16	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
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18	Section 1. Findings.		
19	(a) California Street and Highways Code Sections 8300 et seq. and Public Works		
20	Code Section 787(a) set forth the procedures that the City and County of San Francisco		
21	follows to vacate public streets and public service easements. California Street and Highways		
22	Code Sections 8330 et seq. permits the summary vacation of a public street or public service		
23	easement if cer	tain conditions are satisfied.	
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- (b) The Board of Supervisors finds it appropriate to pursue a street vacation of a
   portion of Raccoon Drive between Twin Peaks Boulevard and Saint Germain Avenue, in
   Assessor's Block 2720.
   (c) The location and extent of the area to be vacated (the "Vacation Area") is more
  - (c) The location and extent of the area to be vacated (the "Vacation Area") is more particularly shown on the Department of Public Works' ("DPW") SUR Map No. 2013-004, dated October 10, 2013. A copy of this map is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. \_\_\_\_\_ and is incorporated herein by reference.
  - (d) The Vacation Area is an undeveloped triangular parcel of land at the intersection of Raccoon Drive, Twin Peaks Boulevard, and Saint Germain Avenue.
  - (e) Vacation of the Vacation Area will allow the adjacent property owner to proceed with a project that will include the construction of public stairways to improve pedestrian access, stepped retaining walls, and landscaping.
  - (f) Section 8334(a) of the California Streets and Highways Code provides that the legislative body of a local agency may summarily vacate an excess right-of-way of a street, highway or public easement under certain circumstances.
  - (g) In DPW Order No. \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, dated \_\_\_\_\_\_, the Director of the Department of Public Works (the "DPW Director") determined: (1) the Vacation Area is excess right-of-way that can be summarily vacated under California Streets and Highways Code Section 8334(a); (2) the Vacation Area is unnecessary for the City's present or prospective public street, sidewalk, and service easement purposes; (3) there are no functioning in-place public or private utility facilities that would be affected by the vacation of the Vacation Area, which allows the City to proceed with a summary street vacation under Streets and Highways Code Section 8334.5; (4) pursuant to the Streets and Highways Code Section 892, the Vacation Area hereunder is a small and irregularly shaped parcel of land unusable for any independent purpose, and therefore, it has no use for a nonmotorized transportation facility; (5) the public

1	interest, convenience, and necessity require that the City obtain a public access easement for
2	a portion of the Vacation Area; (6) the public convenience and necessity require that no other
3	easements or other rights be reserved for any public or private utility facilities that are in place
4	in the Vacation Area and that any rights based upon any such public or private utility facilities
5	shall be extinguished automatically upon the effectiveness of the vacation; and (7) it is a
6	policy matter for the Board of Supervisors to quitclaim the City's interest in the Vacation Area
7	to the Vaughn R. Walker Revocable Trust. A copy of the DPW Order is on file with the Clerk
8	of the Board of Supervisors in File No
9	(h) The DPW Director also recommends that the effectiveness of the street vacation
10	be conditioned on simultaneous recordation of the City's quitclaim deed and a public access
11	easement. The Board of Supervisors adopts as its own, the recommendations of the DPW
12	Director as set forth in DPW Order No concerning the vacation of the Vacation
13	Area and other actions in furtherance thereof and the Board hereby incorporates such
14	recommendations and findings by reference as though fully set forth herein.
15	(i) A draft quitclaim deed and a draft public access easement are on file with the Clerk
16	of the Board of Supervisors in File No The Board of Supervisors acknowledges
17	the recommendation of the Director of the Division of Real Estate as referenced in the DPW
18	Order to approve the real estate transactions contemplated in this legislation.
19	(j) The Director of Planning, by letter dated September 11, 2013, found that the
20	vacation of the Vacation Area and other actions contemplated in this legislation are consistent
21	with the City's General Plan and with the eight priority policies of City Planning Code Section
22	101.1. This letter is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors under File No.
23	The Board of Supervisors adopts as its own, the recommendations of the Director
24	of Planning as set forth in the abovementioned letter concerning and the Board hereby
25	incorporates such recommendations and findings by reference as though fully set forth herein.

1	(k) The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this			
2	ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources			
3	Code Sections 21000 et seq.). The Board hereby affirms this determination. Said			
4	determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No			
5	and is incorporated herein by reference.			
6				
7	Section 2. Summary Vacation and Conditions.			
8	(a) The Board of Supervisors hereby summarily vacates the Vacation Area, as shown			
9	on SUR Map No. 2013-004, upon satisfaction of the conditions described in this Ordinance			
10	and pursuant to California Street and Highways Code Section 8300 et seq. and Public Works			
11	Code Section 787(a).			
12	(b) The Board of Supervisors finds that the Vacation Area is unnecessary for present			
13	or prospective public use, subject to the conditions described in this Ordinance.			
14	(c) The public interest and convenience require that the vacation be done as declared			
15	in this Ordinance.			
16	(d) The Street Vacation shall be effective automatically and without the requirement for			
17	further action whatsoever, as to all of the Vacation Area, upon satisfaction of the following:			
18	(1) simultaneous recording of the City's quitclaim deed and a public access			
19	easement, both in substantially the same form as the draft quitclaim deed and a draft public			
20	access easement on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No			
21				
22	Section 3. Real Property Transactions.			
23	(a) The Board approves the issuance of a quit claim deed of the City's interest in the			
24	Vacation Area to the Vaughn R. Walker Revocable Trust in substantially the same form as on			
25	file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.			

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- (b) The Board approves the public access easement from the Vaughn R. Walker Revocable Trust to the City as part of this street vacation action in substantially the same form as on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.
- (c) The Board delegates to the Director of the Division of Real Estate, in consultation with the City Attorney's Office, the authority to finalize and execute the quit claim deed and easement mentioned above on behalf of the City and County of San Francisco in accordance with the terms set forth in this legislation.
  - Section 4. Official Acts in Connection with the Legislation.
- (a) All actions heretofore taken by the officers of the City with respect to this ordinance are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified, and the Mayor, Clerk of the Board, Director of the Division of Real Estate, County Surveyor, and DPW Director are hereby authorized and directed to take any and all actions which they or the City Attorney may deem necessary or advisable in order to effectuate the purpose and intent of this ordinance (including, without limitation, the filing of this ordinance in the Official Records of the City and County of San Francisco; confirmation of satisfaction of the conditions to the effectiveness of the vacation of the Vacation Area hereunder; and execution and delivery of any evidence of the same, which shall be conclusive as to the satisfaction of the conditions upon signature by any such City official or his or her designee).
- (b) Immediately upon the effective date of this vacation, this ordinance shall be recorded.
- Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

1	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board		
2	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
