[Police Code - Street Artist Certificate Fee Waivers for Honorably Discharged Veterans]

Ordinance amending the Police Code to require the Director of Cultural Affairs, or his or her designee, to waive Street Artist Certificate fees for honorably discharged veterans and to grant refunds to honorably discharged veterans who file a refund claim on or before July 1, 2015, for any fees collected between January 1, 2009, and July 1. 2014.

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The Police Code is hereby amended by adding Section 2404.3, to read as follows:

SEC. 2404.3. STREET ARTIST CERTIFICATE FEE WAIVERS AND REFUNDS FOR HONORABLY DISCHARGED VETERANS.

Certificate Fee Waivers. Notwithstanding Sections 2404.1 and 2404.1.1, the Director of Cultural Affairs, or his or her designee, shall waive all Street Artist Certificate fees, including any application/examination fees, for any individual who is honorably discharged or honorably relieved from the military, naval, or air service of the United States and who is a resident of California ("Honorably Discharged Veteran") upon receipt of the Honorably Discharged Veteran's Certificate of Release DD Form 214 (Certificate of Release or Discharge from Active Duty) or other equivalent U.S. government document reflecting honorable discharge. The Street Artists Program Director shall keep such documentation on file to help expedite future renewals.

 (b) Certificate Fee Refunds.

(1) Honorably Discharged Veterans who paid Street Artist Certificate fees between January 1, 2009 and July 1, 2014 may file a claim with the Arts Commission's Street Artists Program to receive a refund of all such fees, including any application/examination fees, paid during that period. Honorably Discharged Veterans shall have until no later than June 30, 2015 to file a refund claim and must provide a DD Form 214 or other equivalent U.S. government document demonstrating that the claimant was an Honorably Discharged Veteran at the time he or she paid the Street Artist Certificate fee. The Director of Cultural Affairs, or his or her designee shall have the authority to process Street Artist Certificate fee refund claims and grant Street Artist Certificate fee refunds to Honorably Discharged Veterans.

(2) This subsection (b) shall expire by operation of law on July 1, 2015 and the City Attorney's Office is authorized thereafter to take the necessary steps to remove subsection (b) from the Police Code; to remove the words "and Refunds" from the heading of Section 2404.3; and to remove the subheading "(a) Certificate Fee Waivers" from Section 2404.3.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.

Section 3. Severability. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of the ordinance. The Board of Supervisors hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance and each and every section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase, and

word not declared invalid or unconstitutional without regard to whether any other portion of this ordinance would be subsequently declared invalid or unconstitutional.

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LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Police Code - Street Artist Certificate Fee Waivers for Honorably Discharged Veterans]

Ordinance amending the Police Code to require the Director of Cultural Affairs, or his or her designee, to waive Street Artist Certificate fees for honorably discharged veterans and to grant refunds to honorably discharged veterans who file a refund claim on or before July 1, 2015, for any fees collected between January 1, 2009, and July 1, 2014.

Existing Law

Section 2404.1 of the San Francisco Police Code currently establishes a fee of \$174.08 for a quarterly (3 month) Street Artist Certificate and a fee of \$696.34 for an annual certificate for any individual certified by the Arts Commission as a street artist, as adjusted by the Controller's office based on the applicable Consumer Price Index for San Francisco. In addition, under Section 2404.1.1, street artists must pay an application/examination fee of approximately \$20. The Police Code does not expressly exempt Honorably Discharged Veterans from Street Artist Certificate fees or from any application/examination fees.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposed ordinance would require the Director of Cultural Affairs, or his or her designee, to waive Street Artist Certificate fees, including any application/examination fees, for Honorably Discharged Veterans certified as street artists upon proof of honorable discharge. Further, it would require the granting of refunds to Honorably Discharged Veterans who file a refund claim on or before June 30, 2015, for any Street Artist Certificate fees, including any application/examination fees, paid between January 1, 2009 and July 1, 2014. Honorably Discharged Veterans would remain subject to all other Police Code provisions and regulations governing the issuance of Street Artists Certificates and the conduct of Street Artists.

Background Information

California Business and Professions Code Section 16001.7 ("Section 16001.7"), effective January 1, 2009, prohibits governmental entities from charging certain business license fees to any individual "who is honorably discharged or honorably relieved from the military, naval, or air service of the United States and who is a resident of this state" ("Honorably Discharged Veteran"). The proposed ordinance is consistent with Section 16001.7.

The Arts Commission has already issued refunds to Honorably Discharged Veterans for FY 2013-2014. This Ordinance authorizes the Arts Commission's Director of Cultural Affairs to issue refunds for prior years, dating back to January 1, 2009.
