Resolution establishing the calendar date of December 10 to be forever known as Human Rights Day in the City and County of San Francisco to celebrate the important passage of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights.

WHEREAS, On December 10, 1948, the General Assembly of the United Nations unanimously approved the Universal Declaration of Human Rights; and

WHEREAS, The United Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), spearheaded by Eleanor Roosevelt through her work as the first U.S. delegate on the UN Commission on Human Rights, was the first international proclamation of the inherent dignity and equal rights of all people; and

WHEREAS, The fundamental assertion of the UDHR is that an individual's mind and conscience are sacred and uninfringeable possessions, that pressure from any state, church, or other group aimed at coercing consent is unacceptable, and that the individual's freedom of conscience reigns supreme; and

WHEREAS, The UDHR recognizes the inherent dignity and inalienable rights of all members of the human family as the foundation of freedom, justice, and peace in the world; and,

WHEREAS, On the occasion of the United Nations' meeting in host-city San Francisco, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors in April 1998 proclaimed San Francisco a Human Rights City and adopted the UDHR and the International Covenant on Economic, Cultural and Social Rights; and
