11	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

13	Section 1. The Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding Chapter 2A, Article	
14	XIII, consisting of Section 2A.310, to read as follows:	
15	SEC. 2A.310. OFFICE OF EARLY CARE AND EDUCATION.	
16	(a) Office of Early Care and Education; Director. The Mayor shall appoint a Director who	
17	shall serve as the Department head for the Office of Early Care and Education ("OECE") and	
18	appointing officer for the OECE. The Director shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor. The OECE	
19	shall include such officers and employees as are authorized pursuant to the budgetary and fiscal	
20	provisions of the	Charter.
21	(b) Dutie	es and Functions.
22	<u>(1</u>) The OECE shall be responsible for aligning and coordinating the City's efforts to
23	provide early edi	ucation for children ages zero to five in San Francisco, including programs and
24	funding streams from the Department of Children, Youth, and Their Families, the Children and	
25		

1	Families Commission (First Five Commission), and the Human Services Agency to serve young
2	children and their families.
3	(2) The OECE shall work to improve access for all of San Francisco's young children
4	to high-quality early care and education, strengthen the early care and education workforce, and build
5	early care and education system capacity.
6	(3) The OECE shall develop a strategic plan and proposal, to be submitted to
7	the Board of Supervisors no later than January 1, 2016, that addresses the expansion of
8	quality universal early education in San Francisco. The strategic plan and proposal shall:
9	(A) Include goals for early care and education programs that align with
10	emerging developments in state or federal early care and education policy, and address
11	professional development needs of center-based, family child care providers and to the extent
12	resources allow, license-exempt care providers;
13	(B) Address neighborhood-specific needs, including school readiness,
14	subsidy availability, children's dual language development, facility development, parent
15	engagement and education, inclusion of children with special needs, and provider support for
16	both family child care homes and early care and education centers; and
17	(C) Include a set of equity metrics to be used to compare existing early
18	care and education services and resources in low-income and disadvantaged communities
19	with early care and education services and resources available in the City as a whole.
20	(<u>34</u>) The OECE's Director or designee shall attend meetings of Office of Early Care
21	and Education Citizens' Advisory Committee ("OECE CAC"), established by Chapter 5, Article X of
22	the Administrative Code, and the OECE shall provide staffing to OECE CAC, including providing the
23	OECE CAC with the information it requests.
24	(4 <u>5) The Human Services Agency shall provide administrative support for the OECE.</u>

17	The Board of Supervisors hereby es	tablishes an Office of Early Care and Education Citizens'	
18	Advisory Committee ("OECE CAC").

20	<u>SEC. 5.121. PURPOSE.</u>		
21	The OECE CAC shall make recomm	endations to the Office of Early Care and Education	
22	("OECE"), established by Chapter 2A, Art	icle XIII of the Administrative Code, regarding the OECE's	
23	mission of providing early education for ch	ildren ages zero to five in San Francisco and other City	
24	departments involved in early education ini	tiatives. The OECE CAC shall also work with advise the	
25	OECE on developing a strategic plan and a	proposal for expanding high-quality early education in San

4	SEC. 5.122. MEMBERSHIP.
5	(a) The OECE CAC shall consist of nine members. No later than FebruaryApril 1, 2015, the
6	Mayor shall nominate five members to hold Seats 1 through 5, and the Board of Supervisors shall
7	nominate appoint four members to hold Seats 6 through 9. Each nomination of the Mayor shall be
8	subject to confirmation by the Board of Supervisors Rules Committee. Each nomination of the
9	Mayor shall be subject to a public hearing and vote within 60 days. If the Board of
10	Supervisors Rules Committee fails to act on a mayoral nomination within 60 days of the date
11	the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be
12	deemed approved. Each nomination by the Mayor shall be effective immediately, unless
13	rejected by a two-thirds vote of the Board of Supervisors within 30 days following transmittal
14	of the Mayor's Notice of Appointment to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors.
15	(b) Members of the OECE CAC shall have the following qualifications:
16	(1) Seat 1: must be a parent or guardian of a child who is enrolled in a facility that
17	provides early care and education services, which includes child care, early care, preschool, infant and
18	toddlers care;
19	(2) Seat 2: must be a representative of the San Francisco Unified School District's
20	Early Education Division, or any successor to that division, recommended by the Superintendent of
21	Schools. If the Superintendent of Schools fails to make a recommendation by FebruaryApril 1, 2015,
22	the Mayor may nominate a person to hold this seat;
23	(3) Seat 3: must be a early care and education provider that serves infants and toddlers
24	ages zero to three;

13	mental health community specializing in early care, a member of a philanthropic organization, or a	
14	member of the business community with an interest in early care and education issues; and	
15	(9) Seat 9: must be a representative of the Childcare Planning and Advisory Council	
16	recommended to the Board of Supervisors by the Childcare Planning and Advisory Council.	
17	(c) Each nominating authority may remove any of its nominees at any time with or without	
18	<u>cause.</u>	
19	(d) If a vacancy occurs in any seat on the committee, the nominating authority for the vacated	
20	seat shall nominate a successor. For Seat 2, the OECE CAC shall notify the San Francisco Unified	
21	School District of any such vacancies and, if the San Francisco Unified School District has not made a	
22	recommendation within 90 days of the notice, the Mayor shall nominate a successor.	
23	(e) To the extent required by law, members of the OECE CAC shall be subject to state and	
24	local conflict of interest laws, including the California Political Reform Act (Cal. Gov. Code §§ 87100	
25	et seq.) and California Government Code section 1090.	

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2	SEC. 5.123. TERMS OF OFFICE AND MEETINGS.
3	(a) Terms of Office. Members of the OECE CAC shall serve for two years, except that the
4	members initially appointed to Seats 1, 3, 5, 7, and 9 shall serve for three years; thereafter, the
5	members holding these seats shall serve for two years. The terms of the initial appointees shall
6	<u>commence on MarchMay 1, 2015.</u>
7	(b) Term Limits. No member may serve more than two consecutive terms on the OECE CAC.
8	For the purpose of these term limits, serving more than half of a term shall count as serving a full term
9	on the committee.
10	(c) Meetings.
11	(1) The OECE CAC shall meet at least four times each calendar year. The OECE CAC
12	shall convene its first meeting by MarchMay 1, 2015. Any member of the OECE CAC who fails to
13	attend at least half of the meetings held in a calendar year shall be deemed to have resigned from the
14	<u>committee.</u>
15	(2) At its first meeting, the OECE CAC shall select a Chair and Vice-Chair. The OECE
16	CAC shall also adopt bylaws governing its meetings. Five members of the OECE CAC shall
17	constitute a quorum of the committee, and the affirmative votes of at least five members of the
18	OECE CAC are necessary to constitute approval by the committee. The OECE CAC's bylaws
19	shall provide that when fewer than nine members of the committee are present, the affirmative
20	votes of four of the committee's members are sufficient to constitute approval by the
21	committee.

23	SEC. 5.124. DUTIES OF THE COMMITTEE.
24	(a) The OECE CAC shall work with Office of Early Care and Education to develop a strategic
25	plan and proposal, as described in Administrative Code section 2A.310. to the Board of

Supervisors for expanding quality universal early education for San Francisco. The strategic
plan and proposal shall:

Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after 22 23 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the

ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board

of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.
