[Supporting Senate Bill 716 (Lara) - Prohibiting Abusive Behavior Towards the Elephant]

methods, including the use of a bullhook, ankus, guide, or pitchfork in California.

WHEREAS, The "bullhook", or "ankus", is a 2-3 foot long bludgeoning device with an attached hook that is used to beat, hit, and poke animals, including elephants, in order to train them; and

WHEREAS, Elephants are known to have sensitive skin on their bodies, especially in places where they are most likely to be hit with a bullhook, including on their ears, trunks, and on their heads; and

WHEREAS, Other methods used in the training of elephants include abusive behavior such as the deprivation of food, use of electricity, physical punishment, insertion of instruments into bodily orifices, the use of physical restraints such as chains; and lifting and restraining elephants with block and tackle; and

WHEREAS, Elephants may nurse their young for up to five years in the wild, females stay with their mothers for life, and males stay with their mothers until adolescence; and

WHEREAS, These methods of training often require the removal of young, nursing elephants from their mothers before two years of age, which prevents elephants from engaging in normal, social, and healthy behaviors; and

WHEREAS, Restraints, such as martingales and block and tackle also limit their ability to move about freely or lie down comfortably; and

WHEREAS, Over time, these environments and training methods lead many elephants to become dysfunctional, unhealthy, depressed, and aggressive; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 716, authored by State Senator Ricardo Lara, would, beginning January 1, 2018, prohibit any owner or manager of an elephant to engage in abusive behavior toward the elephant including the discipline of the elephant with the use of food, water or sleep deprivation; use of electricity, physical punishment resulting in damage, scarring, or breakage of skin; the insertion of any instrument into any bodily orifice; the use of martingales; the use of block and tackle; and the use of a bullhook, ankus, guide, or pitchfork, including the use of those devices without making contact; and

WHEREAS, SB 716 will amend California Penal Code, Section 596.5, which already protects elephants from being deprived of food, water, or rest and from being physically punished, by adding an explicit prohibition on certain training devices that were previously not outlined in the code; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco strongly supports Senate Bill 716 prohibiting the use of training methods and devices designed to physically harm or instill fear in elephants; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco is unwavering in its support and protection for elephants and strongly condemns the use of inhumane training practices that result in the emotional and physical harm of these incredible species.

An act to amend Section 2840.4 of the Public Utilities Code, relating to energy. amend, repeal, and add Section 596.5 of the Penal Code, relating to animal cruelty.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 716, as amended, Lara. Waste Heat and Carbon Emissions Reduction Act. Animal cruelty: elephants.

Existing law makes it a misdemeanor for any owner or manager of an elephant to engage in abusive behavior toward the elephant, which includes disciplining an elephant by specified methods, including, but not limited to, use of electricity.

This bill would, beginning January 1, 2018, additionally provide that abusive behavior toward the elephant includes the discipline, management, or training of the elephant by specified methods, including the use of a bullhook, ankus, guide, or pitchfork. By expanding the scope of a crime, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that no reimbursement is required by this act for a specified reason.

The Waste Heat and Carbon Emissions Reduction Act finds and declares, among other things, that combined heat and power systems produce both electricity and thermal energy from a single fuel input,

thus achieving much greater efficiency than the usual separate systems for producing these forms of energy and reducing the consumption of fuel.

This bill would make technical, nonsubstantive changes to this provision.

- (b) Combined heat and power systems recover heat that would otherwise be wasted in separate energy applications and use this heat to avoid consumption of fuel that would otherwise be required to produce heat.
