## Defibrillators, police cars a perfect pair

When San Francisco police officers come across a person on the street without a pulse, they can start CPR, call an ambulance, hope for the best.

But soon some of them will be able to do something more to try to save that life.

An innovative program will pair local businesses with a police patrol car and pay for a cardiac defibrillator. The hope is that with a little help from merchants, all 320 SFPD cars can be outfitted with the devices, technically known as automated external defibrillators or AEDs. The idea makes perfect sense. Cops are almost always the first on the scene, and with cardiac arrest, every second counts.

"This is a time-sensitive device," says Ben Dorcy, a paramedic who trains officers at the city's police academy. "If you use it within 10 minutes, you are good. If you use it within four minutes, you are excellent. It's a no-brainer."

The first business to chip in is John's Grill, one of our local landmark restaurants. On Friday, owner John Konstin will pony up about \$20,000 that will pay for 10 AEDs to be used by the Tenderloin Station.

Although large firms, like Walgreens, have donated money for more devices across the city, Capt. David Lazar of the city's police academy sees the benefits of a local merchant making a statement.

"This is a big splash," Lazar said. "This was really the whole idea in the first place, that people would donate and they would be acknowledged."

"Hopefully," says Konstin, "other businesses will follow and do other stations."

But this is San Francisco, so there had to be a little controversy. Konstin and his father, Gus, who ran the restaurant before him, are longtime supporters of both the Police and Fire Departments.

The Konstins are also committed to the troubled Tenderloin neighborhood near their restaurant. John is co-chairman of the Tenderloin Community Police Advisory Board - that's where he heard about sponsoring AEDs.

Konstin thought it was a great idea - with one condition. He wanted to donate the defibrillators specifically to the Tenderloin. Tenderloin Station Capt. Jason Cherniss thought that was a fine idea.

"When I came to this station, I had no idea how engaged the neighborhood is," Cherniss said. "And at the same time, I don't know that the density of neediness can be matched anywhere else."

But well-meaning officials wanted to take a different approach.

"While John is stepping up to provide 10, they will be deployed in a balanced way," Bob Krinsky, a consultant who came up with the original "adoption" idea, said earlier this week. "Maybe three will be in the Tenderloin, three in Pacific Heights and three in the Richmond." To which Konstin responded, in so many words - they either go to the Tenderloin or you can forget the cash. He put in a call to Police Chief Greg Suhr, who backed him up.

"John put a condition on his gift," Suhr said. "I will buy you 10 AEDs if I can say where they go. If it doesn't go to the Tenderloin, you're not going to get any. So instead of getting 10, everybody would end up with none."

That minor dustup was cleared up in a few hours, so at Friday's event - complete with Santa Claus - John's Grill will award 10 defibrillators directly to the Tenderloin Station.

"The blessing is that this is probably the district lea st likely to land any public patronage, and it is probably the district most in need," Suhr said. "It is great to see someone step up and take an interest in their own district."

Which is how it should be.


