My transition has been taking shape for many years. It was apparent for years I was stuck in a life of crime and drugs because I had a fear of change. My last incarceration made it clear that I change or die a wasted life. My barrier was a habit of doing wrong for money. What helped were the services in San Francisco, particularly the counseling, the housing, and the opportunity to get <u>help</u> looking for work, Real Help.

Question #7:

The information an ex-con can reveal is unlimited in the knowledge of all the negative aspects of incarceration, and especially the continuing pain and despair that is automatic with recidivism. It an excon is truthful, absent machismo, his knowledge itself is a deterrent.

Question# 8: At the time my interest in working with the Re-entry Council is to learn, to hear what other members have to say, and to give my learned experience back, when it might be useful. I am especially interested in the implementation of Comprehensive Criminal Justice Reform, yet I am not sure where I can be most helpful. The Re-entry Council seems a good place to start.

To Whom It May Concern,

It is an honor to write this letter of recommendation for Dominique Leslie as a member of the Re-Entry Council. I could keep this letter simple by saying "trust me, just hire her and you won't regret it", but of course you need to hear more. I think when I am done, you will agree and bring her on-board to the Re-Entry Council. I only hope I can do her justice with this letter.

I came to know Dominique through our work on the San Francisco Hepatitis C Task Force. Dominique served as a co-chair of the Task Force. She ran great meetings: Kept the agenda moving while allowing ample time for discussion and debate. She was respectful of differing opinions and open to discussion on items that others might have shut down in frustration. She was professional.

But, I'm not all that impressed with "professional" if it is nothing more than a front, a display to further one's career. I have seen that a lot in my years in HIV, HCV, public health and harm reduction. Dominique was a strong and consistent voice for the underserved and criminalized populations most heavily impacted by HCV: people who use drugs, Transgender persons, HIV-infected persons, people of color and sex workers. And, of course, for people in jail and prison. She was a strong voice in our meetings. She was a strong advocate with representatives from the mayor's office, as well as other city officials. But most importantly, she was a strong advocate with the people she fought for. She was health educator and advocate with the community itself. It's a unique trait that I don't see often: She is as genuine and effective with the homeless person who injects drugs as she it with the Director of Public Health. Most importantly, she brings the voice and the needs of that homeless man into her meetings with policy makers.

There are other, more mundane skills that she has that also make her highly qualified for the Re-Entry Council. As stated previously, she is excellent in meetings. She's active. She participates. She contributes. As a member of the SF HCV Task Force, she knows how to work long-term and plan for the writing of reports and other materials. That's valuable experience that not many people will have. She knows San Francisco resources inside and out, and this was before her current job as housing resource specialist. In this position, she works with people in the SF jail system, links them with housing and helps keep them housed. She is keenly aware of the medical, social and psychological needs of men, women and Transgender persons leaving jails and returning to the community. She is brilliant on the medical and social needs of Transgender persons, and will bring a strong voice to the Council as an advocate for their needs both inside and outside of the custodial setting.

Ultimately, I ask myself: If I were on the Re-Entry Council (or re-starting the SF HCV Task Force which is more in my wheel-house), would I want her on it? The answer is unquestionably "yes"! It is for all of the reasons listed above, but its also for the intangibles: She is nice. She is funny. She is a supportive

colleague. You get somebody with her personality, with all of the skills listed above and her passion for social justice for the underserved populations of San Francisco, and you have to snap her up. Dominique will be an excellent member of the Re-Entry Council, and will serve you and the community you serve very well.

Dear Members of the Board of Supervisors,

I am writing to recommend Dominique Leslie for a position on the Reentry Council. I have known Ms. Leslie for nearly five years, having first met her when I worked at the San Francisco Department of Public Health when we were both appointed to the San Francisco Hepatitis C Task Force, a group created by then Mayor Gavin Newsom to make recommendations about how to strategically address the hepatitis C epidemic in San Francisco. Ms. Leslie and I both served on the Task Force as co-chairs.

