3	Ordinance retroactively authorizing the Department of Technology and the Department		
4	of Contract Administration to enter into the Second Amendment of an Agreement		
5	between the City and AT&T for the City's telecommunications services by extending		
6	the term of the agreement through <u>December 31, 2015</u> March 1,2016, and increasing the		
7	total not-to-exceed amount of the agreement to -\$97,953,700\$101,433,700.

13	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
14	Section 1. Background. The Department of Technology (the "Department") procures		
15	local and long distance telephone and data services for the City under an agreement with		
16	AT&T (the "Agreement") that incorporates the State of California's CALNET2 agreement. The		
17	CALNET 2 Agreement offers California public entities a purchasing vehicle for		
18	telecommunications services at lower prices than the entities might be able to secure for		
19	themselves individually.		
20	By Ordinance 98-10, the City approved the Agreement for a term of four and one-half		
21	years, beginning on March 1, 2010 and a maximum amount of \$75,000,000. Ordinance 98-10		
22	is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No.100251 and is also available on		
23	the Board's website.		
24	The Agreement allows the City to purchase telecommunications services under the		
25	best pricing available to public entities. The Agreement also allows non-profit agencies in San		

1	Francisco to purchase telecommunication services directly from AT&T at the preferred pricing			
2	available to the City. Under the Agreement, there are two additional one-year extensions			
3	available upon request by the State of California. The State has requested an extension of			
4	CalNet 2 in order to complete the rollout and ordering process for a successor agreement.			
5	Section 2. The Second Amendment. The Second Amendment to the Agreement is			
6	on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 141208. The Second			
7	Amendment would extend the term of the Agreement through <u>December 31, 2015</u> March 1,			
8	2016, consistent with the extension of CalNet 2. The Department has evaluated the needs of			
9	City Departments through 2016 and has determined the two year extension will increase the			
10	not to exceed amount of the Agreement by an additional \$26,433,700.			
11	Section 3. Authorizations: Section 9.118 of the San Francisco Charter			
12	requires approval by the Board of Supervisors for leases with a term of ten years or more, and			
13	for contracts in excess of ten years or requiring expenditures above ten million dollars.			
14	(a) The Board of Supervisors authorizes the Department and the Office of			
15	Contract Administration execute the Second Amendment in substantially the form on file with			
16	the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, in File No. 141208, extending the term of the			
17	agreement to December 31, 2015 March 1, 2015 and and increasing the total not-to-exceed			
18	amount of the agreement to \$97,953,700\$101,433,700.			
19	Section 4. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after			
20	enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the			
21	ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
