
ALU Recommendation: Approval with the following conditions

Conditions for Type 64 (Special On-Sale General Theatre)

- 1. Sales, service and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be made only from stationary bars or portable bars and waiter/waitress service; and shall not be sold; served, or delivered to customers by individual ambulatory vendors,
- 2. The sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption off the premises is strictly prohibited.
- 3. Alcoholic beverages shall be served in containers clearly distinguishable from non-alcoholic beverage containers
- 4. The sale of alcoholic beverages shall be limited to no more than 2 beverages per person per sale.
- 5. An employee or security guard shall be assigned the responsibility of ensuring all alcoholic beverages remain inside the permitted area whenever the privileges of the ABC license are being exercised.


