3 **Resolution recognizing the inauguration of the San Francisco Children’s Outdoor Bill**
4 **of Rights, as detailed in this Resolution, on October 18, 2014.**

6 WHEREAS, San Francisco is home to more than 100,000 children growing up in one of
7 the most densely urbanized cities in the nation; and

8 WHEREAS, Direct exposure to nature is a necessary component of a child’s
9 physical and emotional well-being, and cognitive development; and

10 WHEREAS, In 2007 the State of California adopted the nation’s first statewide
11 children’s outdoor bill of rights in recognition of nature’s importance to a child’s physical
12 and emotional well-being; and

13 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Children’s Outdoor Bill of Rights is a set of
14 outdoor experiences that city agencies, youth serving organizations, schools,
15 community groups, and families representing all corners of the city agree every child
16 should be able to enjoy; and

17 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Children’s Outdoor Bill of Rights is a set of
18 outdoor experiences that ensures every child in San Francisco has the opportunity
19 to connect with nature and develop to their fullest potential; and

20 WHEREAS, San Francisco is a highly visible national and international model of
21 progressive human endeavors in an increasingly urban world; now, therefore, be it

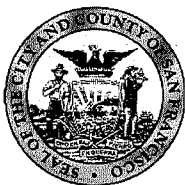
