1	[Urging the Department of Justice to Expedite its Investigations Related to the Events in Ferguson, Missouri]
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3	Resolution urging the Department of Justice to expedite its investigation of the fatal
4	shooting of Michael Brown, to initiate reforms of the Ferguson Police Department and
5	St. Louis County Police Department, and to investigate the St. Louis County Grand Jury
6	process.
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8	WHEREAS, The population of Ferguson is 63% black, while only three out of fifty-three
9	officers on the Ferguson Police Department are black; and
10	WHEREAS, On August 9, 2014, Michael Brown, an unarmed black teenager, was shot
11	and killed by Darren Wilson, a white police officer, in Ferguson, Missouri; and
12	WHEREAS, Mr. Brown's body was left lying in the street for four and a half hours after
13	he was killed, which caused additional grief for his family and heightened anger among
14	community members in Ferguson; and
15	WHEREAS, Multiple eye witnesses testified that Mr. Brown had his hands up when he
16	was shot, which contributed to community anger and unrest, and led to the phrase, "hands up
17	don't shoot," becoming a rallying cry for protesters; and
18	WHEREAS, The killing of Michael Brown led to passionate protests from many people
19	in Ferguson who demanded an investigation and airing of grievances of racial profiling and
20	police brutality from the Ferguson Police Department and St. Louis County Police
21	Department; and
22	WHEREAS, Local and state law enforcement responded to the protests with an
23	overwhelming show of force, including military-grade weapons and equipment; and
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1	WHEREAS, The protracted, violent conflicts between protesters and law enforcement
2	have galvanized concerns nationwide about police brutality, police militarization, and racial
3	inequality in the United States; and
4	WHEREAS, A number of protesters in Ferguson filed lawsuits alleging law enforcement
5	officers violated civil rights and used excessive force; and
6	WHEREAS, Several members of the media were arrested during the protests, and the
7	Associated Press reported that the St. Louis County Police Department obtained a Temporary
8	Flight Restriction over Ferguson for twelve days for the express purpose of restricting
9	coverage from media helicopters; and
10	WHEREAS, Instead of deciding on whether to press charges against Darren Wilson,
11	St. Louis County Prosecutor Robert McCullough referred the decision to the St. Louis County
12	Grand Jury; and
13	WHEREAS, On November 24, 2014, Mr. McCullough announced that the Grand Jury
14	had decided to not file criminal charges against Mr. Wilson; and
15	WHEREAS, The sweeping scope of the Grand Jury's review of the case, including
16	seventy hours of testimony from approximately sixty witness and thousands of pages of
17	documents, has been called highly unusual; and
18	WHEREAS, Questions have been raised about a number of inconsistencies in
19	witnesses' accounts, and about apparently lax or unorthodox forensic practices in the
20	investigation of the incident; and
21	WHEREAS, The Grand Jury transcripts show that multiple eye witnesses disagreed
22	with each other, and with the testimony of Mr. Wilson, about important details of the
23	confrontation between Mr. Brown and Mr. Wilson; and
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1	WHEREAS, A medical examiner testified that he did not take any photographs
2	because the battery in his camera died, and that he did not take any measurements of the
3	crime scene because he stated, "it was self-explanatory what happened," and
4	WHEREAS, After the shooting, Mr. Wilson was allowed to transport himself to the
5	police station where he washed blood off his hands without them being photographed, and he
6	was allowed to package his own service revolver as evidence; and
7	WHEREAS, Officers who interviewed Mr. Wilson after the shooting failed to tape record
8	the interviews; and
9	WHEREAS, These questions about the Grand Jury process have led to many
10	objections to the decision to not press charges against Mr. Wilson and triggered a new wave
11	of protests in Ferguson and in cities across the country; now, therefore, be it
12	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors extends its deepest condolences to the
13	family of Michael Brown; and, be it
14	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of
15	Justice to expedite its criminal civil rights investigation into the circumstances of the fatal
16	shooting of Michael Brown; and, be it
17	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of
18	Justice to expedite its civil pattern or practice investigation of the Ferguson Police Department
19	and its Collaborative Reform Technical Assistance process with the St. Louis County Police
20	Department; and, be it
21	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of
22	Justice to ensure that these actions lead to the Ferguson Police Department and St. Louis
23	County Police Department revising their use-of-force polices, adopting a process for citizen
24	oversight of officer-involved shootings and allegations of misconduct, and ceasing their use of
25	military-style equipment; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Department of Justice to conduct an investigation into the St. Louis County Grand Jury process.
