
- SFDPH experts in HIV prevention, treatment, research and epidemiology are providing leadership in PrEP
- SFDPH provides PrEP to its patients, and is committed to removing access barriers to all San Franciscans at risk for HIV


San Francisco and SFDPH PrEP Strengths



- iPrEX led by Dr. Bob Grant
 of UCSF was the first study
 to show PrEP was effective
 at reducing HIV infections in
 MSM and transfemales
- SFDPH was the first U.S. research site for iPrEX
- SFDPH enrolled more participants than any other U.S. site


SFDPH Continued Leadership in PrEP: Demo Project

San Francisco leads along the Continuum of HIV Care and Prevention





2010: San Francisco Recommends Treatment be offered to anyone diagnosed with HIV




- First in the United States
- Joint recommendation of SFGH Ward 86 (UCSF Positive Health Program) and SFDPH
- Offer regardless of CD4 count
- Decision to start treatment made by the individual in conjunction with the provider
- SF was two years ahead of national guidelines

Getting to Zero in San Francisco

PrEP is a Key Strategy:

- Comprehensive PrEP Training and Support for Clinical Providers
- Resources and assistance for potential users of PrEP
- Developing key metrics for PrEP

Health Reform Furthers PrEP Access in San Francisco

SF Health Insurance Enrollment under the Affordable Care Act	
Covered California (Oct 2013-Mar 2014)	40,825
Medi-Cal (Oct 2013-Jun 2014)	46,924
TOTAL	87,749

- ~90,000 San Franciscans have enrolled in health insurance under the Affordable Care Act
- Many insurers cover PrEP, including:
 - Medi-Cal
 - Kaiser Permanente
 - Anthem Blue Cross
 - United Health Care
 - Aetna

SFDPH Recommends PrEP for those at Highest Risk for HIV in San Francisco

- Gay and bisexual men
- Other men who have sex with men
- Transfemales who have sex with men

 Others at potential risk may be offered PrEP in discussion with their clinical provider

SFDPH Supports PrEP



- Access for our Patients
 - Provides access to PrEP for patients
 - Providers will have access to training and consultation resources, including from SFGH Ward 86 (UCSF Positive Health Program) and SFDPH Population Health



- Covers PrEP for uninsured San Franciscans enrolled in SFDPH supported medical homes
- Participants in non-SFDPH supported medical homes work with primary care providers to access PrEP via plan coverage or manufacturer's medication assistance program



SFDPH Supports PrEP



- Access for All San Franciscans at Risk
 - Will develop training resources for all SF providers including San Francisco Health Network
 - Continuing to provide access at City
 Clinic via links to insurance and primary care
 - Supporting community education and resources
 - Continuing PrEP assessment and implementation research
 - Assessing SF metrics for PrEP
