BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

[Supporting California Assembly Bill 935 (Frazier) - California Veterans Driver's License]

Resolution supporting California State Assembly Bill 935, introduced by Assembly Member Frazier, which calls for the creation of clearly identifiable California state driver's licenses and identification cards for veterans.

WHEREAS, Under existing state law, the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) collects information on veterans and transmits that information the California Department of Veterans Affairs; and

WHEREAS, Eligible veterans can then be contacted regarding state and federal benefits to which they are entitled; and

WHEREAS, A number of federal, state and local benefits available to veterans, including employment assistance, housing, and health counseling require proof that an individual is a veteran; and

WHEREAS, Upon discharge from the Armed Services, formerly active-duty military personnel are given a DD-214, a paper document to prove their veteran status; and

WHEREAS, Such a paper document, unless constantly carried around, is an impractical means of identifying someone as a veteran; and

WHEREAS, California State Assembly Bill 935 allows veterans to apply for a California driver's license or identification card clearly marking them as a veteran by presenting their DD-214 or other verification of veteran status to a CalVet trained County Veterans Service Officer (CVSO); and

WHEREAS, Upon presentation, the veteran will receive a verification document which can be submitted as proof of military service to the DMV in order to receive a "Veterans" designation on their driver's license or identification card; and

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WHEREAS, A "Veteran" designation on a state driver's license would allow quick and easy identification of a veteran wishing to access services and benefits they are entitled to without the need to carry the DD-214; and

WHEREAS, Such identification would also be helpful to medical and law enforcement agencies in identifying and providing appropriate treatment to a veteran who may be suffering from medical trauma, such as Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, as a result of their service; and

WHEREAS, This legislation was sponsored by such organizations as the American Legion – Department of California, AMVETS – Department of California, California Association of County Veteran Service Officers, California Council, Military Officers Association of America, Veterans of Foreign Wars – Department of California, Vietnam Veterans of America – California State Council, and California State Commanders Veterans Council; and

WHEREAS, This legislation has been supported by the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME), The Town of Danville, Los Angeles County, Solano County, California Professional Firefighters and California Police Chiefs Association;

WHEREAS, Forty Seven other states have also enacted laws adding "Veteran" designations to state issued driver's licenses or identification cards; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco fully endorses California State Assembly Bill 935.

### February 22, 2013

An act to amend Section 12811 of, and to add Section 14901.1 to, the Vehicle Code, relating to driver's licenses.

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 935, as amended, Frazier. Driver's licenses: veteran designation. (1) Under existing law, when the Department of Motor Vehicles determines that an applicant is lawfully entitled to a driver's license, the department is required to issue that license to the applicant. Existing law specifies the contents of a driver's license and requires the application for a driver's license or identification card to contain a space for an applicant to indicate whether he or she has served in the Armed Forces of the United States and to give his or her consent to be contacted regarding eligibility to receive state or federal veterans' benefits.

This bill would, commencing November 11, 2015, allow an *in-person* applicant for a driver's license or identification card to allow a person to request the driver's license or identification card be printed with the word "VETERAN." The applicant would be required to present *verification of veteran status* to the Department of Motor Vehicles, on a form developed-jointly by the Department of Veterans Affairs *in consultation with the California Association of County Veterans Service Officers* and the Department of Motor Vehicles, proof of veteran status. The bill would require county veterans service offices to verify an applicant's veteran status for these purposes, as specified. The department would be required to print the word "VETERAN" on the face of a driver's license or identification card issued to a person who makes that request and presents that verification to the department.

(2) Existing law establishes certain fee amounts for the applications for, and renewal of, driver's licenses and identification cards.

This bill would—authorize require the department to charge an additional fee not to exceed \$15 of \$5 to a person who requests that the person's driver's license or identification card be designated as provided above.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

#### *The people of the State of California do enact as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 12811 of the Vehicle Code is amended 2 to read:

3 12811. (a) (1) (A) When the department determines that the 4 applicant is lawfully entitled to a license, it shall issue to the person 5 a driver's license as applied for. The license shall state the class 6 of license for which the licensee has qualified and shall contain 7 the distinguishing number assigned to the applicant, the date of 8 expiration, the true full name, age, and mailing address of the 9 licensee, a brief description and engraved picture or photograph 10 of the licensee for the purpose of identification, and space for the 11 signature of the licensee.

(B) Each license shall also contain a space for the endorsementof a record of each suspension or revocation of the license.

1 (C) The department shall use whatever process or processes, in 2 the issuance of engraved or colored licenses, that prohibit, as near 3 as possible, the ability to alter or reproduce the license, or prohibit 4 the ability to superimpose a picture or photograph on the license 5 without ready detection.

