ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources
17 Code Sections 21000 et seq.). The Board of Supervisors hereby affirms this determination.
18 Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 140594 and
19 is incorporated herein by reference.

20 (b) On June 3, 2014, in Department of Public Works Order No. 182647, the Director of
21 the Department recommended approval of this legislation. A copy of said Order is on file with
22 the Clerk of the Board in File No. 140594.

23 Section 2. The Subdivision Code is hereby amended by revising Section 1315, to read
24 as follows:
25

1 **SEC. 1315. FEES.**

2 (a) Fees, payable to the Department of Public Works, shall be charged for checking
3 and processing the maps, plans and reports, lot line adjustments, certificates of compliance,
4 amended maps, records of survey, certificates of correction, and other actions and

5 procedures set forth in California Government Code section 66451.2. Said fees shall be due
6 at the time of filing an application. Failure to pay such fees shall result in a return of the
7 application as incomplete to the applicant. The fee schedule is as follows:

8 (1) Air Space (four lots or less) is \$8,598.00 with a fee of \$500.00 for each additional
9 lot;

10 (2) Lot Subdivision "Final Map" is \$8,437.00;

11 (3) Condominium Conversion is \$8,336.00;

12 (4) Parcel Map is \$7,770.00;

13 (5) Lot Merger Re-subdivision is \$6,943.00;

14 (6) Amended Map is \$2,704.00;

15 (7) Lot Line Adjustment is \$2,704.00;

16 (8) Lot Merger is \$2,581.00;

17 (9) Certificate of compliance is \$2,139.00;

18 (10) Certificate of correction is \$2,139.00;

19 (11) Record of survey is \$507.00; *and*

20 (12) Survey Monument Setting is \$3,100.00; and

21 (13) Other actions not specified above, shall be based on actual costs that the
22 Department incurs in administering and processing the action or procedure and shall be
23 charged on a time and materials basis. The Department shall provide the applicant with a
24 written estimate of said costs at the time of application, and the applicant shall pay such fees
25 prior to the time that the application is deemed complete. To the extent that the estimated fees

1 do not cover actual costs, any outstanding amount due shall be a condition of the
2 Department's final decision on the action or procedure. To the extent that the estimated fees
3 exceeded the actual costs, the Department shall refund the excess amount to the applicant
4 within a reasonable period after the Department's final decision on the action or procedure.

5 (b) A fee of \$250 shall be charged to defray costs of an appeal under Section 1314 of
6 this Code.

7 (c) Payment of fees charged under this Code does not waive the fee requirements of
8 other ordinances and rules and regulations pursuant thereto.

9 (d) There is hereby created a Subdivision Fund wherein all funds received under the
10 provisions of this Section shall be deposited. All expenditures from the Fund shall be for
11 engineering or technical investigations and equipment directly related to the checking and
12 processing of the maps, plans, reports and parcel map waivers filed under this Code, and all
13 such expenditures are hereby appropriated for said purposes.

14 (e) Additional Fees.

15 (1) In instances where administration or processing of any application, action, or
16 procedure is or will exceed the fee amount established pursuant to subsection (a), the
17 Director, in his or her discretion, may require an applicant or permittee to pay a sum in excess
18 of the subject fee amounts. This additional sum shall be sufficient to recover actual costs that
19 the Department incurs and shall be charged on a time and materials basis. The Director also
20 may charge for any time and materials costs that other agencies, boards, commissions, or
21 departments of the City, including the City Attorney's Office, incur in connection with the
22 processing or administration of a particular application, action, or procedure. Whenever
23 additional fees are or will be charged, the Director, upon request of the applicant or permittee,
24 shall provide in writing the basis for the additional fees or an estimate of the additional fees to
25 be charged.

1 (2) DBI Review Fee. A fee of \$374.00 shall be charged for each action specified
2 above that the Department of Building Inspection reviews. This fee is in addition to the fees
3 specified above and shall be paid separately at the time of application.

