13	Section 1	The Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Sections 2A.233
14	and 2A.234, to re	ead as follows:
15	<u>SEC. 2A.233. CH</u>	ILDREN, YOUTH AND THEIR FAMILIES OVERSIGHT AND ADVISORY
16	<u>COMMITTEE.</u>	
17	(a) Purpos	se. As provided in Charter Section 16.108-1, there shall be a Children, Youth and
18	<u>Their Families Ov</u>	ersight and Advisory Committee ("Oversight and Advisory Committee" or
19	"Committee") to r	eview the governance and policies of the Department of Children, Youth and Their
20	<u>Families ("DCYF</u>	"), and to take steps to ensure that the Children and Youth Fund ("Fund") is
21	administered in a	manner accountable to the community.
22	<u>The Oversi</u>	ght and Advisory Committee replaces the Children's Fund citizens advisory
23	<u>committee formerl</u>	y established by Charter Section 16.108(n) as adopted by the voters in
24	November 2000. Subsection (n) was repealed and the advisory committee terminated by operation of	
25	<u>law upon the a</u> dop	tion of Proposition C by the voters in November 2014.

1	(b) Duties and Functions. The Oversight and Advisory Committee shall carry out the following
2	duties and functions, some of which are specified in Charter Section 16.108-1, and some of which are
3	not specified by Charter but adopted by ordinance under the authority provided in Section 16.801-1:
4	(1) The Oversight and Advisory Committee shall develop recommendations for DCYF
5	regarding outcomes for children and youth services, the evaluation of services, common data systems,
6	processes for making funding decisions, program improvement and capacity-building of service
7	providers, community engagement in planning and evaluating services, leveraging dollars of the Fund
8	and the use of the Fund as a catalyst for innovation.
9	(2) The Oversight and Advisory Committee shall promote transparency for the Fund
10	and its processes.
11	(3) Pursuant to Charter Section 16.108, the Oversight and Advisory Committee shall
12	review and approve the planning process for the Children and Youth Fund Community Needs
13	Assessment ("CNA") and final CNA, the Services and Allocation Plan (SAP), and the annual Data and
14	Evaluation Report.
15	(4) The Oversight and Advisory Committee shall review and approve DCYF's overall
16	annual budget expenditures (including the approval of grants as a package, work orders, supplemental
17	funds, and add-back funds), and shall conduct a mid-year budget review each year to prepare for the
18	following year's budget process. The Committee shall review best practices developed or identified by
19	DCYF and its Director for the grant-making process, including add-back and supplemental funding,
20	and for interdepartmental work orders. These practices shall be designed to promote, among other
21	things, transparency and accountability in the grant-making process and coordination with the
22	Children and Youth Fund SAP and CNA.
23	(5) The Oversight and Advisory Committee shall participate in the evaluation of the
24	Director of DCYF and assist in recruitment for the Director when the position is vacant, and may
25	recommend candidates to the Mayor for appointment.

1	(6) The Oversight and Advisory Committee shall establish and maintain a Service	
2	Provider Working Group as provided in Charter Section 16.108-1 and Administrative Code	
3	<u>Section 2A.234.</u>	
4	(7) The Oversight and Advisory Committee shall confer with the Director of DCYF at	
5	least once a year on DCYF's effectiveness and impact.	
6	(c) Meetings. The Oversight and Advisory Committee shall meet at least six times each	
7	calendar year. Any member who fails to attend at least half of the meetings in a calendar year shall be	
8	deemed to have resigned from the Committee.	
9	(d) Composition. As provided in Charter Section 16.108-1, the Mayor shall appoint members	
10	for Seats 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6 on the Oversight and Advisory Committee; the Board of Supervisors shall	
11	appoint members for Seats 7, 8, 9, 10, and 11 on the Committee. The Mayor's appointments shall take	
12	effect 30 days after transmittal of the Mayor's notice of appointment to the Board of Supervisors. The	
13	Board of Supervisors shall hold a public hearing on each of the Mayor's appointees to the Committee.	
14	If a vacancy occurs in any seat on the Committee, the appointing authority for the vacated seat	
15	shall appoint a successor.	
16	(e) Qualifications of Members. Members of the Oversight and Advisory Committee shall	
17	possess the following qualifications:	
18	Seat 1: A youth 19 years old or younger at the time of appointment for the term,	
19	recommended to the Mayor by the Youth Commission. Because this Committee member may be	
20	younger than 18 years at the time of appointment, this member is not subject to the requirement of	
21	Charter Section 4.101(a)(2) that members be electors of the City and County unless and until the	
22	member reaches the age of 18 years.	
23	Seat 2: The same qualifications as for Seat 1.	
24	Seat 3: A parent of a youth, which youth, at the time of the member's appointment for	
25	the term, is under the age of 18 years and enrolled in the San Francisco Unified School District. This	