6 (2) In addition to the requirements of paragraph (1), a license 7 issued to a person under 18 years of age shall display the words 8 "provisional until age 18."

9 (b) (1) On and after July 1, 2011, an application for an original 10 or renewal driver's license or identification card shall contain a 11 space for the applicant to enroll in the Donate Life California Organ 12 and Tissue Donor Registry. The application shall include check 13 boxes for an applicant to mark either (A) Yes, add my name to the 14 donor registry or (B) I do not wish to register at this time.

(2) The department shall inquire verbally of an applicant
applying in person for an original or renewal driver's license or
identification card at a department office as to whether the applicant
wishes to enroll in the Donate Life California Organ and Tissue
Donor Registry. Failure or refusal to answer this question or check
a box on the application form shall not be a basis for the department
to deny an applicant a driver's license or identification card.

(3) The following language shall be included with the questionrequired by paragraph (1):

25 "Marking 'Yes' adds your name to the Donate Life California Organ and Tissue Donor Registry and a pink 'donor' dot will appear on your license. If you wish to remove your name from the registry you must contact Donate Life California (see back); DMV can remove the pink dot from your licenses but cannot remove you from the registry."

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32 (4) The back of the application shall contain the following33 statement:

35 "If, on the front of this form, you marked 'Yes' to register as an 36 organ and tissue donor you are legally authorizing the recovery of 37 organs and tissues in the event of your death. Registering as a 38 donor will not affect your medical treatment in any way. As 39 outlined in the California Anatomical Gift Act, your authorization 40 is legally binding and, unless the donor is under 18 years of age,

your decision does not require the consent of any other person. 1 2 For registered donors under 18 years of age, the legal guardian 3 shall make the final donation decision. You may limit your donation to specific organs or tissues, place usage restrictions, for 4 5 example transplantation or research, obtain more information about 6 donation, or remove your name from the registry on the Internet 7 Life Web site of Donate California: 8 www.donateLIFEcalifornia.org."

10 (5) Notwithstanding any other law, a person under 18 years of 11 age may register as a donor. However, the legal guardian of that 12 person shall make the final decision regarding the donation.

(6) The department shall collect donor designation information
on all applications for an original or renewal driver's license or
identification card.

16 (7) The department shall print the word "DONOR" or another 17 appropriate designation on the face of a driver's license or 18 identification card to a person who has indicated on the application 19 his or her intent to enroll in the organ donation program pursuant 20 to this section.

(8) On a weekly basis, the department shall electronically
transmit to Donate Life California, a nonprofit organization
established and designated as the California Organ and Tissue
Donor Registrar pursuant to Section 7150.90 of the Health and
Safety Code, all of the following information from every
application that indicates the applicant's decision to enroll in the
organ donation program:

28 (A) His or her true full name.

29 (B) His or her residence or mailing address.

30 (C) His or her year of birth.

31 (D) His or her California driver's license number or 32 identification card number.

(9) (A) A person who applies for an original or renewal driver's
license or identification card may designate a voluntary
contribution of two dollars (\$2) for the purpose of promoting and
supporting organ and tissue donation. This contribution shall be
collected by the department, and treated as a voluntary contribution
to Donate Life California and not as a fee for the issuance of a
driver's license or identification card.

1 (B) The department may use the donations collected pursuant 2 to this paragraph to cover its actual administrative costs incurred 3 pursuant to paragraphs (6) to (8), inclusive. The department shall 4 deposit all revenue derived pursuant to this paragraph and 5 remaining after the department's deduction for administrative costs 6 in the Donate Life California Trust Subaccount, that is hereby 7 created in the Motor Vehicle Account in the State Transportation 8 Fund. Notwithstanding Section 13340 of the Government Code, 9 all revenue in this subaccount is continuously appropriated, without regard to fiscal years, to the Controller for allocation to Donate 10 11 Life California and shall be expended for the purpose of increasing 12 participation in organ donation programs.

13 (C) The department shall transmit to the Donate Life California 14 Organ and Tissue Donor Registry and the appropriate policy and 15 fiscal committees of the Legislature an annual report, and shall 16 make available quarterly updates, detailing funds collected through 17 voluntary contributions as well as a summary of applicants, 18 including all of the following nonidentifiable information:

19 (i) Date of application.

20 (ii) Method of application (field office, online, or mail).

21 (iii) Donor registration status.

22 (iv) ZIP Code.

23 (v) Gender.

24 (vi) Year of birth.