4 (f) Beginning with fiscal year 2006-2007, the fees which are established herein may
5 be adjusted each year, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes
6 in the relevant Consumer Price Index, as determined by the Controller. No later than April
7 15th of each year, the Director shall submit the Department's current fee schedule to the
8 Controller, who shall apply the price index adjustment to produce a new fee schedule for the
9 following year. No later than May 15th of each year, the Controller shall file a report with the
10 Board of Supervisors reporting the new fee schedule and certifying that: (a) the fees produce
11 sufficient revenue to support the costs of providing the services for which the fee is charged
12 and (b) the fees do not produce revenue that exceeds the costs of providing the services for
13 which each permit fee is charged. Notwithstanding the procedures set forth in this Section, the
14 Board of Supervisors, in its discretion, may modify the fees at any time.


15
16 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
17 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
18 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
19 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

20
21 Section 4. Scope of Ordinance. In enacting this ordinance, the Board of Supervisors
22 intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles,
23 numbers, punctuation marks, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent parts of the Municipal
24 Code that are explicitly shown in this ordinance as additions, deletions, Board amendment

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Subdivision Code — Fee to Set Monuments]

Ordinance amending the Subdivision Code to adopt a fee to set survey monuments and affirming the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

Existing Law

The Subdivision Code establishes fees for various City services and permit programs concerning subdivisions and related actions. The Department of Public Works has an administratively adopted fee for setting survey monuments.

Amendments to Current Law

This Ordinance would update and codify the administratively adopted fee for setting survey monuments. The legislation also would affirm the Planning Department's determination under the California Environmental Quality Act.

This Department of Public Works (DPW) Order provides detailed information and guidelines for the protection and preservation of survey monuments within the City and County of San Francisco.

1. All survey monuments shall be located, referenced and/or re-set by the office of the City & County Surveyor or under the direction of a licensed land surveyor or a pre-1982 registered civil engineer prior to the construction, reconstruction, maintenance, resurfacing of public rights-of-way.
 2. Many references to monuments or monument lines exist in the form of marks at building corners, granite curbs, fire hydrants, manhole/utility covers, etc. The City's primary goal and concern is to protect and preserve those City monuments marked with brass survey markers or similar markers, as noted on the City's Monument Mapping System. Monuments can exist in monument wells or they can be inserted directly into sidewalks and/or other permanent locations.
 3. Other monuments may exist, including those set by federal agencies; e.g. USGS, U.S. Army, U.S. Navy; private surveyors for subdivisions, et al. These monuments must also be preserved where they are located.
- II. **PROCESS.** Prior to the construction, reconstruction, maintenance, resurfacing of public rights-of-way or any excavation work within ten (10) feet of an existing survey monument, a Corner Record or Record of Survey shall be filed with the County Surveyor.
1. An applicant may request the County Surveyor to perform this task; if the County Surveyor agrees, the applicant shall provide/submit the following:
 - A. A letter addressed/email to the County Surveyor's office identifying the applicant's and/or contractor's name, contact information (address, phone, e-mail), and location of the monument(s) affected.



- B. A copy of the permit allowing construction if the work is associated with a private job, or a job billing number if the construction is associated with a City job.
 - C. A fee of \$3,100 per monument which shall include all before and after survey services, and the creation and filing of the Corner Records.
 - D. The County Surveyor shall require a minimum of two (2) weeks notice prior to performing this task, and shall complete all survey services prior to construction starting
2. **An applicant may hire a private surveyor to perform this task.**
- A. All fees shall be negotiated between the applicant and private surveyor.
 - B. The private surveyor shall meet with the County Surveyor to get all detailed information prior to starting construction.
 - C. A pre-construction Corner Record or Record of Survey shall be filed prior to starting construction.
 - D. Within one (1) month after construction is completed, a post-construction Corner Record or Record of Survey shall be filed.
 - E. If (C) or (D) above are not created to the specifications set by the County Surveyor or within the specified time period, the applicant(s) shall be held responsible and a minimum fee of \$10,000 per monument shall be required for the County Surveyor to reestablish the monument.