Working with Ms. Leslie on the Task Force, I was impressed with her commitment to improving the lives of everyone at risk for and living with the hepatitis C virus (HCV), and particularly with her commitment to addressing HCV in the lives of transgender individuals. Ms. Leslie brought her lived experience as a formerly incarcerated transgender woman living with HCV to the Task Force in ways that helped the group ensure that the recommendations were inclusive and relevant to all people at risk for and living with HCV in San Francisco.

As co-chair of the Task Force, Ms. Leslie demonstrated strong leadership skills, supporting the groups' efforts by developing meeting agendas, facilitating meetings, and working with me and the third co-chair to ensure the group stayed on track and met deadlines.

But we don't often see ourselves for what we really are. And in order to do this, we need help. This includes the walls we put up around ourselves. They must come down in order to get help.

Our biggest obstacle is housing and access to treatment beds. Board Qualifications:

The Reentry Council was created to coordinate local efforts to support adults exiting San Francisco county jail, San Francisco juvenile justice system out-of-home placements, the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facilities, and the United States Federal Bureau of Prison facilities.

The Council shall provide the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, the public, and any other appropriate agency with accurate and comprehensive information about programs that serve this population, barriers faced by this population, best practices to meet the needs of this population, and funding sources for programs and practices that address the needs of this population. The Council shall coordinate information sharing, planning, and engagement among all interested private and public stakeholders to the extent permissible under federal and state law.

The Council shall consist of 23 members, seven (7) of whom shall be former inmates in the San Francisco County Jail, a California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation facility, and/or a United States Bureau of Prison facility.

The Mayor, or his designee, shall serve as one (1) member, and shall also appoint three (3) of the members. One (1) of the three (3) members shall be between the ages of 18 and 24 at the time of appointment, and one (1) shall have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The Board of Supervisors shall designate one (1) of its members to serve as a member of the Council, and shall appoint four (4) of the seven (7) members who are former inmates (added and revised by Ordinance No. 44-11). Of these four (4) members:

- > One (1) shall have expertise in providing services to individuals exiting the criminal justice system;
- > One (1) must have been released from custody within two years of his/her appointment;
- > One (1) must have served multiple terms of incarceration; and
- > One (1) must self-identify as a survivor of violence or crime.

All members of the Council shall be exempt from the Charter requirement that they be electors of the City and County of San Francisco (added by Ordinance No. 26-09).

The following City departments or agencies shall appoint one (1) member each to the Council: Public Defender's Office; District Attorney's Office; Sheriff's Department; Police Department; Adult Probation Department; Juvenile Probation Department; Department of Economic and Workforce Development; Human Services Agency; Department of Children, Youth and Families; and Department of Public Health (10 total).

In addition, co-chairs shall invite the San Francisco Superior Court, Department of Child Support Services, California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation Division of Adult Parole Operations, and United States Probation and Pretrial Services System to appoint one (1) member each to the Council. If any of these agencies do not appoint a representative, the co-chairs shall appoint an additional member (4 total).

Members shall serve two-year terms and shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Members may serve multiple terms. If any member misses two regularly scheduled meetings in a twelve-month period without prior notice, the Council shall certify that fact in writing to appointing authority and the member shall be deemed to have resigned.

Twelve members of the Council shall constitute a quorum and the Council shall have the authority to act on the vote of the majority of the quorum.

The four members appointed by the Adult Probation Department, District Attorney's Office, Public Defender's Office and Sheriff's Department, respectively, as well as the Mayor or the Mayor's representative, shall co-chair the Council. The Council may establish subcommittees. The Council shall meet in full at least three times per year.

Reports: At least once a year, the Council shall prepare and submit a report that shall include but not be limited to information identifying funding streams; programs serving individuals

The Council shall be staffed, subject to fiscal and budgetary provisions of the Charter, by the Public Defender's Office, District Attorney's Office, Adult Probation Department, and Mayor's Office who shall designate one staff member each.

Sunset: June 1, 2019, unless the Board of Supervisors adopts an ordinance continuing its existence.