(D) (i) The annual report to be submitted to the appropriate
policy and fiscal committees of the Legislature pursuant to
subparagraph (C) shall be submitted in compliance with Section
9795 of the Government Code.

(ii) Pursuant to Section 10231.5 of the Government Code, the
requirement for submitting the annual report to the appropriate
policy and fiscal committees of the Legislature imposed under
subparagraph (C) is inoperative four years after the date the first
annual report is due.

34 (10) The enrollment form shall be posted on the Internet Web
35 sites for the department and the California Health and Human
36 Services Agency.

(11) The enrollment shall constitute a legal document pursuant
to the Uniform Anatomical Gift Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing
with Section 7150) of Part 1 of Division 7 of the Health and Safety
Code) and shall remain binding after the donor's death despite any

1 express desires of next of kin opposed to the donation. Except as

2 provided in paragraph (5) of subdivision (b), the donation does3 not require the consent of any other person.

4 (12) Donate Life California shall ensure that all additions and
5 deletions to the California Organ and Tissue Donor Registry,
6 established pursuant to Section 7150.90 of the Health and Safety
7 Code, shall occur within 30 days of receipt.

8 (13) Information obtained by Donate Life California for the 9 purposes of this subdivision shall be used for these purposes only 10 and shall not be disseminated further by Donate Life California.

11 (c) (1) All applications for a driver's license or identification 12 card shall contain a space for an applicant to indicate whether he 13 or she has served in the Armed Forces of the United States and to 14 give his or her consent to be contacted regarding eligibility to 15 receive state or federal veterans benefits. The application shall 16 contain the following statement:

18 "By marking the veteran box on this application, I certify that I. 19 am a veteran of the United States Armed Forces and that I want to receive veterans benefits information from the California 20 21 Department of Veterans Affairs. By marking the veteran box on 22 this application, I also consent to DMV transmitting my name and 23 mailing address to the California Department of Veterans Affairs 24 for this purpose only, and I certify that I have been notified that 25 this transmittal will occur."

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(2) The department shall collect the information obtainedpursuant to paragraph (1).

(3) As mutually agreed between the department and the
Department of Veterans Affairs, the department shall electronically
transmit to the Department of Veterans Affairs the following
information on each applicant who has identified that he or she
has served in the Armed Forces of the United States since the last
data transfer and has consented to be contacted about veterans
benefits:

36 (A) His or her true full name.

37 (B) His or her mailing address.

38 (4) Information obtained by the Department of Veterans Affairs

39 for the purposes of this subdivision shall be used for the purpose

of assisting individuals to access veterans benefits and shall not
 be disseminated except as needed for this purpose.

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3 (5) Commencing November 11, 2015, an *in-person* application 4 for an original; duplicate, or in-person renewal of a driver's license 5 or identification card shall allow an applicant to request the word 6 "VETERAN" be printed on the face of the driver's license or 7 identification card. An application A verification form shall be 8 developed jointly by the Department of Veterans Affairs and in 9 consultation with the Department of Motor Vehicles and the 10 California Association of County Veterans Service Officers to 11 acknowledge verification of veteran status. A county veterans 12 service office shall verify the veteran's status as a veteran, sign 13 the application verification form, and return it to the veteran. The 14 Department of Motor Vehicles shall accept the signed-application 15 verification form as proof of veteran status. Upon payment of the 16 fee required pursuant to Section 14901.1, the word "VETERAN" 17 shall be printed on the face of a driver's license or identification 18 card, in a location determined by the department, and issued to a 19 person who makes this request and presents the verification form 20 to the department.

(d) A public entity or employee shall not be liable for loss,
detriment, or injury resulting directly or indirectly from false or
inaccurate information contained in the form provided pursuant
to subdivision (b).

(e) A contract shall not be awarded to a nongovernmental entity
for the processing of driver's licenses, unless the contract conforms
to all applicable state contracting laws and all applicable procedures
set forth in the State Contracting Manual.

29 SEC. 2. Section 14901.1 is added to the Vehicle Code, to read: 30 14901.1. In addition to the fees required by Section 14900, 31 14900.1, or 14902, the department-may shall charge a fee not to 32 exceed fifteen dollars (\$15) of five dollars (\$5) to any person who 33 requests, pursuant to paragraph (5) of subdivision (c) of Section 34 12811, that the person's driver's license or identification card be 35 printed with the word "VETERAN" to indicate that the person has 36 served in the United States Armed Forces. The fee shall be set in 37 an amount to reimburse the department may increase the fee by 38 regulation, in an amount not to exceed fifteen dollars (\$15), to 39 reimburse the department for its reasonable costs in processing