1	Committee member shall have demonstrated commitment to improving access to and quality of services
2	for children, youth, and families.
3	Seat 4: A person with expertise or substantial experience working in services and
4	programs for children ages 5 and younger.
5	Seat 5: A person with expertise or substantial experience working in the field of
6	children and youth services in communities that are low-income or underserved.
7	Seat 6: A person who has demonstrated commitment to improving access and quality of
8	services for children, youth, and families in communities that are low-income or underserved.
9	Seat 7: A person who is a Disconnected Transitional-Aged Youth, as that term is used in
10	Charter Section 16.108, 18 through 24 years of age at the time of appointment, and who is familiar
11	with the issues and challenges faced by Disconnected Transitional-Aged Youth and with services,
12	programs, and systems for them.
13	Seat 8: A parent of a child, which child is enrolled in kindergarten through 8 <sup>th</sup> grade at
14	the time of the member's appointment for the term. This Committee member shall be from a low-
15	income community or have expertise or substantial experience working to promote the interests of
16	communities of color and shall have demonstrated a commitment to improving access and quality of
17	services for children, youth, and families.
18	Seat 9: A parent of a child, which child, at the time of the member's appointment for the
19	term, is under the age of 5 years and enrolled in a publicly-subsidized or City-funded program. This
20	Committee member shall have demonstrated a commitment to improving access and quality of services
21	for children, youth, and families.
22	Seat 10: A person with expertise or substantial experience working in the field of
23	children and youth services in communities that are low-income or underserved.
24	Seat 11: A person who has demonstrated commitment to improving access to and
25	quality of services for children, youth, and families.

1	In addition to the stated qualifications for each seat on the Committee, current City employees
2	or current employees or members of the boards of directors of DCYF-funded organizations may not
3	serve as members of the Oversight and Advisory Committee. For purposes of this subsection (e), a
4	part-time intern with a DCYF-funded organization who is 24 years old or younger shall not be
5	considered an employee of that organization.
6	(f) Timing of Appointments; Measuring Terms; First Meeting. The Mayor and the Board of
7	Supervisors shall appoint the initial members of the Committee by July 1, 2015. The appointing
8	authorities are encouraged to make their respective application processes as open and transparent as
9	possible.
10	The terms of the initial appointees shall commence on the date of the first meeting of the
11	Committee, which may occur when at least eight members have been appointed, and no later than
12	July 1, 2015. Terms of Committee members shall be measured from the date of the first Committee
13	meeting.
14	(g) Term Limits. Members may not serve more than two consecutive two-year terms, except
15	that the members initially appointed to Seats 1, 3, 5, 7, 9, and 11, while remaining eligible to serve a
16	consecutive second-two year term, shall serve for a first term of three years. For the purpose of these
17	term limits, serving more than half of a term shall count as serving a full term on the Committee.
18	(h) Committee Operations. At its first meeting, which, as subsection (f) states, shall be no later
19	than July 1, 2015, the Oversight and Advisory Committee shall select a Chair and Vice-Chair.
20	Thereafter, the Oversight and Advisory Committee shall adopt bylaws governing its meetings and
21	operations.
22	(i) Staffing. DCYF shall provide sufficient staffing for the Oversight and Advisory Committee
23	and the Service Provider Working Group referenced in Section 2A.234. The Youth Commission shall
24	provide support to the Committee members in Seats 1, 2, and 7 in areas such as training in city
25	government operations, policy analysis and development, and public outreach.

## 1 <u>SEC. 2A.234. SERVICE PROVIDER WORKING GROUP.</u>

2	(a) Purpose. Pursuant to Charter Section 16.108-1, the Children, Youth and Their Families
3	Oversight and Advisory Committee ("Oversight and Advisory Committee" or "Committee") shall
4	create a Service Provider Working Group ("SP Working Group" or "Working Group"). The purpose
5	of the SP Working Group shall be to advise the Committee on funding priorities, policy development,
6	the planning cycle, evaluation design and plans, and any other issues of concern to the SP Working
7	Group related to the Children and Youth Fund ("Fund") established in Charter Section 16.108, or the
8	responsibilities of the Department of Children Youth and Their Families ("DCYF") or other
9	departments receiving monies from the Fund.
10	(b) Membership and Meetings. The SP Working Group shall have at least 10 members. The
11	Working Group shall engage a broad cross-section of service providers in providing information.
12	education, and consultation to the Committee. All members of the Working Group shall be persons
13	actively providing services to children, youth, and their families during the members' service on the
14	SP Working Group. The Working Group shall meet at least four times each year.
15	The SP Working Group shall include members who are service providers who currently receive
16	funding from DCYF, service providers who have never received funding from DCYF but currently
17	provide services for children and youth, and service providers who have received funding from DCYF
18	in the past and who currently provide services for children and youth. In addition, the Working Group
19	shall include members with expertise or experience in the various funding areas identified in DCYF's
20	most recent Services and Allocation Plan as provided in Charter Section 16.108(i)(2).
21	(c) Governance. Subject to the requirements of the Charter and this Section 2A.234, the
22	Oversight and Advisory Committee shall adopt bylaws to provide for the governance and processes of
23	the SP Working Group.
24	By September 1, 2015, the Oversight and Advisory Committee shall appoint an initial chair and
25	vice-chair for the SP Working Group who shall be responsible for developing its structure and

1	facilitating its meetings. The chair and the vice-chair appointed by the Oversight and Advisory
2	Committee shall serve two-year terms in those positions. Thereafter, upon the expiration of each of
3	these terms as chair and vice-chair, the Working Group shall elect succeeding chairs and vice-chairs.
4	The SP Working Group shall have its first meeting by December 1, 2015. Thereafter, the
5	Working Group shall adopt bylaws governing its meetings and operations. Meetings of the SP Working
6	Group shall be open to the public and conducted in a manner to encourage widespread participation.
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8	Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
9	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
10	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
11	of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
