On November 19, 2014 the San Francisco Historic Preservation Commission (hereinafter "HPC") conducted a regularly scheduled public hearing at which time they unanimously passed Resolution No. 741 to initiate Article 10 Landmark Designation of 182-198 Gough Street, known historically as the R. L. Goldberg Building.

At a subsequent duly noticed public hearing on December 17, 2014, the HPC unanimously passed Resolution No. 742 recommending the Board of Supervisors approve the designation of 182-198 Gough Street as an Article 10 Landmark pursuant to Section 1004 of the Planning Code. The proposed amendments have been determined to be categorically exempt from environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act Section 15060(c)(2).
